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1 2 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Good morning. Are we ready to proceed in Springfield? 3 4 MR. MATRISCH: Yes. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Pursuant to the Open Meetings 5 6 Act, I call the August 12, 2015 Bench Session of the 7 Illinois Commerce Commission to order. Commissioners McCabe, del Valle and 8 9 Rosales are present with me in Chicago. We have a 10 quorum. Commissioner Maye is participating by phone 11 today. 12 Commissioner Maye, are you with us? 13 CHIEF CLERK: I'm not sure if she is on the line 14 yet. 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Let's proceed without her and 16 then when she joins we will have a vote to allow her 17 participation. 18 We have no requests to speak and we 19 will, therefore, move into our Regular 20 Transportation Agenda. There are several non-substantive 21 22 edits to the Minutes of our July 8th --

1 (Brief interruption.) 2 Commissioner Maye, is that you? 3 COMMISSIONER MAYE: That's me. Sorry about that. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: No worries. 4 I would like to move to allow 5 6 Commissioner Maye to participate by phone. Is there 7 a second? 8 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there discussion? 9 10 (No response.) 11 All those in favor, say aye. 12 (Chorus of ayes.) 13 Any opposed, say nay. 14 (No response.) The ayes have it and Commissioner Maye 15 16 is granted permission to participate by phone. 17 Moving onto our Public Utility Agenda, 18 we have no minutes to approve. Item E-1 concerns MidAmerican's 19 20 Modification to its Qualifying Facility, 21 Cogeneration and Small Power Production Facilities 2.2 Rate.

1 Is there any objection to not suspending the filing? 2 3 (No response.) Hearing none, the filing is not 4 5 suspended. 6 Item E-2 concerns a Modification to ComEd's Energy Efficiency and Demand Response 7 8 Adjustments Rider. 9 Is there any objection to not 10 suspending the filing? 11 (No response.) 12 Hearing none, the filing is not 13 suspended. 14 Item E-3 concerns Modifications to 15 Ameren's Utility Consolidated Billing and Purchase 16 of Receivables Internal Audits. 17 Is there any objection to not suspending the filing? 18 19 (No response.) 20 Hearing none, the filing is not 21 suspended. 22 Item E-4 concerns a billing

complaint filed against ComEd. I believe 1 Commissioner del Valle has a statement to make 2 3 regarding this item. 4 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Yes. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 5 б These customers were wrongfully billed 7 in their incorrect weight classification for over 8 15 years. They only discovered this error in 2007. By 2009, they had initiated a formal 9 complaint when they filed the complaint here, 10 because it was filed two months too late, Section 11 12 9-252 of the PUA and Section 9-252.1, having two years statute of limitations for consumer 13 14 complaints; however, for any other contract for service you have written agreements providing a 5 15 16 year to 10-year Statute of Limitations respectfully. 17 It does not make any sense that 18 customers of a utility have a shorter window to seek 19 restitution. 20 I will be voting no on this Order, but 21 I also want to encourage our Staff, our legislative folks and our policy folks to explore putting 22

together and suggesting legislation that will 1 address this because an Order changing it, of 2 course, would be an amendment to the statute. 3 Thank 4 you. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you, Commissioner. 5 6 Is there a motion to approve the 7 proposed Order? 8 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. 9 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 10 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded. 11 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there any further 12 discussion? 13 (No response.) 14 All those in favor of approving the 15 proposed Order, say aye. 16 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Aye. 17 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Aye. 18 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Aye. 19 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Opposed, say nay. 20 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Nay. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: The ayes have it and the 21 22 motion approving the proposed Order dismissing the

1 complaint is granted.

Hearing none, the Order is approved 9 and the Motion to Dismiss is granted. 10 11 Item E-6 is a complaint filed against 12 ComEd as to non-emergency vegetation management 13 activities in Bolingbrook, Illinois. 14 Is there any objection to approving the proposed Order? 15 16 (No response.) 17 Hearing none, the Order is approved and the Motion to Dismiss is granted. 18 19 Item E-7 concerns a complaint filed 20 against Starion Energy regarding a refund request. 21 Is there any objection to granting the 22 parties' Joint Motion to Dismiss?

21	involves Illinois Gas Company's Reconciliation of

with Actual Costs Prudently Incurred. 1 2 Is there any objection to approving 3 the proposed Order? 4 (No response.) Hearing none, the Order is approved. 5 6 Items G-2 and 3 involve the Approval 7 of Agreed Penalties for Violations of the Illinois 8 Gas Pipeline Safety Act. Are there any objections to 9 considering these items together and approving the 10 11 proposed Orders? 12 (No response.) 13 Hearing none, the Orders are approved. 14 Item T-1 concerns Frontier's Petition 15 for the Confidential Treatment of its Annual 16 Interconnection Report. 17 Is there any objection to approving 18 the proposed Order? 19 (No response.) 20 Hearing none, the Order is approved. Item T-2 concerns Call One's 21 Application to Expand its existing Certificate of 22

1 Is there any objection to entering the Interim Order? 2 3 (No response.) 4 Hearing none, the Interim Order is 5 entered. б Moving onto the Petition for 7 Rehearing, Item PR-1 concerns Applications for 8 Rehearing filed by intervenors regarding the Merger of Wisconsin Energy and Peoples Gas. 9 10 Is there a motion to deny the 11 Application for Rehearing? 12 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. 13 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 14 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded. 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any discussion? 16 (No response.) 17 All those in favor of denying the 18 Application for Rehearing, say aye. 19 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Aye. 20 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Aye. 21 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Aye. 22 Opposed, say nay.

1 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Nay. 2 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Commissioner Maye, did you vote on this item? 3 4 (No response.) 5 Commissioner Maye. 6 (No response.) 7 We may have lost her. The vote is 3 8 to one and the Applications for Rehearing are denied. 9 10 We have an item on our agenda 11 regarding ICC's Reply Comments in FERC Docket No. 12 ER10-1791-003. This item involves potential litigation and so we will enter closed session for a 13 14 brief discussion. 15 Is there a motion to enter closed 16 session? 17 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. 18 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 19 COMMISSIONER MAYE: Mr. Chairman, I apologize. This is Commissioner Maye. I am having a hard time 20 on this line today. This line is not working very 21 2.2 well.

I do also move to deny for the record. 1 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Not too late. 2 For the record then, the vote is 4 to 3 one on Item PR-1 concerning the Application for 4 5 Rehearing. Thank you. б We are considering the motion to go 7 into closed session. All of those in favor, say 8 aye. 9 (Chorus of ayes.) Opposed, say nay. 10 11 12 (No response.) We are in closed session -- we will 13 14 clear the room --15 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Mr. Chairman, I move to 16 second. 17 18 19 20 21 22

1 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you -- for a very brief discussion of this item in closed session and we 2 3 will come back in open session for action. (Whereupon, Closed Session 4 5 commenced from Pages 10 6 to Page 14.) 7 We are back in open session. 8 Is there a motion to approve the ICC 9 Reply Comments regarding the Allocation of MISO 10 Multi-Value Project Costs to PJM? 11 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. 12 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 13 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded. 14 COMMISSIONER MAYE: Seconded. 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: All those in favor -- I should 16 ask if there's any discussion? 17 (No response.) 18 All those in favor of approving, say 19 aye. 20 (Chorus of ayes.) 21 Opposed, say nay. 22 (No response.)

The ayes have it and the comments are
approved.

3 Judge Kimbrel, are there any other matters to come before the Commission today? 4 JUDGE KIMBREL: Nothing further, Mr. Chairman. 5 6 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: I have an item of other 7 business. On a personal note, I want to acknowledge 8 the passing of a dear friend to many of us who was 9 also a vital member of the energy community in Illinois for many years. Leslie Koczur passed 10 unexpectedly this weekend at her home in Hinsdale. 11 12 I would ask you to keep Leslie and her family in your thoughts and prayers. 13 14 Knowing Leslie well, she would not 15 want us to make a fuss, but perhaps some time soon 16 we can all get together and have a drink to 17 celebrate her life and positive impact on others 18 which I'm sure she would have enjoyed. Thank you. 19 If there's no other business, we will 20 stand adjourned. 21 (Whereupon, the above matter 22 was adjourned.)
