1 CHAIRMAN: Are you ready in Chicago?

2 COMMISSIONER PARADIS: Yes, we are,
3 Mr. Chairman.

4 CHAIRMAN: I can't see. Commissioner
5 Paradis, are you there?

6 COMMISSIONER PARADIS: Yes.

7 CHAIRMAN: I gotcha. Very good. Under the
8 Open Meetings Act, I call the July 24th, 2024, regular
9 open meeting to order. Commissioners Carrigan, McCabe
10 and Reddick are with me in Springfield. Commissioner
11 Paradis is in Chicago. We have a quorum. We have one
12 request to speak today from Mr. Rashan Crump under two
13 Illinois Administrative Code, Section 1700.10. Any
14 person desiring to address the commission shall be
15 allowed up to three minutes. Only one person may
16 speak on behalf of any organization. Please note that
17 the commission will not respond directly to any public
18 comments.

19 Mr. Crump, are you with us? If not, I'll
20 try to come back at the end of the meeting then. One
21 more time, Mr. Crump?

22 Okay. We will then move on and start
23 today's meeting with the transportation agenda. There
24 are edits to the June 20th and July 2nd transportation
25 regular open meeting minutes. Are there any

1 objections to approving the minutes as edited?

2 Hearing none, the minutes are approved as edited.

3 Items RR-1 through RR-7 concern projects at
4 railroad crossings across Illinois. The orders extend
5 deadlines and modify existing projects. Are there any
6 objections to considering these items together and
7 approving the orders? Hearing none, the orders are
8 approved.

9 Item RR-8 concerns a petition from IDOT for
10 approval to acquire certain property owned by Union
11 Pacific in Peoria County. The order grants the
12 petition finding that IDOT has the authority to
13 acquire the property. Are there any objections to
14 approving the order? Hearing none, the order is
15 approved.

16 Items RR-9 and RR-10 concern public safety
17 improvement projects at railroad crossings in
18 Illinois. The orders extend project deadlines. Are
19 there any objections to considering these items
20 together and approving the orders? Hearing none, the
21 orders are approved.

22 Moving on to motor carrier items. Item
23 MC-1 concerns an application for a commercial vehicle
24 relocator's towing license. The order grants the
25 application finding that the applicant meets the

1 requirements. Are there any objections to approving
2 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

3 Item MC-2 concerns an application for an
4 operator employment permit. The order grants the
5 application finding that the applicant has met all the
6 necessary requirements. Are there any objections to
7 approving the order? Hearing none, the order is
8 approved.

9 Items MC-3 through MC-7 concern
10 applications for new household goods, property, motor
11 carrier authority. The orders grant the applications
12 finding that the applicants meet the requirements.
13 Are there any objections to considering these items
14 together and approving the orders? Hearing none, the
15 orders are approved.

16 This concludes the transportation agenda.
17 We will now move to the public utilities agenda.
