The interim order adopts Staff's exceptions and allows joint movants to resume in-store solicitations under the restrictions indicated in the order. The interim order requires, among other things, that first the joint movants shall comply with not only the requirements of the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Illinois Department of Commerce Economic

motion.

Opportunity, but also with the requirements of
their retail partners and their own safety
requirements as well as those of any municipality
or county in which they conduct in-person
solicitation. Joint movants will not be held
harmless for failure to comply with all such
requirements by the Commission's granting of the

Second, joint movants shall monitor the actions of their sales agents and third-party vendors to make sure that all requirements, including Commission's requirements in 83 Illinois Administrative Code 412, are being met.

Third, the relief granted by this order only applies to joint movants and not other ARES and is limited to allowing the joint movants to resume in-store marketing with their retail partners.

Fourth, the relief granted by this order only applies to those areas of the state that remain in Phase 4 status. And if the state as a whole or any area reverts to Phase 3 or lower or
