1 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings
2 Act and in accordance with the Governor's executive
3 orders, I call the October 28, 2020, Regular Open
4 Meeting to order.

5 Before we proceed, for the clarity
6 of the record, I would ask everyone to state their
7 name before speaking and to speak slowly and
8 clearly so that the court reporter can capture
9 everything that is said.

10 I already checked that all
11 Commissioners are with us and we have a quorum.

12 We have no request to speak and we
13 are moving on to our agenda.

15 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: We're moving on to our
16 Public Utilities Agenda.

17 There are edits to the October 1st,
18 2020, Special Open Meeting minutes.

19 Are there any objections to
20 approving the minutes as edited?

21 (No verbal response.)

22 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the

1 minutes are approved.

2 Under our Electric Items: Item E-1
3 concerns MidAmerican's filing to modify its refund
4 process for billing adjustments. The filing makes
5 refunds due to inaccurate meters ineligible for
6 billing adjustments for time periods more than two
7 years. The Commission staff recommends not
8 suspending the filing.

9 Are there any objections to not
10 suspending the filing?

11 (No verbal response.)

12 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
13 filing is not suspended.

14 Item E-2 concerns ComEd's filing to
15 revise Rider Residential Air Conditioner Load
16 Cycling Program, or Rider AC. The revisions:
17 First, terminate the thermostat control option of
18 the program currently offered to participants
19 electing to utilize a smart thermostat to
20 participate in the program. Second, it allows for
21 compliance with modifications to the PJM Base
22 Capacity Demand Response Program. ComEd believes

1 termination of the thermostat control option is
2 necessary because of the lack of appropriate
3 vendor. The Commission staff recommends not
4 suspending the filing.

5 Are there any objections to not
6 suspending the filing?

7 (No verbal response.)

8 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
9 filing is not suspended.

10 Item E-3 concerns Mt. Carmel's
11 request for reconciliation of revenues under its
12 fuel adjustment charges for the calendar year of
13 2019. The order approves the reconciliation, as
14 set in the appendix to the order, finding that the
15 costs were prudently incurred.

16 Are there any objections to
17 approving the order?

18 (No verbal response.)

19 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order
20 is approved.

21 Item E-4 concerns a citation for
22 failure to comply with Part 454 of the Commission's

1 rules. The parties have a stipulation and joint
2 motion to dismiss, stipulating that the issues
3 raised by the Commission have been resolved and
4 requesting that the Commission dismiss the
5 citations with prejudice.

6 Are there objections to granting
7 the motion to dismiss?

8 (No verbal response.)

9 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
10 motion is granted.

11 Item E-5 concerns a request for
12 confidential treatment of petitioner's report. The
13 order grants the protection, finding that the
14 information is highly proprietary and confidential.

15 Are there any objections to
16 approving the order?

17 (No verbal response.)

18 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order
19 is approved.

20 Item E-6 concerns a request for
21 confidential treatment of petitioner's report. The
22 petitioner has determined that this filing is

1 duplicative and unnecessary and has motioned to
2 withdraw its filing.

3 Are there objections to granting
4 the motion to withdraw?

5 (No verbal response.)

6 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
7 motion is granted.

8 Item E-7 concerns a petition by the
9 Illinois Department of Transportation, or IDOT, for
10 approval of eminent domain to acquire certain
11 properties owned by ComEd in Lee County, Illinois.
12 IDOT requires the property to complete roadwork and
13 help facilitate vehicular traffic on U.S. Route 41.
14 The order approves IDOT's request and grants
15 an approval to acquire a temporary easement for
16 construction purposes for a period of five years,
17 or until completion of construction, whichever
18 occurs first.

19 Are there any objections to
20 approving the order?

21 (No verbal response.)

22 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order

1 is approved.

2 Item E-8 concerns a petition to
3 cancel a certificate to operate as a retail
4 electric agent, broker and consultant in Illinois.
5 The petitioner states that it has ceased operations
6 in Illinois and no longer has any customers in
7 Illinois. The order cancels the certificate and
8 directs the petitioner to file any outstanding
9 annual reports with the Commission within 60 days
10 of the date of the order.

11 Are there any objections to
12 approving the order?

13 (No verbal response.)

14 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order
15 is approved.

16 Items E-9 and E-10 concern
17 petitions for certificates to install energy
18 efficiency measures in Illinois. The orders grant
19 the certificates, finding that the applicants meet
20 the requirements.

21 Are there any objections to
22 considering these items together and approving the

1 orders?

2 (No verbal response.)

3 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
4 orders are approved.

5 Under our Gas Items: Items G-1 and
6 G-2 concern Illinois Gas Company's and
7 Mt. Carmel's request to reconcile revenues
8 collected under their gas adjustment charges, or
9 Rider PGA. The orders approve the reconciliations
10 as set in the appendices to the orders, finding
11 that the costs during the reconciliation period
12 were prudently incurred.

13 Are there any objections to
14 considering these items together and approving the
15 orders?

16 (No verbal response.)

17 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
18 orders are approved.

19 Under our Telecommunications Items:
20 Item T-1 concerns Docket 20-0215, which is a
21 complaint against Frontier North regarding a
22 billing issue. The complainant motioned to

1 voluntarily dismiss the complaint.

2 Are there any objections to
3 granting the motion to dismiss?

4 (No verbal response.)

5 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
6 motion to dismiss is granted.

7 Item T-2 concerns Mastec Network
8 Solutions' application for a certificate of local
9 exchange and access authority to operate as a
10 facilities-based carrier of telecommunications
11 services in Illinois. The order grants a
12 certificate, finding that the applicant meets the
13 requirements.

14 Are there any objections to
15 approving the order?

16 (No verbal response.)

17 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order
18 is approved.

19 There are no Water and Sewer Items,
20 no Miscellaneous Items, no Petitions for Rehearing.

21 Under Other Business Items: Item
22 O-1 concerns approval of batches, contracts, and

1 confirmations under the Illinois Adjustable Block
2 Program.

3 Are there any objections to
4 approving the program administrator's submissions?

5 (No verbal response.)

6 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the
7 submissions are approved.

8 This concludes our Public Utilities
9 Agendas.

10 Judge Teague-Kingsley, do we have
11 any matters to come before the Commission today?

12 THE COURT: No, ma'am.
