



1           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings Act, I  
2 call the October 13, 2022, Regular Open Meeting to  
3 order. Commissioners Kimbrel, Carrigan, and McCabe  
4 are with me in Chicago. We have a quorum. We have no  
5 requests to speak.

6                         We're moving on to our Public Utilities  
7 Agenda. There are no edits to the September 22nd,  
8 2022, minutes.

9                         Are there any objections to approving  
10 the minutes?

11                         (No verbal response.)

12           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the minutes are  
13 approved.

14                         Under our Electric Utilities items,  
15 Item E-1 concerns Docket ERM 22-146, which is ComEd's  
16 filing to update the credit requirements company's  
17 terms and conditions. The Commission Staff has  
18 reviewed the filing. You recommend not suspending it.

19                         Are there any objections to not  
20 suspending the filing?

21                         (No verbal response.)

22           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the filing is not

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1 suspended.

2 Item E-2 concerns an order initiating  
3 the next annual reconciliation of Ameren's hazardous  
4 materials adjustment clause rider, or Rider HMAc,  
5 covering the activity in calendar year of 2022. The  
6 order approves initiation of the reconciliation  
7 proceedings.

8 Are there any objections to approving  
9 the order?

10 (No verbal response.)

11 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
12 approved.

13 Item E-3 concerns Docket 21-0786, which  
14 is a citation against ResCom Energy for failure to  
15 comply with annual and quarterly filing requirements.  
16 The order approved citation and assesses financial  
17 penalties for the specified violations.

18 Are there any objections to approving  
19 the order?

20 (No verbal response.)

21 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
22 approved.

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1                   Item E-4 concerns Docket 22-0067,  
2 ComEd's petition for the establishment of performance  
3 metrics. ComEd seeks clarification of the Commission's  
4 September 27th, 2022, order regarding Commission  
5 approval of Metrics 2 and 7. ComEd is seeking  
6 expedited consideration so the Company can meet the  
7 orders requirement that it files certain compliance  
8 materials by October 31st of 2022 and November 22nd of  
9 2022. The amendatory order clarifies the Commission  
10 order with respect to targets in Metric 2 and penalties  
11 and reward structure in Metric 7.

12                   Are there any objections to granting  
13 the motion for clarification and approving the  
14 amendatory order?

15                   (No verbal response.)

16                   CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the motion is  
17 granted and the amendatory order is approved.

18                   Items E-5 through E-8, concern  
19 applications for authority to install a distributed  
20 generation facility in Illinois. The orders grant the  
21 certificates, finding that the applicants meet the  
22 requirements.

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1                   Are there any objections to considering  
2 these items together and approving the orders?

3                   (No verbal response.)

4           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are  
5 approved.

6                   Item E-9, concerns a petition to cancel  
7 a certificate to operate as an agent, broker, or  
8 consultant. The petitioner no longer conducts business  
9 in Illinois. The order grants the petition to cancel  
10 the certificate.

11                   Are there any objections to approving  
12 the order?

13                   (No verbal response.)

14           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
15 approved.

16                   Item E-10 and E-11 concern applications  
17 for a license to operate as retail electric agency  
18 brokers and consultants in Illinois. The orders grant  
19 the licenses, finding that applicants meet the  
20 specified requirements.

21                   Are there any objections to considering  
22 these items together and approving the orders?

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1 (No verbal response.)

2 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are  
3 approved.

4 Item E-12 concerns BioEnergy's petition  
5 requesting that the Commission return its original  
6 letter of credit, securing its repayment obligation to  
7 the State of Illinois for previous tax credits.

8 BioEnergy has made all of its reimbursement payments  
9 and has no outstanding balance. The order grants the  
10 petition.

11 Are there any objections to approving  
12 the order?

13 (No verbal response.)

14 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
15 approved.

16 Items E-13 and E-14 concern  
17 applications for certification to install energy  
18 efficiency measures in Illinois. The order's granted  
19 certificates, finding that the applicants did not meet  
20 the requirements by failing to file a proper  
21 certificate of insurance.

22 Are there any objections to considering

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1 these items together and approving the orders?

2 (No verbal response.)

3 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are  
4 approved.

5 Item E-15 concerns a petition to cancel  
6 a certificate of service authority to install energy  
7 efficiency measures. The order cancels the  
8 certificate.

9 Are there any objections to approving  
10 the order?

11 (No verbal response.)

12 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
13 approved.

14 Items E-16 through E-18, concern  
15 applications for certification to install energy  
16 efficiency measures in Illinois. The orders approve  
17 these certificates, finding that the applicants meet  
18 the requirements of the Public Utilities Act.

19 Are there any objections to considering  
20 these items together in approving the orders?

21 (No verbal response.)

22 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are

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1 approved.

2                   Moving on to our gas items. Item G-1  
3 concerns a complaint against Peoples Gas for unlawful  
4 disconnection of service. The order denies the  
5 complaint, finding that the Peoples Gas provided  
6 sufficient evidence that tampering occurred with the  
7 complainant's gas meter, that the complainant benefited  
8 from the tampering, and that People's Gas's method of  
9 calculating estimated gas usage was reasonable. The  
10 order further finds complainant's additional  
11 allegations, as they relate to the company's violation  
12 of the stipulated moratorium on disconnection of  
13 service during the COVID-19 pandemic, violation of  
14 procedures for disconnection of service, and failure to  
15 provide adequate notice are unfounded and not supported  
16 by the record.

17                   Are there any objections to approving  
18 the order?

19                   (No verbal response.)

20                   CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
21 approved.

22                   Item G-2 concerns a complaint against

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1 Peoples Gas alleging misrepresentation of work to be  
2 done on complainant's sewer resulting in basement  
3 flooding that requires emergency plumbing services.  
4 The parties filed a joint motion to dismiss, stating  
5 that all matters in this case have been resolved.

6 Are there any objections to granting  
7 the motion to dismiss?

8 (No verbal response.)

9 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the motion is  
10 granted.

11 Under telecommunications items, Item  
12 T-1 concerns of an application for a license to provide  
13 resold and facilities-based interexchange  
14 telecommunications services within the State of  
15 Illinois. The order grants the license, finding that  
16 the Applicant meets the requirements.

17 Are there any objections to approving  
18 the order?

19 (No verbal response.)

20 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
21 approved.

22 Item T-2 concerns a petition for

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1 partial waivers of some sections of Title 83 of the  
2 Administrative Code. The petitioners seek relief from  
3 the requirement that they provide and deliver printed  
4 paper directories to customers so that they could  
5 provide the information in an online version instead.  
6 The order grants the petition.

7 Are there any objections to approving  
8 the order?

9 (No verbal response.)

10 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
11 approved.

12 Under our water/sewer items, Item W-1  
13 concerns Illinois Americans request to initiate  
14 reconciliation of its invested capital tax riders or  
15 ICT riders for the calendar year of 2020 for its  
16 central division, Pekin and Lincoln water tariff  
17 districts, and Chicago metro wastewater tariff  
18 district. The order grants the reconciliation as  
19 indicated in the appendix to the order.

20 Are there any objections to approving  
21 the order?

22 (No verbal response.)

1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
2 approved.

3 Item W-2 concerns Aqua Illinois's  
4 reconciliation of volume balancing adjustment rider or  
5 VBA rider tariffs for calendar year of 2021. The order  
6 approves reconciliation as specified in the appendices  
7 to the order.

8 Are there any objections to approving  
9 the order?

10 (No verbal response.)

11 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is  
12 approved.

13 We have no miscellaneous items. We  
14 have no petitions for rehearing.

15 Under other business, Item 01 concerns  
16 approval of batches, contracts, and confirmations under  
17 the Adjustable Block Program.

18 Are there any objections to approving  
19 the program administrator's submissions.

20 (No verbal response.)

21 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, these submissions  
22 are approved.

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1                   Item 02 concerns Commission comments on  
2 FERC improvement to generator interconnection  
3 procedures and agreements for Docket Number RM  
4 22-14-000.

5                   Are there any objections to approving  
6 the comments submissions to FERC?

7                   (No verbal response.)

8           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the comments  
9 submissions is approved.

10                   This concludes our public utilities  
11 agenda.

12                   Judge Kinsey (phonetic), do you have  
13 other matters to come before the Commission today?

14           JUDGE KINSEY: No, Madam Chair.

15           CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Do other Commissioners have  
16 business to discuss?

17           UNKNOWN SPEAKER: Thank you, Madam Chair. I'd  
18 just like to mention that tomorrow is Andrea Jakubas's  
19 last day. She's my advisor.

20                   And we've enjoyed working with you very  
21 much, Andrea. Mary and I have -- it's been it's been a  
22 real joy, and I'm just thankful for the time. And

1 Andrea will be joining Ms. Del Valle's office of  
2 general counsel here at the ICC. So we're happy and  
3 grateful that the Commission hasn't lost such a  
4 dedicated and talented attorney. So that's all I have  
5 to say.

6 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Okay. Thank you, Commissioner.  
7 Yeah, we'll miss you, Andrea, on the CMC side, but glad  
8 that we get to keep you at the Commission. You do  
9 wonderful work.
