ELPC-VS filed an objection to the 20 withdrawal on August 13, 2020, stating that it 21 would be imprudent not to complete this proceeding. 22 The order denies approval of

1 ComEd's proposed revisions of Rider POGCS. The 2 Commission finds that there is value in finishing 3 the docket. The order finds that some of the 4 proposed services could be beneficial to ratepayers 5 and community solar providers, but ComEd's proposal 6 provides insufficient details to evaluate proposed 7 services and charges. The order finds that, as 8 proposed, the revisions are not just and 9 reasonable. The Commission encourages parties to 10 continue discussions on the proposal to improve the 11 customer experience with community solar and 12 further the overall goal of the act to increase use 13 of renewable energy. 14 First, I'm going to call a vote on 15 ComEd's request to withdraw. If you are in favor 16 of denying the request to withdraw, please say 17 "Aye," and if you are opposed and you want to grant 18 it, please say "Nay." 19 Commissioner Bocanegra? 20 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Bocanegra. In its order on reopening, the Commission found that this proceeding should be reopened for the limited purpose of considering the recommendations of the final Kiefner report and to accommodate additional filings the Commission directed.

EDF/CUB and the Illinois Public

Interest Research Group submitted comments on some
of the recommendations and staff provided a staff
report commenting on sufficiency of the Peoples Gas
responses.

In this second order on reopening, the Commission directs Peoples Gas to implement the measures described in its response to the Kiefner's final report as modified by the staff recommendations contained in the staff report.

Peoples Gas agrees with, or supports the majority of the final Kiefner report's recommendation. The Commission finds that, subject to the additional recommendations offered by staff, Peoples Gas will

adequately implement the recommendations.

The Commission finds that the most significant of Kiefner's recommendations is that Peoples Gas replace all cast iron and ductile iron pipes by 2030, which is ten years earlier than the current target date of 2040, that Peoples Gas considers reasonably achievable. The Commission agrees with Peoples Gas, that accelerating the SMP by ten years, as suggested by Kiefner, would lead to additional problems and costs for ratepayers, potentially doubling their current \$300 million per year spending.

Meanwhile, the Commission urges

Peoples Gas to consider the EDF/CUB recommendation

for incorporating a system-wide advanced leak

detection using the result in Peoples Gas'

prioritization methodology. The Commission also

finds merit in Illinois PIRG's recommendation for

reporting on updates on implementation of the

recommendations of the Kiefner study.
