- 2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Pursuant to the provisions of
- 3 the Open Meetings Act, I now convene a regularly
- 4 scheduled Bench Session of the Illinois Commerce
- 5 Commission. With me in Springfield are Commissioners
- 6 Ford, O'Connell-Diaz, Colgan and McCabe. I am
- 7 Chairman Scott. We have a quorum.
- 8 Before moving into the agenda,
- 9 according to Section 1700.10 of Title II of the
- 10 Administrative Code, this is the time we allow
- 11 members of the public to address the Commission.
- 12 Members of the public wishing to address the
- 13 Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's Office at
- 14 least 24 hours prior to the Commission meeting.
- 15 According to the Chief Clerk's Office, we have no
- 16 requests to speak at today's Bench Session.
- 17 And, if you could, just for today's
- 18 meeting only, when folks that are speaking, other
- 19 than the Commissioners that are speaking, if you
- 20 would identify yourselves first to help out our court
- 21 reporter who's helping us out today. So thank you
- 22 for doing that.

- 1 (The Transportation portion of the
- proceedings was held at this time
- 3 and is contained in a separate
- 4 transcript.)
- 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: We will now move to the Public
- 6 Utility agenda, starting with the Electric portion.
- 7 Item E-1 is Docket Number 12-0455.
- 8 This is a petition filed by ComEd seeking special
- 9 permission to correct a formula error for its
- 10 delivery services' pricing and performance rate.
- 11 Staff recommends that special permission for this
- 12 change be granted.
- 13 Is there any discussion?
- 14 (No response.)
- 15 Is there a motion to grant special
- 16 permission?
- 17 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: So moved.
- 18 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
- 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner
- 20 O'Connell-Diaz. Seconded by Commissioner McCabe.
- 21 Moved and seconded. All in favor say aye.
- 22 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

- 1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
- 2 (No response.)
- 3 The vote is five to nothing. Special
- 4 permission is granted.
- 5 We will use this five to nothing vote
- 6 for the remainder of the Public Utility agenda,
- 7 unless otherwise noted.
- 8 Item E-2 is Docket Numbers 10-0272
- 9 through 10-0274. It's Ameren's reconciliation case
- 10 for revenues collected under power procurement riders
- 11 for June 2008 through May 2009. ALJ Jones
- 12 recommends entry of an Order approving the
- 13 reconciliation.
- 14 Is there any discussion?
- 15 (No response.)
- Any objections?
- 17 (No response.)
- 18 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 19 Item E-3 is Docket Number 10-0537.
- 20 This item will be held for disposition at a future
- 21 Commission proceeding.
- 22 Item E-4 is Docket Number 11-0669.

- 1 This is Ameren's reconciliation case for revenues
- 2 collected under Power Smart Pricing Rider for 2007
- 3 through 2010. ALJ Yoder recommends entry of an Order
- 4 approving the reconciliation.
- 5 Is there any discussion?
- 6 (No response.)
- 7 Are there any objections?
- 8 (No response.)
- 9 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 10 Items E-5 through E-10 (09-0594,
- 11 11-0409, 11-0534, 11-0735, 11-0751, 12-0229) can be
- 12 taken together. These items are customer complaints
- 13 against ComEd. In each case, the parties apparently
- 14 settled their differences and have brought a Joint
- 15 Motion to Dismiss the ALJ recommends we grant.
- Is there any discussion?

- 19 (No response.)
- 20 Hearing none, the Joint Motions to
- 21 Dismiss are granted.
- 22 Item E-11 is Docket Number 11-0728.

- 1 This is Lakecia Cole's complaint against Ameren. ALJ
- 2 Yoder recommends entry of an Order dismissing this
- 3 matter without prejudice for want of prosecution.
- 4 Is there any discussion?
- 5 (No response.)
- Any objections?
- 7 (No response.)
- 8 Hearing none, the Order is entered and
- 9 the matter is dismissed.
- 10 Item E-12 is Docket Number 12-0075.
- 11 This is Brian Bolan's complaint against ComEd. ALJ
- 12 Haynes recommends entry of an Order granting the
- 13 Complaint.
- 14 Is there any discussion?
- 15 (No response.)
- Any objections?
- 17 (No response.)
- 18 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 19 Item E-13 is Docket Number 12-0080.
- 20 This is Ameren's petition for authority to construct
- 21 and operate a new transmission line in Champaign
- 22 County. ALJ Von Qualen recommends entry of an Order

- 1 granting the company a certificate for the project.
- 2 Is there any discussion?
- 3 (No response.)
- 4 Any objections?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 7 Items E-14 and E-15 (12-0407, 12-0444)
- 8 can be taken together. These items are applications
- 9 by Santanna Energy Services and AP Gas & Electric for
- 10 licensure as an alternative retail electric supplier.
- 11 In each case, ALJ Yoder recommends the entry of an
- 12 Order granting the requested certificate.
- 13 Is there any discussion?
- 14 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Mr. Chairman.
- 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Commissioner Colgan?
- 16 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: On E-14, this is
- 17 Santanna's second request or attempt to obtain an
- 18 ARES certificate. They previously applied for this
- 19 certificate under Docket 12-0217 but withdrew its
- 20 application when it received the ALJ's proposed Order
- 21 denying that certificate. That proposed Order
- 22 language cited that Santanna's history of customer

- 1 complaints, their prior declaration and force
- 2 majeure, bankruptcy, and Santanna's contingency
- 3 planning and overall strategy for product pricing and
- 4 Santanna's overall performance in the area of
- 5 customer service.
- 6 Because it appears that this company
- 7 has now adequately addressed these problems in the
- 8 present docket, I'm not voting against this, granting
- 9 this certificate. There remains concern based on
- 10 Santanna's history of complaints as an Illinois AGS,
- 11 and as I have noted previously, I believe that this
- 12 Commission must ensure and protect the competitive
- 13 market from bad actors.
- 14 So as I vote to allow this company to
- 15 enter the ARES market, I encourage them to closely
- 16 monitor their outreach and marketing activities and
- 17 make customer service their highest priority.
- 18 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Thank you, Commissioner
- 19 Colgan. Further discussion? Commissioner
- 20 O'Connell-Diaz?
- 21 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Mr. Chairman, I
- 22 would concur with Commissioner Colgan's comments.

- 1 Having been on the Commission when this company was
- 2 not in line with the Commission rules and everything
- 3 that fell out of that situation, when I saw the
- 4 company's name on our roster of cases to look at, I
- 5 too, went and really went through the record, as I
- 6 know all of our colleagues did, as well as the ALJ,
- 7 the extensive information in this record that would
- 8 show that this is a company that has hopefully put
- 9 the past behind them, has put forward the appropriate
- 10 evidence in this record to ensure that customers are
- 11 going to be treated in the manner that our laws
- 12 provide for.
- 13 With that said, I would also concur
- 14 with Commissioner Colgan that the -- we will be
- 15 mindful and watchful of this company and any type of
- 16 complaint activity that we see as they go forward,
- 17 and it is because of the situation that we have had
- 18 with them, but I believe that the record is clear
- 19 that they have taken all the steps that they need to
- 20 to be a credible supplier of alternative services,
- 21 but we will be looking over their shoulders a lot, so
- they need to be mindful and make sure that they're

- 1 giving the highest standard to our ratepayers and
- 2 customers throughout the state. Thank you.
- 3 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any further discussion?
- 4 (No response.)
- 5 Are there any objections to entry of
- 6 these Orders?
- 7 (No response.)
- 8 Hearing none, the Orders are entered.
- 9 Items E-16 and E-17 (12-0412, 12-0417)
- 10 can be taken together. These items are applications
- 11 for licensure as an Agent, Broker and Consultant
- 12 filed under Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities
- 13 Act. In each case, ALJ Albers recommends entry of an
- 14 Order granting the certificate.
- 15 Is there any discussion?
- 16 (No response.)
- 17 Are there any objections?
- 18 (No response.)
- 19 Hearing none, the Orders are entered.
- 20 Items E-18 through E-23 (12-0124,
- 21 12-0198, 12-0260, 12-0302, 12-0360, 12-0369) can be
- 22 taken together. These are petitions for confidential

- 1 and/or proprietary treatment of Petitioner's reports.
- 2 In each case, the ALJ recommends entry an Order
- 3 granting the requested relief.
- 4 Is there any discussion?
- 5 (No response.)
- Are there any objections?
- 7 (No response.)
- 8 Hearing none, the Orders are entered.
- 9 Item E-24 is Docket Number 12-0342.
- 10 This is AEP Retail Energy Partners' petition to
- 11 withdraw its alternative retail electric supplier's
- 12 certificate previously issued by the Commission. ALJ
- 13 Baker recommends entry of an Order granting
- 14 withdrawal.
- 15 Is there any discussion?
- 16 (No response.)
- 17 Are there any objections?
- 18 (No response.)
- 19 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 20 Item E-25 is Docket Number 12-0399.
- 21 This is a petition by the Illinois Department of
- 22 Transportation seeking approval to acquire property

- 1 in Cook County by eminent domain for an intersection
- 2 improvement project. ALJ Hilliard recommends entry
- 3 of an Order granting the petition.
- 4 Is there any discussion?
- 5 (No response.)
- Are there any objections?
- 7 (No response.)
- 8 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 9 Turning now to Natural Gas, Item G-1
- 10 is Docket Number 11-0633. This is George Fehringer's
- 11 complaint against Nicor. ALJ Baker recommends entry
- 12 of an Order dismissing this docket without prejudice
- 13 for want of prosecution.
- 14 Is there any discussion?
- 15 (No response.)
- 16 Are there any objections?
- 17 (No response.)
- 18 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 19 Item G-2 is Docket Number 12-0300.
- 20 This is a petition by Integrys Energy Services
- 21 seeking a confidential and/or proprietary treatment
- 22 of its AGS compliance report. ALJ Baker recommends

- 1 entry of an Order granting the requested relief.
- 2 Is there any discussion?
- 3 (No response.)
- Are there any objections?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 7 Item G-3 is Docket Number 12-0395.
- 8 This is Palmco Energy's application for a certificate
- 9 to operate as an alternative gas supplier. ALJ Von
- 10 Qualen recommends entry of an Order granting the
- 11 certificate.
- 12 Is there any discussion?
- 13 (No objection.)
- 14 Are there any objections?
- 15 (No objection.)
- 16 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 17 Moving on to Telecommunications, Item
- 18 T-1 is Docket Number 12-0303. This is Orbitel's
- 19 application for a certificate of prepaid calling
- 20 service authority under Section 13-404 of the Public
- 21 Utilities Act. ALJ Riley recommends entry of an
- 22 Order granting the certificate.

1 Is there any discussion? 2 (No response.) 3 Are there any objections? 4 (No response.) 5 Hearing none, the Order is entered. Items T-2 through T-4 (12-0432, 6 12-0433, 12-0434) can be taken together. 7 These are petitions seeking modification of 9-1-1 services in 8 Lake County. In each case, ALJ Haynes recommends 9 10 entry of an Order granting the Petition. 11 Is there any discussion? 12 (No response.) 13 Any objections? 14 (No response.) 15 Hearing none, the Orders are entered. Items T-5 and T-6 (12-0393, 12-0360) 16 17 can be taken together. These are joint petitions seeking amendment for interconnection or traffic 18 19 termination agreement between telecommunications carriers. In each case, ALJ Baker recommends entry 20 21 of an Order approving amendment.

Is there any discussion?

1 (No response.) 2 Any objections? 3 (No response.) 4 Hearing none, the Orders are entered. Item T-7 concerns an issue in a 5 rulemaking proceeding for Title 83, Part 757, of the 6 Administrative Code regarding federal telephone 7 assistant program reform. Staff recommended an 8 initiating Order to begin the rulemaking proceeding. 9 10 Is there any discussion? 11 (No response.) 12 Is there any objections? 13 (No response.) 14 Item T-8 is Docket Number 11-0623. 15 This is a rulemaking proceeding for Title 83, Part 16 732, of the Administrative Code concerning its 17 customer credits issued by telecommunications carriers. ALJ Benn recommends entry of a Second 18 19 Notice Order authorizing submission of the proposed 20 amendments to JCAR. 21 Is there any discussion? 22 (No response.)

- 1 Are there any objections?
- 2 (No response.)
- 3 Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 4 Items T-9 and T-10 (12-0204, 12-0385)
- 5 can be taken together. These items are petitions for
- 6 the confidential and/or proprietary treatment of the
- 7 petitioner's Annual Reports. In each case, the ALJ
- 8 recommends entry of an Order granting the requested
- 9 protective treatment.
- 10 Is there any discussion?
- 11 (No response.)
- 12 Any objections?
- 13 (No response.)
- 14 Hearing none, the Orders are entered.
- On to Water and Sewer, Item Number W-1
- 16 is Docket Number 11-0436. This is the Aqua Illinois
- 17 rate case on rehearing, and we'll be holding it aside
- 18 for disposition at our August 21st Regular Open
- 19 Meeting. We do, however, have a few questions for
- 20 ALJ Jones. Is the Judge available?
- JUDGE JONES: Yes, sir.
- 22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Please come forward, sir.

- 1 Thank you, Judge. If you could maybe just set forth
- 2 by giving us an explanation of how you got to the
- 3 12 1/2 percent that you did in the decision.
- 4 JUDGE JONES: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. This is
- 5 Larry Jones.
- I guess the real challenge in coming
- 7 up with the appropriate rate increase in this
- 8 situation is in trying to strike that balance of
- 9 finding a rate that will give Viscofan the incentive
- 10 to stay connected to the Aqua Systems, while not
- 11 shifting any more of a revenue shortfall that occurs
- 12 from that as possible to the other customers. So the
- 13 12.5 is really the result of that effort.
- Just to explain it a little bit, I
- 15 guess, it is somewhere near the middle of the current
- 16 rate increase that was granted in the grade Order of
- 17 20 percent and the 4.9 percent that Viscofan has
- 18 recommended. It's also fairly close to the overall
- 19 increase that was granted to the division in which
- 20 Viscofan is a part. That is the consolidated
- 21 division that includes not only Danville, but the
- 22 rest of five other systems, and it's also somewhat

- 1 close to what Aqua recommended initially and is at
- 2 least in the range of some of the alternatives that
- 3 Staff was suggesting for consideration, although
- 4 Staff is recommending sticking with the 20 percent.
- 5 As the Commission is aware, Viscofan
- 6 did enter into a four-year contract with Aqua in
- 7 April, so that looms there. It does commit them to
- 8 purchasing at least most of their water from Aqua
- 9 over the next three, three and a half years or so.
- 10 So that comes into play a little bit, too, I suppose.
- I mean, at least it's hard to overlook that, and that
- 12 was essentially the thought process, for better or
- worse.
- 14 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Questions anybody?
- 15 Is there anything -- is there anything
- 16 in the record that you can point to? I was looking
- 17 myself. Is there anything in the record you can
- 18 point to that would say that at any particular rate,
- 19 Viscofan even, you know, commits long term to being
- 20 there? Because I understand the concern about not
- 21 ending up with shortfalls from claimed revenue that
- 22 isn't there and that ends up with the other

- 1 customers, but it didn't seem like there was anything
- 2 that was there that would say, oh, at this rate
- 3 Viscofan agrees to stay.
- 4 JUDGE JONES: Mr. Chairman, I think that's
- 5 true. Viscofan stopped just short of actually
- 6 committing to that rate. They say in various places
- 7 that they have determined that to be an economic
- 8 rate. They support the rate. They run their various
- 9 analyses and their process at the corporate level and
- 10 have determined that is within the range of the
- 11 acceptable payback periods that they use in their
- 12 corporate forecasting and decision making, but I
- 13 would say they have stopped short of actually totally
- 14 committing to stay on the system at that rate.
- 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Just two more quick questions.
- 16 Obviously, they entered into a contract with --
- 17 Viscofan entered into a contract with the company, so
- 18 there's nothing to prevent them from doing that -- no
- 19 matter what the rate is, nothing to prevent them from
- 20 being able to do that going forward beyond the three
- 21 and a half years.
- 22 JUDGE JONES: That is true. Neither Aqua nor

- 1 Viscofan supported the AG's proposal that this whole
- 2 thing essentially be handled through longer term
- 3 contracts, but they are certainly free to negotiate
- 4 additional contracts under the tariff which relies,
- 5 as you're aware, on the Commission-approved rate case
- 6 rate, or they could enter a negotiated rate under a
- 7 different section of Article 9 that is not limited to
- 8 four years.
- 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: And Aqua's position, just to
- 10 clarify, has been?
- 11 JUDGE JONES: The Aqua position is that the
- 12 rate needs to be set at a place that will give
- 13 Viscofan an incentive to stay on the system because
- 14 they do provide a lot of cost support for the rest of
- 15 the system that would be lost if they jumped the
- 16 system.
- 17 There are a lot of variable -- or
- 18 there are a lot of costs beyond variable costs that
- 19 do help pull down the rates of the remaining
- 20 customers, so Aqua has certainly made that point a
- 21 number of times, and then they -- in the original
- 22 case, they recommended a rate increase that was not

- 1 as low as what Aqua wanted but was lower than the
- 2 overall increase.
- 3 Lastly, Aqua has resisted the idea of
- 4 being directed to replace the existing contract with
- 5 the possibility of a new longer term contract under
- 6 the other section of the statute.
- 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Further questions?
- 8 Commissioner McCabe?
- 9 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Aqua supports Viscofan
- 10 over the long term, assuming the market share of cost
- 11 of service?
- 12 JUDGE JONES: Commissioner, Aqua supports
- 13 the -- a discounted rate that is not tied to cost of
- 14 service in the same way that Staff would like to tie
- 15 it to cost of service.
- 16 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Okay.
- 17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Further questions?
- 18 (No response.)
- 19 Thank you very much, Judge. I
- 20 appreciate it. Thank you.
- 21 As I said we will hold this item for
- 22 disposition at our August 21st Regular Open Meeting.

- 1 We have one Petition for Rehearing
- 2 before the Commission today. Item PR-1 is Docket
- 3 Number 10-0711. This is an eminent domain petition
- 4 filed by the Southern Illinois Power Cooperative in
- 5 connection construction of transition lines in Saline
- 6 and Williamson Counties. We have received the
- 7 petition for rehearing from Fredric and Connie
- 8 Beasley, as well as a motion seeking to stay the
- 9 Commission's Order in this matter. ALJ Albers
- 10 recommends denying both the request for the rehearing
- 11 and the request for a stay.
- 12 Is there any discussion?
- 13 (No response.)
- 14 Are there any objections to denying
- 15 the hearing and denying the motion for stay?
- 16 (No response.)
- 17 Hearing none, the petition for
- 18 rehearing is denied and the motion for stay is
- 19 denied.
- 20 We have two items of other business
- 21 for consideration today, and those items concern FERC
- 22 matters. We will address them in closed session.

1	Is there a motion to go into closed
2	session?
3	COMMISSIONER COLGAN: So moved.
4	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner Colgan.
5	Is there a second?
6	COMMISSIONER FORD: Second.
7	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Seconded by Commissioner Ford
8	All in favor say aye.
9	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
10	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
11	(No response.)
12	The vote is five to nothing and the
13	Commission will now go into closed session. Please
14	let me know when the room is ready in Chicago.
15	CHICAGO: Chicago's ready.
16	(Whereupon at this point
17	pages 24 - 50 of the
18	proceedings are
19	contained in a separate
20	closed transcript.)

- 6 COMMISSIONER FORD: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Seconded by Commissioner Ford.
- 8 It's been moved and seconded. All in favor, say aye.
- 9 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
- 10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
- 11 (No response.)
- The vote is five to nothing, and the
- 13 comments will be filed -- or the vote to support the
- 14 comments to be filed with FERC.
- Judge Wallace, are there any other
- 16 matters to come before the Commission today?
- 17 JUDGE WALLACE: I'm Judge Wallace. No, there's
- 18 not.
