8	O'Connell-Diaz. I am Chairman Scott. We have a							
9	quorum.							
10	Before moving into the agenda,							
11	according to Part 1700.10 of Title 2 of the Illinois							
12	Administrative Code this is the time we allow the							
13	members of the public to address the Commission.							
14	Members of the public wishing to address the							
15	Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's Office at							
16	least 24 hours prior to the Commission meeting.							
17	According to the Chief Clerk's Office we have no							
18	requests to speak at today's Regular Open Meeting.							
19	(The Transportation							
20	portion of the proceedings							
21	was held at this time and

2	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: We now move to the Public							
3	Utilities agenda. First up is the approval of							
4	minutes from the March 9 Electric Vehicle Policy

The vote is five to nothing approving 5 the minutes from the March 9 EVP meeting as amended. 6 7 Next up are the minutes from our March 15 Regular Open Meeting. I understand amendments 8 9 have been forwarded. Is there a motion to amend the 10 minutes? COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved. 11 12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? 13 ACTING COMMISSONER COLGAN: Second. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 14 15 All in favor say aye. 16 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. 17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed, nay. 18 (No response.) 19 The vote is five to nothing amending the minutes from March 15. 20 21 Is there a motion now to approve the 22 minutes as amended?

COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved. 1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? 2 3 ACTING COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second. 4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 5 All in favor say aye. 6 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed, nay. 7 8 (No response.) 9 The vote is five to nothing approving 10 the minutes from the March 15 Regular Open Meeting as 11 amended. 12 Starting with the Electric portion of 13 today's agenda, Item E-1 (11-0341) involves 14 commencing reconciliation proceedings surrounding 15 Ameren's Rider EDR and GER for energy efficiency and demand-response cost recoveries. Staff recommends 16 17 that the Commission enter an Order commencing the 18 reconciliation proceeding. Is there a motion to 19 enter an Order commencing the proceeding? COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved. 20 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? 22 ACTING COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 1 2 All in favor say aye. 3 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. 4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed, nay. (No response.) 5 6 The vote is five to nothing and the 7 Order is entered. 8 We will use this five to nothing vote 9 for the remainder of the Public Utilities agenda, 10 unless otherwise noted. 11 Item E-2 concerns ComEd's proposed 12 tariff sheet to establish a Rate GAP regarding 13 Government Aggregation Protocols. Staff recommends 14 that the Commission allow the Company's proposal by 15 not suspending the filing. Is there any discussion? 16 17 (No response.) Any objections? 18 19 (No response.) 20 Hearing none, the filing will not be 21 suspended. 22 Item E-3 is Docket Number 09-0460.

1 This item concerns a filing made by BlueStar concerning the Ameren Illinois Utilities' policy on 2 the cancellation of internet enrollment and whether 3 4 Ameren's policy is consistent with the Commission's rules. ALJ Albers recommends that the Commission 5 enter an Order granting the relief requested by 6 7 BlueStar and directing Ameren to file tariffs consistent with Part 453 of the Administrative Code 8 9 within 14 days. 10 Is there any discussion? 11 (No response.) 12 Any objection? 13 (No response.) 14 Hearing none, the Order is entered. Item E-4 is Docket Number 10-0157. 15 16 This is Chiku Enterprises' complaint as to billing 17 and/or charges against GDF SUEZ Energy Resources. 18 Before us is a Motion to Dismiss brought by the 19 Respondent. This item has been on our agenda for a few months now, and I believe we have reached some 20 resolution between offices on some consensus 21 22 revisions that do not change ALJ Riley's conclusion.

I will go ahead and introduce these 1 revisions. With the revisions we want to maintain 2 3 the conclusion that the Commission does have 4 jurisdiction over this matter and denying the Motion to Dismiss. But we did want to streamline the 5 discussion of Section 16-116 and also advise the 6 Complainant that there may be value in filing an 7 amended complaint, as much of the confusion in this 8 matter may have come from the fact that the 9 10 Complainant initially filed without the assistance of 11 counsel. Now that the Complainant has the assistance 12 of counsel, the entire process may benefit through 13 bringing more clarity and organization to the 14 complaint and categorically framing what is truly at 15 issue between the parties. Is there any discussion on these 16 17 revisions? 18 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Mr. Chairman, I 19 certainly support the revisions that were put forth. I think it adds a lot of clarity to the Order and 20

21 hopefully will bring a swifter resolution of the 22 issue.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Thank you, Commissioner 1 Elliott. Is there any other discussion? 2 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: I just want to be 3 4 clear that the revisions that we have before us are not in total the revisions of Commissioner Elliott. 5 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: No, it is amended with 6 7 the Chairman's assistance. 8 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Right, I think all offices had input into that. 9 10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Absolutely. Is there any 11 further discussion? (No response.) 12 13 I will move to adopt these revisions. 14 Is there a second? COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Second. 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 16 17 All in favor say aye. 18 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed, nay. 20 (No response.) 21 The vote is five to nothing, and the 22 revisions are adopted.

Is there a motion to enter the Order 1 as revised? 2 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved. 3 4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? ACTING COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second. 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 6 7 All in favor say aye. 8 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed? 10 (No response.) 11 The vote is five to nothing and the 12 Order as amended is approved. 13 Item E-5 is Docket Number 10-0292. This is New Jerusalem Pentecostal Ministries' 14 15 complaint as to billing and/or charges against AmerenIP. ALJ Tapia recommends that the Commission 16 17 enter an Order denying the complaint based on the record evidence in the case. 18 19 Is there any discussion? 20 (No response.) 21 Any objections? 22 (No response.)

1 Hearing none, the Order is entered and the complaint is denied. 2 Item E-6 is Docket Number 10-0740. 3 4 This is Chris Hitler's complaint as to billing and/or charges against ComEd. We have previously entered an 5 Order in this matter dismissing the complaint with 6 prejudice, but up today is an Amendatory Order 7 indicating that the complaint is actually dismissed 8 9 without prejudice. ALJ Kimbrel recommends that we enter this Amendatory Order. 10 11 Is there any discussion? 12 (No response.) 13 Any objections? 14 (No response.) 15 Hearing none, the Amendatory Order is 16 entered. Item E-7 is Docket Number 10-0326. 17 18 This is IPC's complaint surrounding ComEd allegedly 19 having mailed a civil court summons to an incorrect address. ALJ Benn recommends that the Commission 20 21 enter an Order dismissing the matter without 22 prejudice for want of prosecution.

Item E-16 is Docket Number 10-0647. 11 12 This is Biofuels Technology's application for 13 licensure as an Agent, Broker and Consultant under 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act. ALJ Yoder 14 recommends that the Commission enter an Order denying 15 the requested certificate due to the Applicant's 16 17 failure to provide sufficient evidence regarding his qualification. 18 19 Is there any discussion? 20 (No response.) 21 Any objections? 22 (No response.)

1 Hearing none, the Order is entered and the application is denied. 2 Items E-17 and E-18 (10-0647, 10-0700) 3 4 can be taken together. Hearing none, the Motion to Withdraw 7 8 is granted. 9 Items E-22 through E-31 (11-0202, 11-0214, 11-0222, 11-0273, 11-0287, 11-0290, 11-0305, 10 11-0306, 11-0313, 11-0314) can be taken together. 11 Each of these items concern petitions to protect 12 13 against the disclosure of confidential and/or 14 proprietary information. In each case the ALJ recommends entry of an Order granting the requested 15 relief for a period of two years. 16 17 Is there any discussion? 18 (No response.) 19 Any objections? 20 (No response.) 21 Hearing none, the Orders are entered 22 and the requested relief is granted for two years.

1 Items E-32 and E-33 (11-0272, 11-0307) can be taken together. These items each concern 2 petitions for confidential treatment for financial 3 4 information and reports made under Title 83, Part 454, of the Administrative Code.
