PROCEEDINGS

2	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Pursuant to the provisions of
3	the Open Meetings Act, I now convene a regularly
4	scheduled Bench Session of the Illinois Commerce
5	Commission. With me in Springfield are Commissioner
6	McCabe, Acting Commissioner Del Valle and Acting
7	Commissioner Maye. I am Chairman Scott. We have a
8	quorum.
9	I believe we have Commissioner Colgan
10	on the phone. Are you there, Commissioner?
11	COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Yes, I am.
12	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Under the Commission rules we
13	will have to vote to allow Commissioner Colgan to
14	participate by phone. I move to allow Commissioner
15	Colgan's participation by phone.
16	Is there a second?
17	COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
18	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded.
19	All in favor say aye.
20	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
21	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
22	(No response.)

The vote is four to nothing, and
 Commissioner Colgan may participate in today's
 meeting by phone.

4 Before moving into the agenda, according to Section 1700.10 of Title II of the 5 Administrative Code, this is the time we allow 6 members of the public to address the Commission. 7 8 Members of the public wishing to address the 9 Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's Office at 10 least 24 hours prior to Commission meetings. According to the Chief Clerk's Office, we have one 11 12 request to speak at today's meeting. However, no 13 requests have been granted. 14 (The Transportation

15 portion of the proceedings 16 was held at this time and 17 is contained in a separate 18 transcript.)

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Now on the Public Utility
agenda, we will begin with the Electric portion.
Item E-1 concerns initiating a proceeding to
investigate Ameren's progress in implementing its

1 Advanced Metering Infrastructure Deployment Plan pursuant to to Section 16-108.6(e) of the Public 2 3 Utilities Act. Staff recommends that we not initiate 4 the proceeding. 5 Is there any discussion? 6 (No response.) Is there a motion to not initiate the 7 8 proceeding? 9 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. 10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? 11 ACTING COMMISSIONER MAYE: Second. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded. 12 13 All in favor say aye. 14 COMMISSIONERS: Aye. 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed? 16 (No response.) 17 The vote is five to nothing, and the proceeding is not initiated. 18 19 We will use this five to nothing vote 20 for the remainder of today's Bench Session, unless otherwise noted. 21 22 Item E-2 is Docket Number 12-0212.

This is our rulemaking proceeding initiated to
 implement certification requirements for persons or
 entities that install, maintain, or repair electric
 vehicle charging stations as required by Section
 16-128(a)(D) of the Public Utilities Act. ALJ Albers
 recommends entry of an Order authorizing the second
 notice period.

8 Is there any discussion? Commissioner9 McCabe.

10 COMMISSIONER McCABE: This Second Notice Order 11 on electric vehicle installation, maintenance, and 12 repair nicely incorporates the input of the Illinois 13 Chamber, labor, utilities, and Staff. It improves 14 the First Notice Order by broadening the definition 15 of qualified person and narrowing information 16 necessary to submit an application to the common EV 17 installer. It requires the retail customer planning to install an EV charging station to provide 18 19 information to the utility and calls for those 20 installing, maintaining, or repairing these stations 21 and the retail customers to retain records related to 22 EV charging station installations and conversions.

1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Thank you. Is there further 2 discussion? 3 (No response.) 4 I also want to thank Judge Albers. Ι 5 think he did a fine job here in both incorporating 6 the desires or the concerns of the various parties who responded to this rulemaking proceeding, but also 7 8 did so in a way that would move this issue forward in a very positive way, an issue that we spent a lot of 9 10 time on in the Commission and one that we care about. 11 So I really appreciate the work that Judge Albers did 12 on this Order. 13 Is there any discussion? 14 (No response.) 15 Are there any objections? 16 (No response.) 17 Hearing none, the Order is entered. Item E-3 is Docket Number 13-0102. 18 19 This is Ameristar's application for licensure as an 20 agent, broker and consultant under Section 16-115(c) of the Public Utilities Act. ALJ Kimbrel recommends 21 22 entry of an Order granting the certificate.

1 Is there any discussion? 2 (No response.) 3 Are there any objections? 4 (No response.) 5 Hearing none, the Order is entered. Item E-4 is Docket Number 13-0116. 6 This is Christine Papagno's complaint against ComEd. 7 The parties have apparently settled their differences 8 and have brought a Joint Motion to Dismiss which ALJ 9 10 Riley recommends we grant. 11 Is there any discussion? 12 (No response.) 13 Any objections? (No response.) 14 15 Hearing none, the Joint Motion to 16 Dismiss is granted. 17 Item E-5 is Docket Number 13-0234. This is Verde Energy's petition for the confidential 18 19 and/or proprietary treatment of its annual Part 465 20 Net Metering Report. ALJ Riley recommends entry of 21 an Order granting the requested protective treatment. 22 Is there any discussion?

6	T-1 is Docket Number 13-0116. This is Nextlink
7	Wireless' petition to cancel and reissue Certificates
8	of Service Authority previously granted to reflect
9	the change in its corporate form. ALJ Jorgensen
10	recommends entry of an Order granting the requested
11	relief.
12	Is there any discussion?

14	Any objections?
15	(No response.)
16	Hearing none, the Order is entered.
17	Item T-2 is Docket Number 13-0159.
18	This is a Joint Petition for the approval of the
19	Third Amendment to Interconnection Agreement between
20	AT&T and Call One. ALJ Baker recommends entry of an
21	Order approving the amendment.
22	Is there any discussion?

4	Hearing none, the Order is entered.
5	Item T-3 is Docket Number 12-0413.
6	This is Consolidated Communication's petition seeking
7	a declaratory ruling concerning Section 13-901 of the
8	Public Utilities Act, Title 83, Part 770 of the
9	Administrative Code. The Commission issued a ruling
10	on this matter on their April 9 meeting, and Securus,
11	a participant in the proceeding, has filed an
12	emergency motion for a stay of enforcement of that
13	Commission Order. ALJ Von Qualen recommends that we
14	deny the motion.
15	Is there any discussion?
16	(No response.)
17	Are there any objections?
18	(No response.)
19	Hearing none, the motion is denied.
20	Item T-4 is Docket Number 12-0479.
21	This is our proceeding initiated to adopt proposed
22	rules under Title 83, Part 757 of the Administrative

1 Code. ALJ Riley recommends entry of an Order authorizing a second notice period. 2 3 Is there any discussion? 4 (No response.) 5 Are there any objections? 6 (No response.) Hearing none, the Order is entered. 7 On to Water and Sewer, Item W-1 8 (WRM#18) is Delmar Water Company's request to remove 9 10 references to the City of Lake Forest from its tariff. Staff recommends that we not suspend the 11 12 filing. 13 Is there any discussion? 14 (No response.) 15 Are there any objections? 16 (No response.) 17 Hearing none, the filing is not suspended. 18 19 Item W-2 (WRM#22) is Illinois-American Water Company's petition to place a revised tariff 20 21 sheet into effect on less than 45 days notice. This 22 item has been withdrawn from today's agenda.

1	Item W-3 is Docket Number 12-0390.
2	This is IAWC's application for a temporary
3	Certificate of Public Convenience to provide water
4	service to certain areas in and around the city of
5	Sterling, Illinois, pursuant to section 8-406(e) of
6	the Public Utilities Act. ALJ Jones recommends entry
7	of an Order granting the requested certificate.
8	Is there any discussion?
9	(No response.)
10	Any objections?
11	(No response.)
12	Hearing none, the Order is entered.
13	There is one petition for rehearing to
14	consider today. Item PR-1 is Docket Numbers 11-0210
15	and 11-0211 Consolidated. This is a petition filed
16	by Geneseo Telephone Company, Cambridge Telephone
17	Company and Henry County Telephone Company to update
18	the Illinois Universal Service Fund and to implement
19	intrastate switched access charge reform. The
20	companies have filed a Petition for Rehearing which
21	ALJ Jones recommends we deny.
22	Is there any discussion?

1	(No response.)
2	Are there any objections to denying
3	rehearing?
4	(No response.)
5	Hearing none, the Petition for
6	Rehearing is denied.
7	We have one item of other business
8	today which is a resolution supporting 811 and
9	encouraging excavators and homeowners to call 811 to
10	have underground lines located prior to digging. The
11	resolution reads:
12	"WHEREAS, each year, the nation's
13	underground utility infrastructure is jeopardized by
14	unintentional damage by those who fail to call 811 to
15	have underground lines located prior to digging.
16	Failing to call 811 can result in utility service
17	interruption, damage to the environment, personal
18	injury, even death; and
19	WHEREAS, the Illinois Commerce
20	Commission continues to promote the widespread use of
21	the call-before-you-dig number in an effort to reduce
22	damages, injuries and death in Illinois by reminding

homeowners and excavators to call 811, the number designated by the Federal Communications Commission in 2005 to provide a simple way to reach the One Call Center and request utility line locations at the dig site; and

WHEREAS, through education about safe 6 digging practices, excavators and homeowners can save 7 time and money and keep our nation safe and connected 8 by making a call to 811 in advance on any digging 9 10 project; waiting the required time for utility lines 11 to be marked, respecting the marked lines by 12 maintaining visual definition throughout the course 13 of the excavation, and digging with care around the marked utility lines; and 14

WHEREAS, all parties agree that safe digging is a shared responsibility and you should know what's below ground: call 811 before you dig; IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED by the II linois Commerce Commission that the month of April 20 2013 is hereby commemorated as National Safe Digging Month.

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IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that excavators

1 and homeowners throughout the state protect our utility infrastructure by calling 811 before digging 2 and be reminded that safe digging is no accident. 3 4 IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this 5 resolution be served on those electric utilities and gas utilities under the jurisdiction of the 6 Commission." 7 8 Is there any discussion on the resolution? 9 10 (No response.) 11 I would say it is a very, very 12 important issue and one that's been out there for a 13 long time. And no matter how much we continue to play up this issue and talk about it, we still have 14 15 instances where folks are digging without calling 16 first and with some very dire consequences. So I 17 actually would encourage everyone in whatever circles they are in to make sure that people know how 18 important this is and to make sure that folks call 19 20 before they dig. 21 Any further discussion on the

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resolution?

3	supporting 811. Is there a second?
4	COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
5	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded.
6	All in favor say aye.
7	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

9	(No response.)
10	The vote is five to nothing. The
11	resolution supporting 811 is adopted.
12	We have two FERC matters on the agenda
13	today, both of which concern pending litigation. So
14	we will go into Closed Session to address them.
15	Is there a motion to go into Closed
16	Session?
17	ACTING COMMISSIONER MAYE: So moved.
18	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second?
19	COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
20	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded.
21	All in favor say aye.
22	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

1	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
2	(No response.)
3	The vote is five to nothing, and the
4	Commission will now go into Closed Session. Please
5	let me know when the room is ready in Chicago.
6	(Whereupon at this point
7	pages 17 - 32 of the
8	proceedings are
9	contained in a separate
10	closed transcript.)

14	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
15	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
16	(No response.)
17	The vote is five to nothing, and the
18	filing will be made with FERC.
19	Judge Wallace, are there any other
20	matters to come before the Commission today?
21	JUDGE WALLACE: I just wanted to note in case
22	there was some confusion that the April 30 meeting

listed is a Prebench. May 1 is a Bench Session. I don't know if any of you were confused, but some of us were confused. So, but the April 30 is a Prebench. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Okay.
