## Homeowner Program Statistics as of December 31st, 2013

- 130,056 homeowners had their benefits calculated, 130,032 (99.98%) have closed on their Road Home grant with disbursements totaling \$8,996,014,979. The average award is \$69,183;
- 119,312 (92%) of these homeowners have decided to stay and rebuild in Louisiana. Rebuilding resources provided to Option 1 homeowners total \$8,079,883,592. The average award is \$67,721;
- 66,973 additional disbursements have been closed for a total of \$1,272,136,142. The average additional disbursement is \$18,995;
- 56,005 (54%) of all Road Home dollars (\$4,862,681,314) has been provided to low to moderate income households. The average award is \$86,826;
- 46,129 homeowners have received \$2,122,869,041 in Additional Compensation Grant (ACG) to supplement their recovery needs;
