PROCEEDINGS

ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Starting with today's Transportation Agenda and with the Railroad portion, Items RR-1 through RR-4 (T10-0132, T10-0133, T10-0134, T10-0135) can be taken together. These are Stipulated Agreements for public safety improvements of the highway-rail grade crossings in a number of cities and towns across Illinois. In each case Staff recommends entering an Order approving the Stipulated Agreement.

I would like to make a motion to enter the Orders. Is there a second?

ACTING COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor say aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any opposed?

(No response.)

ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: The vote is 5-0; the Orders are entered and Stipulated Agreements are approved.

We will use this 5-0 vote for the

1 remainder of the Transportation unless otherwise
2 noted.

3 Item RR-5 is Docket Number 10-0061.
4 This concerns a petition filed by Kankakee County
5 seeking authority to construct a bridge over Union
6 Pacific tracks. Administrative Law Judge
7 Kirkland-Montaque recommends entry of an Order
8 granting the petition. Is there any discussion?

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any objections?

11 (No response.)

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
13 Orders are entered -- the Order is entered and the
14 petition is granted.

15 Items RR-6 and RR-7 (T09-0026,
16 T10-0083) can be taken together. These items concern
17 Stipulated Agreements for public safety improvements
18 to highway-rail grade crossings in Lawrence County
19 and Cook County. In each case Staff recommends
20 entering a Supplemental Order approving an extension
21 of time or additional funds to complete the project.
22 Is there any discussion?

5 Supplemental Orders are entered.

6 Item RR-8 is Docket Number 10-0118.
7 This concerns a petition filed by the Illinois
8 Department of Transportation seeking authority to
9 construct two grade separation structures near the
10 Mississippi River in St. Clair County. Administrative
11 Law Judge O'Brien recommends entry of an Order
12 granting the petition. Is there any discussion?

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any objections?

15 (No response.)

16 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
17 Orders are entered and the petition is granted.

18 Motor Carriers. Moving now to the
19 Motor Carriers' portion of today's agenda, Items MC-1
20 and MC-2 can be taken together. These items concern
21 Stipulated Settlement Agreements concerning alleged
22 violations of the Illinois Commercial Transportation

1 Law. In both instances Staff recommends entering an
2 Order accepting the Stipulated Settlement Agreement.
3 Is there any discussion?

5 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any objections?

6 (No response.)

7 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
8 Orders are entered and the Settlement Agreements are
9 approved.

10 Item MC-3 concerns AA Sapa Moving's
11 application for a Certificate of Public Convenience
12 and Necessity for new household goods property motor
13 carrier authority. Administrative Law Judge
14 Kirkland-Montague recommends entering an Order
15 granting the application. Is there any discussion?

17 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any objections?

19 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
20 Order is entered and the application is granted.

21 Item MC-4 concerns a transfer of a
22 Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and

1 Public Carrier Certificate from South Avenue Moving
2 Corporation to Motsch Movers. Before us today is an
3 Amended Order correcting a typo in Finding 4 of the
4 Initial Order, and Administrative Law Judge
5 Kirkland-Montaque recommends entry of the Order. Is
6 there any discussion?

8 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any objections?

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
11 Amended Order is entered.

12 Item MC-5 concerns Kramer's Auto
13 Repair and Towing Application for a Commercial
14 Relocation Towing License pursuant to Section 18a-401
15 of the Illinois Commercial Relocation of Trespassing
16 Vehicles Law. Administrative Law Judge
17 Kirkland-Montaque recommends entry of an Order
18 granting the Company's application. Is there any
19 discussion?

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Hearing none, the
2 Order is entered and the application is granted.

3 Administrative Matters. We have one
4 Administrative Matter to address in our
5 Transportation Agenda today. It concerns acceptance
6 of the Transportation Regulatory Fund 2010 Report.

7 Staff, could you please come brief us
8 on this matter?

9 MR. MATRISCH: Your Honor -- excuse me, Acting
10 Chairman, according to Illinois law the Commission
11 must prepare a report every year that details how
12 funds from the Transportation Regulatory Fund are
13 spent and in addition how much funds have been
14 collected over the year. This report addresses that
15 statutory provision and provides the necessary report
16 to the Governor and the Members of the General
17 Assembly.

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Very well. Are there
19 any questions from Commissioners? Very well. I
20 would like to make a motion then to accept the TRA
21 Annual Report. Is there a second?

22 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Second.

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: It's been moved and
2 seconded. All in favor say aye.

3 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

4 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: The vote is 4-0 and
5 the report is accepted.

6 I do want to say thank you for the
7 report. I read it. It is clear, and I believe that
8 obviously it meets the statutory requirements. And I
9 would just like to say thank you for your ongoing
10 work.

11 Mr. Matrisch, is there any further
12 business to come before the Commission today then?

13 MR. MATRISCH: Nothing further, Chairman.

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN FLORES: Very well. That
15 concludes today's Transportation Agenda. Keep up the
16 good work, gentlemen.
