And because the 110 percent rule is 7 applied uniformly to many different types of 8 generating facilities that would be eligible for 9 net metering and not just PV systems, the order 10 finds that the rule appears reasonable and 11 consistent with Rider POGNM. 12 Accordingly, the order grants the 13 motion for summary judgment filed by ComEd and 14 denies the complaint. Are there any objections to 15 approving the order? 16 (No verbal response.) 17 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is 18 approved. 19 Item E-5 concerns a complaint 20 against ComEd alleging that ComEd improperly 21 assessed a tampering fee against the complainant.
