1 Good morning. Under CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: 2 the Open Meetings Act and in accordance with the 3 Governor's Executive Orders, I call the April 1, 4 2021, Regular Open Meeting to order. Before we 5 proceed, for the clarity of the record, I would ask 6 everyone to state their name and to speak slowly 7 and clearly so that the court reporter can capture 8 everything that is said. 9 All four commissioners are on and 10 so we have a quorum. 11 First, moving on to our 12 Transportation Agenda. 13 There are no edits to the March 4, 14 2021, Transportation Regular Open Meeting Minutes. 15 Are there any objections to approving the minutes? 16 (No verbal response.) 17 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 18 minutes are approved. 19 Under our Railroad Items, Items 20 RR-1 through our RR-5 concern public safety improvement projects at railway crossings. 21 22 orders approve the projects, extend the project

1 deadlines and approve cost apportionment. Are 2 there any objections to considering these items 3 together and approving the orders? 4 (No verbal response.) 5 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 6 orders are approved. 7 Item RR-6 concerns a complaint 8 filed by Norfolk Southern Railway Company, alleging 9 that NewWave installed cable television facilities 10 under NS track at a roadway track crossing without 11 authority and contrary to the statutorily required 12 procedure. The parties filed a motion to dismiss 13 pursuant to a settlement agreement. The motion to 14 dismiss asserts that all issues have been fully 15 settled and that case should be dismissed with 16 prejudice. The order grants the motion to dismiss. 17 Are there any objections to approving the order? 18 (No verbal response.) 19 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 20 order is approved. 21 Item RR-7 concerns an application 22 for determination that applicant's proposed

1 installation will not present a dangerous condition 2 or interrupt service. The applicant filed a motion 3 to dismiss, asserting that all matters between the 4 applicant and Union Pacific have been resolved, the 5 order grants the motion to dismiss. Are there any 6 objections to approving the order? 7 (No verbal response.) 8 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 9 order is approved. 10 Under our Motor Carrier Items, 11 Items MC-1 through MC-3 concern applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity. 12 13 The orders grant temporary one-year household 14 goods, property, motor carrier certificates, 15 finding that the Applicants meet the requirements. 16 Are there any objections to considering these items 17 together and approving the orders? 18 (No verbal response.) 19 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 20 orders are approved. 21 Items MC-4 through MC-6 concern 22 applications for renewal of commercial vehicle

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relocator's licenses. The orders grant the
applications, finding that the Applicants meet the
requirements. Are there any objections to
considering these items together and approving the
orders?

CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are approved.

Under Administrative Matters, Item AM-1 concerns the 2022 through 2026 Crossing Safety Improvement Program, a five-year plan that will be submitted to the governor and the general assembly upon the Commission's approval. The report represents the rail safety section recommended list of highway, rail safety capital improvement projects for the Commission's 2022 through 2026 The Staff now submitted an Amended Appendix plan. 2 to the plan that corrects the table to add the projects that were inadvertently omitted from the plan when submitted by Staff at the March 18th Bench Session. Are there any objections to approving the Amended Appendix 2 of the plan?
