

1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings Act, I
2 call the February 3, 2022 Regular Open Meeting to
3 order. Consistent with Section 7(e) of the Open
4 Meetings Act, a fully in-person meeting is not prudent
5 at this time due to Winter Storm Landon and
6 Governor J.B. Pritzker's Disaster Proclamation. So we
7 are proceeding pursuant to Section 7(e).

8 I checked that we have all five
9 commissioners present, so we have a quorum. And
10 speaking of five commissioners, I would like to take a
11 minute to recognize and welcome our newest
12 commissioner, who is a familiar face to all, Ann
13 McCabe.

14 Effective February 1, Governor J.B.
15 Pritzker appointed Commissioner McCabe to a five-year
16 term on the ICC. And Commissioner McCabe has over 25
17 years of energy and environmental policy and regulatory
18 experience in the public, private, and nonprofit
19 sectors before joining the Commission.
20 Commissioner McCabe most recently served as the U.S.
21 Program Director and Principal of the Regulatory
22 Assistance Project. She also previously served on the

1 Commission from March of 2012 to January of 2017. She
2 brings decades of regulatory experience, including your
3 time at Ann McCabe and Associates, where she advised
4 trade associations and nonprofits on energy and
5 environmental policies and regulations. I want to
6 extend a warm welcome to Commissioner McCabe and to say
7 how excited I am to have her on the Commission,
8 especially at this incredibly pivotable time as we
9 implement the Clean and Equitable Jobs Act.
10 Commissioner McCabe welcome to the Commission.

11 COMMISSIONER MCCABE: Thank you. It's great to
12 return to the ICC for the third time. My first time
13 was as a Commissioner's Assistant when Phil O'Connor
14 and Meg Bushnell were the chairs. It was prior to
15 restructuring. So the big issue was whether the
16 nuclear plants were used and useful. In my first term
17 as a Commissioner, I implemented the Energy
18 Infrastructure Monetization Act that created formula
19 rates. Now the Commission is implementing CEJA. It's
20 an important time in the state's energy transition. I
21 look forward to assisting with this work.

22 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Thank you. So moving on to our

22 the tariff with modifications indicated in the order.

1 We have substantive edits to the order. The edits
2 remove the proposed 5000-kilowatt cap for eligible
3 solar facilities, remove the restriction that limits
4 the rebate to costs for only ComEd installed facilities
5 and infrastructure as suggested in Staff's Exception
6 Number 2, and make another minor non-substantive
7 correction related to FERC charges. I move the
8 proposed edits. Is there a second?

9 COMMISSIONER KIMBREL: Second.

10 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: A second from Commissioner
11 Kimbrel. Any discussion?

12 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Chair Zalewski, this is
13 Commissioner Bocanegra. If I may, I have just a couple
14 of remarks.

15 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Sure. Go ahead, Commissioner.

16 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Thank you. I would like
17 to say, I agree with all of the edits and outcomes
18 except for one, so hence, the requirement for my nay
19 vote today. So I disagree with how the order is
20 distinguishing between ordinary and incremental
21 interconnection costs. I believe the proper
22 interpretation of statute should use the plain and

1 ordinary meaning of the term interconnection
2 facilities, which to me doesn't differentiate between
3 ordinary and incremental. And so without any clearly
4 defined legislative history or intent that would
5 suggest an alternative interpretation of that language
6 as the order currently articulates. I would just make
7 that note. And I also think it's clear that using the
8 plain and ordinary interpretation of the statute, any
9 and all costs are subject to rebates for those
10 projects, paring storage and wanting to enable
11 participation in the frequency regulation market.
12 Further, I don't know that the order appropriately
13 reconciles the language found in 107b-5 requiring that
14 both previously incurred and future costs of installing
15 interconnection facilities be rebated. And finally, I
16 would just say I remained a little bit concerned that
17 the edits as proposed don't go far enough in
18 eliminating the incremental language that currently is
19 in the tariff language itself. So I believe that this
20 interpretation is in line with Illinois recent
21 legislative energy and economic development policy, and
22 this interpretation would help increase and encourage

1 distributed generation, increase renewables and
2 increased clean fuel sources. And so for those
3 reasons, I will be having to vote nay. Thank you.

19 Modernization Action Plan Reconciliation, which was
20 approved by the Commission in Docket No. 20-046 --
21 excuse me, 0426. If you are in favor of approving the

21 COMMISSIONER MCCABE: Aye.

22 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: I vote "Aye." The five ayes have

3 Item O-1 concerns approval of batches, contracts, and
4 confirmations under the Illinois Solar for All Program.
5 If you're in favor of approving the program
6 administrator's submissions, please say "Aye," and if
7 opposed say, "Nay." Commissioner Bocanegra?

8 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Aye.

9 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Commissioner Carrigan?

10 COMMISSIONER CARRIGAN: Aye.

11 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Commissioner Kimbrel?

12 COMMISSIONER KIMBREL: Aye.

13 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Commissioner McCabe?

14 COMMISSIONER MCCABE: Aye.

15 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: I vote "Aye." The five ayes have
16 it and the program administrator's submissions are
