

1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings Act, I
2 call the September 22nd, 2022 Regular Open Meeting to
3 order.

4 Commissioners Kimbrel and McCabe are
5 with me in the Chicago office, and Commissioner
6 Carrigan is joining us from Springfield. We have a
7 quorum. We have no requests to speak. There is no
8 Transportation Agenda, so we're going to go ahead and
9 move on to the Public Utility Agenda.

10 There are edits to the September 1st,
11 2022, Regular Open Meeting minutes.

12 Are there any objections to approving
13 the minutes as edited?

14 (No verbal response.)

15 Hearing none, the minutes are approved.

16 Under our electric items, Item E-1
17 concerns a motion to withdraw by Liberty Power
18 Holdings, LLC, seeking emergency relief to protect the
19 confidential version of its report of electric rates.

20 Are there any objections to granting
21 the motion to withdraw?

22 (No verbal response.)

1 Hearing none, the motion is granted.

2 Item E-2 concerns an application for a certification to
3 install, maintain, and repair electric vehicle charging
4 stations. The order grants the certificate finding
5 that the Applicant meets the requirements.

6 Are there any objections to approving
7 the order?

8 (No verbal response.)

9 Hearing none, the order is approved.

10 Item E-3 concerns a complaint against
11 Ameren Illinois as to billing and charges in Effingham,
12 Illinois. The parties have filed a stipulation and
13 joint motion to dismiss, noting that they have settled
14 the matter and asking the Commission to dismiss the
15 complaint with prejudice.

16 Are there objections to granting the
17 motion to dismiss?

18 (No verbal response.)

19 Hearing none, the motion is granted.

20 There are no gas items.

21 Under our telecommunications items,
22 Item T-1 concerns an application for authority to

1 provide resold cellular radio wireless telephone
2 service in Illinois. The order grants the certificate,
3 finding that the Applicant meets the certification
4 requirements.

5 Are there any objections to approving
6 the order?

7 (No verbal response.)

8 Hearing none, the order is approved.

9 Under our water and sewer items,
10 Item W-1 concerns Illinois American Water Company's
11 application for a certificate of public convenience and
12 necessity to provide water distribution and wastewater
13 collection service to Royal Oaks and for the approval
14 of the purchase of assets. The order grants the
15 certificate and approves the purchase of assets. The
16 order finds that the Company demonstrated a need for
17 the service to the proposed certificated areas. The
18 order also finds that the Company is capable of
19 efficiently managing and supervising this service.

20 Are there any objections to approving
21 the order?

22 (No verbal response.)

1 Hearing none, the order is approved.

2 Under our petitions for hearing,
3 Item PR-1 concerns Docket Number 21-0850 and ComEd's
4 verified petition for approval of revisions to Rider DG
5 rebate. The Illinois Competitive Energy Association or
6 ICEA, is seeking a rehearing on two issues.

7 First, as to whether Section 16-107.6(c)(2)
8 supersedes the prohibition against tying
9 Sections 452.120 and 452.270 of Commission rules, and
10 second, the Commission's decision that ComEd is
11 prohibited from a, quote, "program offered by the
12 applicable electric utility," end quote, that confirms
13 a customer's ARES supply rate is time variant.

14 The ALJ recommends that the Commission
15 deny the request for rehearing because ComEd's proposed
16 Rider DG rebate properly implements section 16-107.6 of
17 the act.

18 Before I call the vote, just a quick
19 call for comments.

20 (No verbal response.)

21 If not, I'm going to go ahead and call
22 a role for this item. So if you are in favor of

1 denying the rehearing, please say "aye" and oppose, say
2 "nay."

3 Commissioner Kimbrel?

4 COMMISSIONER KIMBREL: Aye.

5 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Commissioner Carrigan?

6 COMMISSIONER CARRIGAN: Aye.

7 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Commissioner McCabe?

8 COMMISSIONER MCCABE: Nay.

9 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: I vote aye. So the three ayes
10 have it, and the petition for rehearing is denied.

11 Under other business items, Item O-1
12 concerns approval of batches, contracts, and
13 confirmations under the Illinois Adjustable Block
14 Program.

15 Are there any objections to approving
16 the program administrator submissions?

17 (No verbal response.)

18 Hearing none, these submissions are
19 approved.

20 This concludes our agenda.

21 Judge Teague Kingsley, do we have other
22 matters to come before the Commission today?

1 JUDGE TEAGUE KINGSLEY: No, Madam Chairman.

2 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Do Commissioners have other
3 business to discuss?

4 (No verbal response.)

5 I just would like to introduce my two
6 new interns.

7 First, today we have in the room with
8 us, Taylor Desgrosseilliers, who is a 3L at
9 Northwestern Law School. She's interested in
10 environmental and energy law, and prior to law school,
11 she worked in D.C. for a few years.

12 And the second intern I'd like to
13 introduce is Carly Rogers, who is a 3L at Chicago-Kent
14 College of Law where she is working towards her
15 environmental and energy law certificate. She received
16 her bachelor's degree from Arizona State University,
17 and she is particularly interested in the transition to
18 clean energy and environmental justice.

19 We are excited to have them both with
20 my office. There is plenty of work to be done, so we
21 appreciate their help as well.

22 If there are no further comments and if

1 there's no objection, then the meeting is now
2 adjourned. Thank you.
