1 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings 2 Act and in accordance with the Governor's Executive 3 Order, I call the January 13, 2021 Special Open 4 Meeting to order. 5 Before we proceed, and for clarity 6 of the record, I would ask everyone to state their 7 name before speaking and to speak slowly and 8 clearly so that the court reporter can capture 9 everything that is said. 10 I already checked that we have all 11 Commissioners with us and so with five on, we have 12 a quorum. We have no requests to speak, no 13 Transportation Agenda, just two items on our Public 14 Utilities Agenda. 15 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Item 1 concerns the 16 December 16, 2020 Regular Open Meeting minutes. 17 There are edits to the minutes. Are there any 18 objections to approving the minutes as edited? 19 (No verbal response.) 20 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 21 minutes are approved. 22 Item 2 concerns Docket 20-0308,

which is Ameren Illinois' proposed general increase in rates and revisions to other terms and conditions for gas services. The order approves the proposed increase subject to the adjustments specified in the order and its appendices.

There are substantive edits to the order proposed by Commissioner Kimbrel's office.

The edits amend sections of the order that address capital structure and rate of return. The edits adopt a capital structure with 52 percent common equity, 47.061 percent long-term debt, 0.110 percent short-term debt, and 0.833 percent preferred stock. The edits also adopt a cost of common equity of 9.67 percent to averaging party's suggested calculation. Is there a motion to adopt the proposed edits?

COMMISSIONER CARRIGAN: Commissioner Carrigan moves for adoption.

CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Okay. I'll take that as the motion for Commissioner Carrigan. Is there a second?

COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Second.

CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Okay. Commissioner

Bocanegra, I heard you first. Commissioner

Bocanegra seconds. Are there comments regarding the edits?

I have comments. I am going to vote nay on the order as edited. I disagree with the majority's method in calculating the return on equity, or ROE. Specifically, I believe that the majority's ROE number implicitly accepts adders and financial models that have been traditionally and repeatedly rejected by the Commission.

Ameren's proposed ROE, under the edits, is influenced and pushed higher by floatation costs and the ECAPM and expected earnings models. The record clearly shows objections by Staff and IIEC, CUB, and FEA to Ameren's use of the floatation cost adjustments in previously rejected models.

While averaging can help mitigate the impact of the models and adders, the Commission has repeatedly rejected. The majority indirectly accepts those models and adders by utilizing

1 Ameren's proposed initial ROE without considering 2 which model estimates are outliers. Therefore, I 3 believe the methodology is flawed. 4 I am worried this approach may 5 result in encouraging parties to inflate or deflate 6 their proposed ROEs in future rate cases to push 7 the simple average of ROEs in their desired 8 direction. 9 Okay. If there's no other 10 comments, I am going to call to vote on the 11 approval of the edits. If you are in favor of 12 approving the edits, please say, "aye," and if you 13 are opposed, please say, "nay."
