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We have substantive edits to the order. The edits remove the proposed 5000-kilowatt cap for eligible solar facilities, remove the restriction that limits 4 the rebate to costs for only ComEd installed facilities and infrastructure as suggested in Staff's Exception Number 2, and make another minor non-substantive correction related to FERC charges. I move the proposed edits. Is there a second? COMMISSIONER KIMBREL: Second.

COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Chair Zalewski, this is Commissioner Bocanegra. If I may, I have just a couple of remarks.

CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Sure. Go ahead, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Thank you. I would like to say, I agree with all of the edits and outcomes except for one, so hence, the requirement for my nay vote today. So I disagree with how the order is distinguishing between ordinary and incremental interconnection costs. I believe the proper interpretation of statute should use the plain and

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ordinary meaning of the term interconnection facilities, which to me doesn't differentiate between ordinary and incremental. And so without any clearly defined legislative history or intent that would suggest an alternative interpretation of that language as the order currently articulates. I would just make that note. And I also think it's clear that using the plain and ordinary interpretation of the statute, any and all costs are subject to rebates for those projects, paring storage and wanting to enable participation in the frequency regulation market. Further, I don't know that the order appropriately reconciles the language found in 107b-5 requiring that both previously incurred and future costs of installing interconnection facilities be rebated. And finally, I would just say I remained a little bit concerned that the edits as proposed don't go far enough in eliminating the incremental language that currently is in the tariff language itself. So I believe that this interpretation is in line with Illinois recent legislative energy and economic development policy, and this interpretation would help increase and encourage
