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1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Under the Open
2 Meetings Act, I call the July 2nd, 2024 Regular Open
3 Meeting to order. Commissioners Carrigan, McCabe,
4 Reddick and Paradis are with me in Chicago. We have a
5 quorum.

6 We have no Requests to Speak today.

7 We will start today's meeting with the
8 Transportation agenda.

9 (Whereupon the Transportation Agenda
10 was held.)

11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moving on to our Public
12 Utilities Agenda.

13 Items E-1 and E-2 concern Petitions from
14 Ameren requesting a waiver or a determination of no
15 liability for outages, surges, and or fluctuations
16 occurring from a series of storms on June 29, 2023.
17 Commission Staff recommends granting the petitions and
18 the Orders grant the Petitions.

19 Are there any objections to considering
20 these items together and approving the Orders?

21 (No verbal responses.)

22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the

1 Orders are approved.

2 Item E-3 concerns an application for a
3 license to operate as a Retail Electric agent, broker
4 and consultant in Illinois. The Order grants the
5 license, finding that the applicant meets the
6 requirements.

7 Are there any objections to approving
8 the Order?

9 (No verbal responses.)

10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
11 is approved.

12 Items E-4 through E-7 concern
13 applications for Certification to install distributed
14 generation facilities in Illinois. The Orders grant
15 the Certificates, finding that the applicants meet the
16 requirements.

17 Are there any objections to considering
18 these items together and approving the Orders?

20 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders
21 are approved.

22 Items E-8 and E-9 concern applications

1 for Certificates of Service Authority to Install,
2 Maintain and Repair Electric Vehicle Charging Stations.
3 The Orders grant the certificates, finding that the
4 applicants meet the requirements.

5 Are there any objections to considering
6 these items together and approving the Orders?

8 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the
9 Orders are approved.

10 Item E-10 concerns a request for
11 proprietary treatment of information in the
12 Petitioner's annual report. The Order grants the
13 protection, finding that the information is highly
14 proprietary and confidential.

18 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
19 is approved.

20 Item E-11 concerns a petition to cancel
21 a Certificate to operate as an alternative retail
22 electric supplier. The Order grants the petition to

1 cancel the certificate.

5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
6 is approved.

7 Items E-12 through E-18 concern
8 petitions to cancel certificates of service authority
9 to install energy efficiency measures. The Orders
10 grant the petitions and cancel the certificates.

11 Are there any objections to considering
12 these items together and approving the Orders?

13 (No verbal responses.)

14 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the
15 Orders are approved.

16 Items E-19 through E-30 concern
17 applications for Certifications to install Energy
18 Efficiency Measures in Illinois. The Orders grant
19 their certificates, finding that the applicants meet
20 the requirements.

21 Are there any objections to considering
22 these items together and approving the Orders?

2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the
3 Orders are approved.

4 Moving on to Gas items. Item G-1
5 concerns a complaint against Peoples Gas in Chicago
6 regarding billing charges. The Order dismisses the
7 complaint without prejudice for Want of Prosecution,
8 finding that the complainant does not appear to be
9 pursuing the Complaint at this time.

14 is approved.

15 Item G-2 concerns an application for a
16 certificate of Service Authority to operate as an
17 alternative gas supplier in Illinois. The Order grants

19 requirements.

1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
2 is approved.

3 Item G-3 concerns a petition to cancel a
4 certificate of service authority to operate as an
5 alternative gas supplier in Illinois. The Order grants
6 the Petition and cancels the certificate, finding that
7 the petitioner has no current customers in Illinois and
8 is not accepting any new customers.

12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
13 is approved.

14 Moving on to our Telecommunications
15 items. Item T-1 concerns an application for local and
16 interexchange authority to operate as a reseller of
17 telecommunications services. The Order grants the
18 certificate.

22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order

1 is approved.

2 Item T-2 concerns an application for
3 designation to receive rural Digital Opportunity Fund
4 Support. The Order grants the application, subject to
5 additional commitments and requirements requested by
6 Commission Staff as described in the Order.

10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
11 is approved.

12 Item T-3 concerns an application for a
13 certificate of service authority to operate as a
14 reseller of telecommunications service in Illinois.
15 The Order grants the certificate.

17 the Order?

18 (No verbal responses.)

19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order
20 is approved.

21 Moving on to other business. Items O-1
22 and O-2 concern approval of Batches, Contracts, and

1 Confirmations under the Illinois Adjustable Block
2 Program and Solar For All Program. Are there any
3 objections to considering these items together and
4 approving the program administrator submissions?

5 (No verbal responses.)

6 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the
7 Submissions are approved. This concludes our agenda.
