   months. Unfortunately, right now, we are still in

a crisis a year after this pandemic.

Shutoffs are slated to start as early as April 14. If there was a time to act right now, it would be as soon as possible, if not right now. The CDC Director, Rochelle Walensky has signed an extension to the eviction moratorium now through June 30 because "Keeping people in their homes and out of congregate settings is a key step in helping to stop the spread of COVID-19."

Recent cases of COVID-19, here in the state of Illinois -- yesterday it was over 3,000, specifically 3,930. April 7, it was 3,693, and April 6, it was 2,964, and April 5, it was over 2300. And this is about the same number of COVID cases there was the first week of last October, where the numbers kept rising throughout the month and into November and Illinois was, eventually, the leading number of COVID cases during that time, throughout the nation.

And keep in mind, this is the B117 variant of the COVID-19 virus.

On March 25, the Attorney General,

1 Kwame Raoul, said that utility costs had become 2 unsustainable for many Illinois households, 3 particularly as individuals, as families continue 4 to struggle due to the COVID -- financial impacts 5 of the COVID-19 pandemic. He said that over 6 800,000 ratepayers, I repeat, 800,000 ratepayers, 7 have utility -- and are potentially subject to 8 having their services cut off. And keep in mind, 9 in the U.S. census, Illinois households average 2.5 10 persons. 11 So this is possibly, at least, 1.5 12 million people who are facing having their 13 utilities cut off, such things such as water. And 14 unfortunately, these are -- a disproportionate 15 number of these households are located in 16 predominantly minority communities. According to the economic research, the National Bureau of 17 18 Economic Research, customers in black and Hispanic 19 ZIP Codes are four times more likely to be 20 disconnected for nonpayment. 21 This past Monday, the City of 22 Urbana unanimously passed a resolution declaring

getting shut off and work out a deferred payment arrangement with the entity, you will not be shut off for service. Also, by engaging with your utility, you can check to see if you qualify for a bill payment assistance to reduce arrearages and receive help with entering into an extended deferred payment arrangement. These are extra consumer protections laid out in the stipulated agreement, acknowledging that people are still struggling during this time. The most important thing to do is to call before being disconnected.

I'd like to mention a couple of other resources currently available to customers at this time. The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity partnership with Governor Pritzker is offering the Help Illinois Families initiative, providing home energy assistance relief to eligible Illinoisans through the month of May.
