THE WITNESS: Garcia.


THE MASTER: That that disanneared and a lot of other things disanneared when the uncle died.

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A This is a part of the information I had.

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Q And did you also use part of the input of the 151 through 157 checks as part of the input I

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furnished you?

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A Yes, sir.

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O And in addition, did you use part of the input of E-69, that series, that is, picking out of that series the checks and E-75, 76, 82 and 65,

Let me hand those to you, 151, 2, 3 --

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A Yes, sir.

those checks?

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Now, let me ask you, please, Judge Carrillo, using that information, that is, the data referred to

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which is not exclusive, I noticed you divided un your income columns. The Duval County and Benavides Independent School District and Duval County is the R-91 Fyhibit?

- A Yes, sir.
- Q And Benavides Independent School District is R-9??
- A Yes, sir.
- Q And the water district is R-93?
- A Yes.
- O And maid O. P. would be the reference on the checks that testimony shows were maid to you under various circumstances?
- A Yes.
- Q That column, maid O. P., the one thousand eight and so forth, those items are referred to in the 151 series or 69 series?
- A Yes, sir.
- O Now, Judge Carrillo, your Exhibit, for example, in 1971, reflects payments of seven thousand two hundred fourteen dollars out of a total of money received through Benavides Implement and Hardware of ninety-five thousand seven hundred forty-five dollars.
- A I think you said seventy-two hundred, would you check that?

Seven thousand two hundred fourteen. Q That is in the column paid to me by Mr. Couling. H 

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1	Q	All right, sir. Now, in '72, the summary of your
2		work shows a grand total of income
3		MR. ODAM: Your Honor, if I might, is
4		this going to be offered into evidence? If
5		it is, I am going to have an objection. If
6		it's not, I will not have an objection.
7		THE MASTER: That is a proper objection.
8		MR. MITCHELL: Well, let me see.
9		THE MASTER: It is sustained.
10		MR. MITCHELL: Let me see if I have any
11		further predicate questions.
12	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) The information that appears on
13		100, Judge Carrillo, tell us, please, is any of
14		that information made up above and beyond the
15		exhibits that were given to you as input into it?
16	A	All of the information that is in R-100, it comes
17		out of exhibits that are already in evidence here
18		in this (ase.
19	Q	All right. Now, let me come on down. Look at
20		Page 2 of the exhibit.
21	A	Yes, sir.
22	Q	The bottom paragraph.
23	A	Yes, sir.
24	Q	Those totals, let me ask you, where did you get
25		the figures for those totals? Are those based on

1		the preceding material?
2	A	Yes, sir, with an adding machine tape I added all
3		of that from the figures in R-91, R-92 and R-93,
4		plus the checks that are in evidence that have
5		been paid me by Rudolfo M. Couling, plus the
6		checks I have paid Benavides Implement and
7		Hardware in the years covered, and I added them up
8		and subtracted and got this.
9	Q	There is no new input into that last paragraph,
10		is there, Judge Carrillo, that does not appear
11		somewhere in the document?
12	A	None whatsoever.
13	Q	So, line for line, column for column, the data
14	H	that is in R-100 is taken from the exhibits that
15		have been previously referred to?
16	A	Yes, sir.
17	Q	Now, I notice in '73, the checks paid by you to
18	!	Benavides Implement and Hardware, those checks
19		are in evidence, aren't they?
20	A	Yes.
21		MR. MITCHELL: Your Honor, I need to get
22		a reference from those for someone reading
23		the record.
24		THE MASTER: Sure.
25	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) Judge, I hand you R-58-1 series

1		and ask you if that is the source of the data that
2		is included in the column O. P. paid Benavides
3		Implement for 1973?
4	A	Yes, sir, that is exactly. R-58-1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6,
5		7, 8, 9, 10 and 11.
6	- Q	All right. And you prepared R-100 then directly,
7		or it was prepared under your supervision?
8	A	Yes, sir.
9	Q	And the total, the grand total figures I will ask
10		you, where they were secured, just mechanical

12	A	Just by the adding machine tapes.
13		MR. MITCHELL: I offer R-100, then,
14		Judge. It's offered for the following

16		impeachment of Rudolfo M. Couling's testimony

19		nickel and dime store that was a product of

21		MR. ODAM: Your Honor, I object to that.

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to get a few dollars or this total here for

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Judge O. P. Carrillo. It was set up along the lines of what is suggested by the Court; however, that testimony of which the Court referred to as a silent partnership with Judge Carrillo has been excluded. What I am saying is that the testimony in this record thus far was not intended nor does it indicate that the store was set up simply for the purpose of getting this total amount of money just for O. P. Carrillo and I think that such a statement of a nickel and dime operation is contrary to what the testimony has been in this case.

THE MASTER: Well, I will accept that.

Certainly, though, it was Mr. Couling's

testimony that at first the store wasn't

opened very often, just sort of on weekends

and when somebody wanted something --

MR. ODAM: That's right, sir. This started in 1971 when Ramiro Carrillo came to him and approached him to open the store for these purposes and then it became more operational for more purposes such as we go into here.

MR. MITCHELL: Judge, Your Honor, I am

1 sorry. I am not acquainted with Mr. Odam'3 2 objection. 1 stated it for the relevancy 3 and for the offering, and if that is going to cause a problem. I will withdraw it and let 5 the Court make its own conclusion. I don't have --I think that will be fine. 7 MR. ODAM: 8 MR. 13		the adding machine tape adding them up and another
14		one putting them on the form that we had.
15	Q	Would Jose Saenz be the one that prepared your work
16		papers for your income tax returns?
17	A	No, sir, my income tax returns are prepared by
18		Mr. Kirkland.
19	Q	Work papers, you didn't remember who prepared the
20		work papers? Was that Mr. Saenz who prepared
21		your work papers?
22	À	For my income tax, it would be prepared in my
23		office.
24		MR. MITCHELL: I thought it was voir
25		dire on R-100. He is talking about work
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1	papers on income tax returns.
2	MR. ODAM: I am trying to identify who
3	Mr. Jose Saenz is.
4	MR. MITCHELL: He is the one that
5	introduced the work papers. He is intending
6	to impeach 182-1 and 183-A, Judge.
7	MR. ODAM: I have a statement I asked
8	at that time, and that is who
9	THE MASTER: The question simply is:
10	Is Mr. Saenz the same man who prepared the
11	work papers that were furnished to Mr. Kirkland?
12	A Part of the papers, the work papers were furnished
13	were fixed up by me. Part by Mr. Saenz and partly
14	by Mrs. Zenaida Montemayor, who was my secretary.
15	Q Now, Judge Carrillo
16	MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Judge. I
17	believe the record also reflects that part of

19	A	Oh, I am sorry. I had the wrong
20		Ail right. That is May of 1971.
21		All right. For May of 1971
22	Q	You mean April of '71?
23	A	I am sorry. April of '71, I added three hundred
24		dollars, two hundred and fifty-four dollars and
25		seventy-live cents, one thousand dollars, one

ı thousand eighty-five dollars and one cent, seven 2 hundred and twenty dollars, five hundred and forty 3 dollars, three hundred and sixteen dollars and twenty cents, and I totaled them up and came out to four thousand, two hundred and fifteen dollars 5 and ninety-six cents. 6 THE MASTER: Now, you're still on May. 7 8 He is asking about April. Q No, sir, the first one is April of '71. 9 10 A All right, in April. Then, we go to the two thousand five hundred and twenty-one dollars and 11 twenty-seven cents. 12 13 Q Yes, sir. Α Now, we took three hundred and eight 14 All right. dollars, one thousand and eight dollars, nine 15 hundred and fourteen dollars and forty-sever cents, 16 two hundred and ninety dollars and eighty cents, 17 and that came up to the figure of two thousand 18 five hundred and twenty-one dollars and twenty-19 seven cents. 20 0 And I would take it then that the B.I.S.D., the 21 second column over, for April of '71, the two 22 thousand three hundred and forty-six dollars and

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1	Q	that would be from R-91 or R-92. I guess it
2		would be R-92 on that particular
3	A	Yes, sir in 4-5-71, for example, we have one
4		thousand seventy-four dollars and forty-eight
5		cents, six hundred and forty-four dollars and
6		twenty cents, and six hundred and twenty-seven
7		dollars and ninety cents for a total of two
8		thousand three hundred and forty-six dollars and
9		fifty-eight cents.
10	Q	Now, with these R-91, 92 and 93, these total
11	 	payments, would they be were these amounts of
12		money that you just referred to that you got from
13		91, 92 and 93; were they deposited in a bank
14		account and, if so, which bank account?
15		MR. MITCHELL: Now, Judge, just a minute.
16		I understood he had him on voir dire. That
17	}	is not legitimate voir dire. He is recrossing
18		him. He will have an opportunity to take
19		him all over the place.
20		MR. ODAM: Your Honor, the purpose of
21		my objection
22		MR. MITCHELL: I might add, Judge
23		Meyers, this is the exhibit the Court asked
24		we prepare over the weekend.
25	ľ	THE MASTER: I understand.

MR. MITCHELL: I would suggest if he has some legitimate voir dire, but he has gone beyond the voir dire and he wants to know the quality of the reflection of the exhibit, and that's not a part of voir dire and we object.

THE MASTER: Mr. Odam, what is the nature of the objection you're attempting to develop by voir dire?

MR. ODAM: Your Honor, the nature of the objection is this: That I would attempt to show that the statements that are on here with respect to Duval County, B.I.S.D., water district and total and the amounts of money paid into Judge O. P. Carrillo and the O. P. paid Benavides Implement and Hardware, they confuse two different bank accounts, and taken by itself would tend to confuse the evidence in the case by the mere offer and the admission of this piece of evidence.

For example, the Duval County, the B.I.S.D. and the water district were taken from those two. They were monies deposited apparently, I would take it, into the San Diego account.

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1	THE MASTER: All right. Now, you're
2	certainly welcome to that.
3	MR. ODAM: Well, that is what I was
4	beginning to do.
5	THE MASTER: I thought your last question,
6	though, had to do
7	MR. ODAM: I asked him that. From what
8	source
9	MR. MITCHELL: If that is a defect, T
10	thirk it's in his own exhibit furnished to
11	me by the Exhibits 91, 92 and 93.
12	MR. ODAM: Your Honor, it's not my
13	exhibits.
14	MR. MITCHELL: That is where I got it
15	from, 91, 92 and 93.
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THE MASTER: I will let you develop that, although I am not sure that goes except as to the weight.

You may proceed, Mr. Odam.

MR. ODAM: Your Honor, if I might pro-

- Q (By Mr. Odam:) Take the first one, for example,
  Judge Carrillo, where it says Duval County. Is
  that a total amount of money that goes into the
  San Diego account or the Rio Grande City account
  or both accounts?
- A I took that from R-91 to R-93, which you furnished us at our request. We presume that the work of the Attorney General was correct.
- O My question was, did that amount of money from 91, 92 and 93, is that the amount of money that is intended to be from Duval County to the San Diego or Rio Grande City bank?

MR. MITCHELL: We object. It is not a legitimate woir dire.

If that is where they got the data, then we would like to know if that is where the data came from, we don't know.

THE MASTER: Well, let's let the witness answer that question rather than you, Mr.

Mitchell.

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THE WITNESS: I don't know which bank accounts he deposited these checks in and I didn't know he received these checks as well.

- So the amount of money you indicated for April, 1971, was totaling up what was on those three Exhibits?
- That is right.
- And that night have been in San Diego or part of it in Rio Grande City?
- Or in Mexico. Α
- Or in Camada or wherever.
- Yes, that is right.

MR. MITCHELL: And it doesn't include general public income from sales.

- O And I take it that would be the same testimony with respect to Benavides Independent School District, that is not anything except the total amount of the money you got from R-91, 92 and 93?
- Correct.
  - And the paid O. P. Carrillo account, the one thousand and eight dollars, what bank account was that?
- Those are the checks that you have introduced in Α evidence here in this hearing as monies R. M. Couling paid me.

1 What bank account was that one thousand and eight 0 2 dollars? 3 It is an Eyhibit that is here in evidence and I have those with me, both as to the ones that were 5 naid to me and both as to the ones I naid Mr. 6 Couling and I have the actual Exhibits and copies 7 I had those except as they appear here. 8 And the O. P. naid out account, is that money 0 9 deposited in Rio Grande City account or the San 10 Diego account? 11 I don't know where he denosited them. 12 checks I raid to Rudolfo Couling and, again, I had 13 the copies before me. And the total naid on the second page, 1971 through 14 . 0 15 1975 by the district, I take it that was simply 16 from R-91 through 93? Yes, the total of three hundred seventy thousand 17 18 three hundred eighty-two dollars twenty-three cents 19 comes from adding the Duval County column and the 20 Benavides Independent School District column and 21 the water district column, or that is the three 22 totals of the year 1971, 72 and 73. 23 Ther the twenty thousand seven hundred for y-24 four dollars ten cents is a total that O. P.

Carrillo paid Benavides Implement and Hardware

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1	for the total of three hundred ninety-one thousand
2	one hundred twenty-six dollars thirty-three cents,
3	then the 'otal Benavides Implement and Hardware
4	naid O, P column comes from the column which is
5	stated as such, adding all of the checks paid to
6	me and including the ones paid directly to the
7.	Rio Grand - City bank for five thousand seven
8	hundred thenty-five dollars thirty-four cents, and
9	that total is twelve thousand nine hundred thirty-
10	nine dollars sixty-eight cents.
11	Q The total Benavides Implement paid to O. P.
12	Carrillo, is that a total amount of money Benavides
13	Implement and Hardware has ever paid you?
14	A I don't know, I understand you have some more
15	checks which I have not seen.
16	O Well, the total O. P. maid Benavides Implement
17	and Hardware, do you know what bank account that
18	was denosited in?
19	A No, str.
20	O That was a total of the Exhibits?
21	A Ye, sir, and didn't reflect the bank account.
22	MR. ODAM: Your Honor, my objection to
23	the introduction of R-100 would be in this
24	form.

Mr. Mitchell has asked the witness how

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1 it was prepared and he referred to certain 2 Exhibits. Those stand as they are and don't 3 necessitate the admission of R-100. My objection would be to the introduc-5 tion into evidence R-100 as not a -- would 6 tend to confuse the understanding of the 7 evidence that is in evidence by way of the 8 Exhibits themselves. 9 If I could explain that, you take the 10 first entry, four seventy-one, by Benavides 11 Independent School District and the water 12 district --13 14

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MR. MITCHELL: Is this argument of law or is he summarizing his objection or what. If it is an argument of law I would like to have the right to respond.

THE MASTER: You have the right to respond but I think this is an objection and in support of that he is trying to explain it.

MR. MITCHELL: All right.

MR. ODAM: The totals of R-91, 92 and 93. were taken in the first column and I have no reason to believe that the adding machine tapes don't come up with those totals.

When we get over to the other columns,

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1	paid O. P. Carrillo, it confuses the bank
2	accounts. Where we have maid Benavides
3	Implement and Hardware, the information is
4	that money was deposited in one account.
5	Some of the others were in both.
6	To look at this as a total, as I first
7	did, I presume this was dealing with one
8	bank account. Going back and reading the
9	record, the reference was made as to how
10	much was from R-89, and the question was on
11	that amount and the record will speak for
12	itself, but R-89 refers to the San Diego
13	account.
14	I think to introduce this into evidence
15	is going to confuse the record as to the
16	checks purpose and what they are.
17	That would be my objection and that would
18	be confusing the status of the evidence thus
19	far and the evidence can stand by itself.
20	This would jumble the record.
21	THE MASTER: Mr. Mitchell, do you want
22	to maly?
23	MR. MITCHELL: I am incredulous. R-91.
1	The state of the s

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92 and 93 are their Exhibits. The checks

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1 confusing, they have done the confusing. 2 THE MASTER: As I understand it, you 3 don't offer this or suggest that this represents one bank account? MR. MITCHELL: No. 6 THE MASTER: Or you are suggesting that 7 it represents --8 MR. MITCHELL: The status of the record 9 as of this point is what it would represent. 10 THE MASTER: Well, the activity of 11 Benavides Implement and Hardware, irrespective 12 of the bank accounts. 13 MR MITCHELL: Right. 14 THE MASTER: And irrespective of private 15 sales. 16 MR. MITCHELL: Right, and we are going 17 to show further, when we get to R-101, 2 and 18 3, that he didn't report this. 19 I offer them further, Judge Meyers, to 20 show that his testimony was that he and 21 O. P. ripped off the county to pay for the 22 dozers and ripped off enough to give O. P. 23 Carrillo some money as well. These are 24 Exhibits that are in April of 1971, for

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example, and he took in ten thousand dollars

1 and he paid O. 17	}	and don't have an extra copy for the Master
18		to look at, but I would fike to have the Court
19		to do we have an extra cony?
20	}	THE MASTER: 102 is the 73 return.
21		MR. MITCHELL: Yes, and 103 would be
22	]	the 74 return.
23	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell:) Let me hand you, Judge Carrillo
24		Mr. Couling's return for 197°,
25	}	MR ODAM. I believe Mr. Mitchell said

1 he is offering these car returns and this 2 witness cannot authenticate these tay returns. 3 I would stimulate Mr. Couling drove over from San Diego and brought these to me and I 5 turned then over to Mr. Mitchell last Priday. As far as an offer by this witness of 11 7 these tay returns, an examination of this witness by way of these tax returns --9 MR. MITCHELL: I am a little hard but 10 to understand that. I am not trying to 11 authenticate these returns through this 12 witness. I am a better lawyer than that, 13 Counsel takes the rourns from Mr. Couling and runs the witness off and then hands them 14 to me and says these are his returns. 15 THE MASTER: He is recognizing that 16 17 these are the income tax returns produced 18 by Mr. Couling pursuant to a submoena. 19 MR. ODAM: That is correct. 20 He is simply objecting to THE MASTER: 21 your asking this witness questions about 22 these returns, since this witness really 23 knows nothing about them and the returns, I suppose, speak for themselves.

Is that what you are saying, Mr. Odam?

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MR. ODAM: Yes, Your Honor.

MR. MITCHELL: Well, that is true, Judge, there is no question about that, the return does speak for itself.

Where is Mr. Couling and I will put him I wanted to point out one item on that 73 return and then I won't ask him any more questions and then I want Mr. Couling here to ask him in detail about them.

THE MASTER: You may point out to the Court or Master anything you wish to with respect to this Exhibit which has been offered and has 102 been offered as well?

MR. MITCHELL: 101, 102 and 103 are offered as the 72, 73 and 74 returns.

THE MASTER: Respondent's Exhibits 101, 102 and 103 are admitted.

MR. MITCHELL: I suppose Mr. Couling is here, because I don't recall him being excused by the Court. I assume he is here, because I am going to call him and ask him questions.

(By Mr. Mitchell:) Judge Carrillo, I will ask you one auestion.

> You can just say will you THE MASTER:

1 take notice of. 2 Judge Carrillo, will you look at the schedule C 3 of the 1973 return, will you take notice of that? Yes, sir. 5 Rental income, how much was that? 6 Thirty-two thousand six hundred thirty dollars 7 fifteen cents. 8 All right. 9 MR. MITCHELL: And of course, I know the Court recalls the testimony of our 10 11 expert and the distinction between that and 12 the 1065 return. I would like to have Mr. 13 Couling back, however, I don't see him back 14 this morning. THE MASTER: Well, Mr. Odam, obviously 15 16 Mr. Couling has to be here. 17 MR. ODAM: He is here, Your Honor. Does Mr. Mitchell want to out him on the stand now? THE MASTER: No, I don't know what Mr. 19 20 Mitchell wants, but I want to finish with 21 Judge Carrillo before we take another witness, 22 however. 23 MR. MITCHELL: Thank you, Judge Meyers. (By Mr. Mitchell:) Judge Carrillo, your testimony 24 in connection with R-100 was that you had paid the 25

1 sums appearing in 1973, that is R-100, and you 2 paid those amounts of money to Mr. Couling for 3 rent on the bulldozers? Yes. 5 And I believe I gave you E-160? 6 Yes. 7 And that Schedule C thirty-two thousand plus 8 rental shows rental income Mr. Couling reported 9 on rental? 10 Yes. 11 Q And you recall his testimony that he had no other 12 equipment? 13 Yes. 14 And on those returns, they are R-100, 101, 102 and 103, and other pieces of equipment are shown as 16 we11? 17 Yes. 18 We will distin him at a later time on that. 19 All right, 20 Let me ask you this, please. 21 Do you know of your own knowledge what bank 22 account Mr. Couling was using, Judge Carrillo, for 23 the depos ts of your money or any of this money 24 from Duval County? 25

No, sir, I do not.

1	Q	On voir dire, Mr. Odam asked you on several
2		occasions if you were attempting to characterize
3		the bank deposits, were you doing that?
4	A	I was rot.
5	0	Will you please take R-100 and put it in front
6		of you.
7	A	All right.
8		MR. MITCHELL: Well, I want the Court
9		to use that,
10		THE MASTER: Mr. Mitchell, you addressed
11		a question to Judge Carrillo on rent on two
12		bulldozers. That, of course, on this R-102
13		was rent baid out, not rent received.
14		MR. MITCHELL: No, that is a Schedule C
15		of income coming in.
16		THE MASTER: No, sir, it says deductions.
17		The rent on bulldozers is a deduction, as I
18		read the return.
19		MR. MITCHELL: You are right, that would
20		be payments made to Plains Machinery. I
21		suppose if he paid them or made them
22		THE MASTER: Well, according to his
23		return, it is mayments not received by Mr.
24		Couling, but naid out by Mr. Couling.
25		MR. MITCHELL: And used as a deduction?

THE MASTER: Yes, sir. (By Mr. Mitchell:) In light of the Court's obser-vation, that thirty-two thousand six hundred thirty dollar figure comes under the deduction category, is that correct, Judge Carrillo? Yes. 

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1	Q	We don't know whether or not he included that in
2		one hundred and twenty-nine thousand six hundred
3		figure, the amount of money you paid him for rent
4		in 1973, do we?
5	A	No.
6	Q	Will you look at R-100, and I am going to get at
7		this in a minute and look for a '73 income from
8		Duval County, B.I.S.D. and water district, how
9		much income does he have, total income?
10	A	For 1971?
11	Q	No. No, you're not listening, '73, Judge Carrillo.
12	A	73. Nigety-two thousand, two hundred and
13		ninety-three dollars and forty-nine cents.
14	Q	And that figure comes off of R-100, does it not,
15		Judge Carrillo?
16	A	Yes, sir.
17	Q	As a total income from those three entities?
18	A	Yes, sir.
19	Q	On his Schedule C in R-102, he shows a one hundred
20		and twenty-nine thousand six o nine eighty-nine,
21	<b>\</b>	am I correct?
22	A	Yes, sir.
23	Q	And if you add the amount of money you paid him,
24		which was sixteen thousand nine, what does that
25		come to? That doesn't quite make the one twenty-nir

1	1	six o nine, am I correct?
2	A	I need the adding machine again.
3	Q	At any rate, the Court can make that calculation.
4		I would ask you, if you would, look at '72 profit
5		and loss.
6		Now, I am looking at 101. What is the figure
7		for gross sales from those three entities for 1972
8	A	A hundred and twenty-eight thousand four hundred
9		and sixty dollars and ten cents.
10		MR. MITCHELL: Did I confuse the Court?
11		On '72, Judge, the gross figure.
12	Q	And if his tax
13		THE MASTER: His gross figure was not
14		what that reflects.
15		MR. MITCHELL: That's right. Precisely.
16		THE MASTER: Oh, I see.
17	Q	If you compare the gross figure one hundred that
18		is made from R-91, 92 and 93 and that reported
19	}	to Uncle Sam, he is shy, how much?
20	A	He is shy approximately twenty thousand dollars.
21	Q	Assuming he didn't do a dime's worth of income
22		from any other entity other than these three
23	  -	districts?
24	A	That's right.
25		MR. ODAM: I am sorry. Counsel, what

were you making a comparison of? You lost me. 1 THE MASTER: He was comparing, and I got 2 lost, also, the gross figure for the profit 3 and loss from business or profession schedule in the 1972 return to the grand total 5 figure from Duval County, Benavides Independent 6 School District and water district shown on 7 Exhibit No. R-100. 8 MR. ODAM: That was comparing the one 9 hundred twenty-eight thousand on R-100 with 10 what? 11 MR. MITCHELL: Schedule C, gross income. 12 THE MASTER: With a hundred and nine on Schedule C. 14 MR. ODAM: All right, sir. 15 MR. MITCHELL: I am going to do the same 16 thing, if it please the Court, on 1974. 17 0 (By Mr. Mitchell) Judge, I am going to take from 18 R-100, the income from 1974, which is on the second 19 page, which is how much gross income from those 20 three entities, Judge Carrillo? 21 Α 1974 is forty-seven thousand three hundred and 22 twenty-seven dollars. 23 Q Now, on his Schedule C for 1974, he reports forty-24 nine thousand six hundred and sixty-six, am I

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1		correct?
2	A	Yes, sir.
3	Q	Showing that it's two thousand roughly seventeen
4	l	hundred dollars worth of business outside of
5		Duval County, Benavides Independent School District
6		and the water district for '74, am I correct?
7	A	Yes.
8	Q	Of course, we don't know what the figure would be
9		for '71 because we don't have his tax return, but
10		according to R-100, which is a derivation or a
11		chart made from 91, 92 and 93, he did ninety-five
12		thousand seven hundred and forty-five dollars and
13		thirty cents worth of business with those three
14		entities?
15	A	Yes, sir, according to R-100.
16	Q	But we do know from his testimony that he had
17		roughly a seventy thousand dollar deficiency in
18		his tax bill?
19	A	Yes.
20	Q	Now, as Judge Meyers pointed out on that '73 return
21		the figure there of the rent on the dozer appears
22		to have been on this Schedule C a deduction
23		against the gross income realized from the
24		operation, profit and loss of a business, does it
25		not?

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1	A	Yes, sir.
2	Q	So, apparently with the federal government, at
3	İ	any rate, he took a deduction of roughly thirty-
4		two thousand dollars rent that he paid on the two
5		dozers?
6	A	Yes, sir.
7		MR. MITCHELL: May I have one second,
8		Judge Meyers, to I believe I am about
9		finished.
10		THE MASTER: Yes.
11		MR. MITCHELL: And may I talk with my
12		client?
13		THE MASTER: Yes, sir.
14		MR. MITCHELL: And this reason being,
15		Your Honor, I am very careful and want to make
16		sure everything
17		THE MASTER: Incidentally, are these
18		income tax returns that you put before me the
19		exhibits in evidence or are they copies?
20		MR. MITCHELL: No, these are the exhibits
21		in evidence. They do not have any
22		THE MASTER: So, I will be sure and
23		give them back to the reporter.
24		MR. MITCHELL: May I, at the request
25		Your Honor, may I have those duplicated, 101,

	11	
1		102 and 103 in view of the fact we don't have
2		copies?
3		THE MASTER: Get the reporter to do so.
4		
5		(Whereupon, an off-the-record
6		discussion was had.)
7		
8	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) Judge Carrillo, you recall
9		Mr. Couling's contract with Benavides Implement
10		and Hardware was E-160?
11	A	Yes, sir.
12	Q	And I gave you that, I believe, over the weekend?
13	A	Yes, sir.
14	Q	In connection with the work that you have done at
15		the Court's request?
16	A	Yes, sir.
17	Q	Now, you recall that the contract was well, let's
18		look at it. Let's don't speculate. What is the
19		purchase price?
20	A	The purchase price was thirty-nine thousand one
21		hundred and eighty-six dollars.
22	Q	All right. Now, E I am sorry, strike that.
23		That is E-160 was superceded by R-50, which
24		is your contract?
25	A	Yes, sir.
- 1	I	!

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MR. MITCHELL: I stand corrected as counsel pointed out.

(By Mr. Mitchell) Now, the combination contract, Q

1		E-160, in line with Mr. Odam's observation, that
2	i	is the two root plows, and E-160 would come to how
3		much, Judge Carrillo? You have told me that
4		thirty-five thousand was the contract for two
5		dozers.
6	A	Yes, sir, and the other one was approximately
7		eleven thousand.
8	Q	Or a total of forty-six thousand, roughly, am I
9		correct?
10	A	Yes, sir.
11	Q	He deducted thirty-two thousand of that being rent
12		paid, is that correct?
13	A	Yes, sir.
14	Q	Of course, you agreed to pay how much when you took
15		them over in 1974?
16	A	It would have been one-half of that, which was
17		seven fifty plus five.
18	Q	And, of course strike that.
19	}	MR. MITCHELL: May I approach my witness,
20		Your Honor, to be sure
21		THE MASTER: Yes, sir.
22		MR. MITCHELL: Your Honor, so the record
23		reflects, I am not on these as the Court well
24		knows, and I am representing not only a
25		lawyer, but a judge, and I am very careful

1	 	to be sure that any observations that the
2	'    -  -	Court the judge or my client has, that I
3		certainly want the record to reflect and I
4		am not when I approach him this way, I
5		want to be sure he doesn't fuss at me when
6		he is turned loose.
7	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) I believe the record reflects
8		this accurately, but you don't have any knowledge,
9		or do you have any knowledge, Judge Carrillo, of
10		Couling's business as reflected in 91, 2 or 3
11		with the County of Duval or the Benavides
12		Independent School District or the Duval County
13		Conservation and Reclamation?
14	A	No, sir.
15	Q	Is it a fair statement to say that the first
16		knowledge you had was upon the furnishing of the
17		exhibits by the Examiner?
18	A	Yes, sir.
19	Q	That we have?
20	A	Yes, sir, it was.
21	Q	You did not, of course, report on a 1065 form
22		any character of partnership or relationship with
23		Benavides Implement and Hardware, did you?
24	A	No, sir, because there was none.
25	Q	And you reported that Mr. Couling did not

1 A Yes, sir. 2 -- report to Benavides Implement and Hardware as 3 a partnership. As a matter of fact, the forms are checked 5 sole proprietorship. Α That is correct. 6 7 Q You do not, of course, know any character deal or relationship that might have existed between 9 Cleofus Gonzalez, Mr. Couling or the gentleman 10 that worked with Mr. Couling's store or Mr. Parr 11 or anybody else with regards the securing of the issuance of these checks that have been introduced 12 13 into evidence into the Benavides Implement and Hardware account, do you, Judge Carrillo? 14 A The only knowledge I have is that when Mr. Parr 15 told me that he wanted to pay me the same way we 16 17 were paying Mr. Couling, the kind of checks, and 18 I wouldn't accept that form of payment so far as 19 the rental was concerned for the bulldozer. 20 Q All right Let's look at, say, for example, E-71, 21 the Benavides Implement and Hardware invoice in 22 the hands of Cleofus Gonzalez. Yes, sir. 23 A

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which is E-72.

And the statement in the hands of Cleofus Gonzalez

1	A	Yes, sir.
2	Q	And the check to Benavides Implement and Hardware
3	1	dated 20 September, '71, which is Exhibit E-74.
4	A	Yes.
5	Q	And the claim jacket form which is E-73. You had
6		no dealings or relationship between Cleofus
7		Gonzalez with Benavides Implement and Hardware,
8		Mr. Couling or anybody on that money?
9	A	No, sir, I did not.
10	Q	Now, of course, we know that that money went into
- 11		Benavides Implement and Hardware account as
12		reflected by R-91. That one specifically went
13		into R-91 as reflected by the exhibits. You had
. 14		no control or did you have any control over the
15		bank accounts, wherever it was, Mexico, Rio Grande
16		City or Alice or San Diego over the monies that
17		went into the Benavides Implement and Hardware
18		account?
19	A	No, sir.
20	Q	Do you know of any deal made, if there was any deal,
21		between Cleofus and Mr. Couling on splitting that
22		money?
23	A	No, sir, I do not.
24	Q	Do you know of any kind of deal or relationship
25		between Mr. Parr, Cleofus or Couling on the

1		disposition of that money, Judge Carrillo?
2	A	Well, again, I say the knowledge that I have is
3		what Mr. Parr told me after the fact, after it had
4		been done, that he had paid the rental of this
5		bulldozer to Mr. Couling through the county and
6		he wanted me to follow the same procedure, which
7		I would not.
8	Q	All right. Your Exhibit 100 shows you paid on
9	-	account of that bulldozer rental of sixteen
10		thousand nine hundred and twenty-six dollars.
11	A	For that one year?
12	Q	Right.
13	A	The following year, there is yes, sir.
14	Q	The following year there is some additional sum?
15	<b>A</b>	Right. There was a total of twenty thousand
16		seven hundred and some what dollars that I paid
17	·	towards the payment of those bulldozers and
18	Q	Rental?
19	A	and rental.
20	Q	And your summary shows that you had received on
21		account of rental payments back to you and other
22		sources, twelve thousand nine hundred and thirty-
23		six dollars.
24	A	Yes, sir.
25	Q	For the same period of time?

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1	A	Yes, sir.
2	Q	Mr. Odam asked you a question as regards of why
3		a general question, and I want to be fair with the
4		question. Why did all the Carrillo people take
5		the Fifth and the non-Carrillo or Parr people would
6		testify? Do you have an observation on that
7		question, Judge Carrillo?
8	A	Yes, sir. I have an observation.
9	Q	Will you tell the Court, please?
10	A	Well, it's a fact that the Attorney General and
11		the Task Force in Duval County has zeroed in on the
12		Carrillo family and as a precaution about this
13		attack upon us, we are protecting ourselves.
14	Q	Making available whatever rights the Constitution
15		has given you?
16	A	That is correct.
17	Q	I notice in Mr. Couling's 1972 return, we don't
18		have the others, that he reflects the acquisition
19		of certain cattle, Beefmaster cattle, '69, '70,
20		'71 for a depreciation schedule.
21	A	Yes, sir.
22	Q	Were some of those cattle that you had previously
23		testified to that you had sold him?
24	A	I sold him some cattle and two bulls. I am almost
25		sure. He said one, and the more I think about it,
- 1	I	

I know it's two bulls, not one. 1 2 Q Well, there is a schedule of depreciation set up 3 and I will just inform you whether you know or not, set up in that earliest return that we have, of 5 acquisitions made prior to the date of that --A Yes. 6 7 Q And I believe your testimony was that he had on occasions purchased animals from you? 8 9 A Yes, sir, he has. Q 10 And can you tell us generally, Judge Carrillo, 11 when and the amounts that we are talking about? 12 A I don't remember the date or the amounts. 13 that we were selling at a show and I would have to 14 be placing some of my best animals to being sold at the show, and I am very proud of my herd of 15 cattle. 16 17 Q Well, does Beefmaster, is it a registered type breed? 18 Α It's a registered breed. Well, it's a -- they 19 20 call it a certified breed. Registered goes only to Herefords, Brahmas, Brangus and established 21 22 breeding like that. Wherever there is a cross 23 that has been developed such as Santa Gertrudis or Beefmasters or Semintols or things like that --24

that is kind of exotic breeding, those are

1 certified. But in so many words, it amounts to 2 the same thing. 3 Q Judge Carrillo, there is a question in my mind on the counter, and one of those checks is noted a 5 sale of a counter; do you recall? 6 Α Yes, sir. 7 Q If you recall Mr. Kirkland's testimony was he did not pick up personal property separately for 8 9 depreciation. 10 Now, I want to ask you, first of all, when. 11 if you can recall, the counter was acquired and 12 under what circumstances, please? A The counter was acquired in 1962 when I acquired 13 the Vallejo Sales Building to the bankruptcy 14 sale, to the receiver. And it was part of the 15 inventory of the materials or whatever you want to 16 call them that was inside the buildings. 17 the whole thing. They closed the doors and I 18 bought whatever was in there that came in. There 19 were safes, display counters, different --20 different kinds of inventory that we located in 21 there. 22 Q 23 All right. Now, Judge Carrillo, that was purchased from the trustee and bankruptcy estate in about 24 1962? 25

1	A	As I can best recall, I purchased the Vallejo
2		Sales Building first and I think it was 1962,
3		because I know that it was rented as late as
4	<u>;</u>	rather, as early as 1964. It was rented to
5		Zertuche General Store.
6	Q	When did it cease operations as Zertuche General
7		Store; do you recall?
8	A	1970, the Zertuche General Store.
9	Q	Then, when was the sale made to Mr. Couling; do
10		you recall? You want me to get that check?
11	A	It would have been in 1971, I would imagine,
12		something like that, after that.
13	Q	All right. About nine years after you acquired
14		it?
15	A	Yes, sir.
16	Q	Do you still own the Vallejo Sales Building?
17	A	I still own it.
18	Q	I believe your exhibit reflects a total paid by
19		you of sixteen nine two six on account of a
20		bulldozer rental, am I correct?
21	A	For the year '73?
22	Q	Yes. And the total deducted by Mr. Couling of
23		seventy-three thousand, roughly, for the same
24		period of time.
25	A	Yes, sir.

1	Q	And the checks coming into the account from the
2		Duval County, apparently made up the difference
3		between what you paid them and what you paid on
4		account?
5	A	Evidently.
6	Q	Throughout the period we are talking about, Judge
7		Carrillo, without waiving any objections, Judge
8		Meyers, 71, 72, 73, 74, have you continued to
9		perform your duties as a judge?
10	A	Yes, sir.
11	Q	And you continued to ride the circuit as a judge,
12		did you not?
13	A	Yes, sir.
14		MR. MITCHELL: Judge Meyers, I have no
15		further questions of the witness. I pass
16		the witness.
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A Yes, ma'am.

Q And you had

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Q And you had gone through and looked at those units,
I believe; isn't it true, that almost all those

1		books were for the year 1964, with a couple of
2	) <sub>i</sub>	exceptions of the years 1963 and 1965, but there
3		were no books that showed any dates past 1965?
4	A	I thought there was some in there for '66, also,
5		and I could be wrong, but I can check.
6	Q	In any event, you saw none of the books in there
7		past 1966?
8	A	I can't remember. I would have to go back into
9		the box.
10	Q	Did you see any books in there past 1968?
11	A	Again, I would have to go and check. I can't
12		answer one way or the other.
13	Q	Would you take my word that I checked them and
14		there were no books past 1965, and would you agree
15		with me on that?
16	A	I would love to, but taking other people's word
17		lately has got me into a lot of trouble and I had
18		just as soon go into and check it. With all due
19		respect.
20		THE MASTER: Judge Carrillo, is that
21		box here?
22		THE WITNESS: Yes, sir, it's in the trunk
23	}	of my car.
24		THE MASTER: So, you can do it at a
25		recess?

THE WITNESS: Yes, I will be happy to

do so, Judge. It's a lot better than me

carrying it over here, Judge. If you will

just indulge me for a moment.

THE MASTER: Surely.

THE WITNESS: All right, ma'am.

Q (By Ms. Levatino) Okay. Thank you, Judge.

You did testify on Friday, however, though, that your signature did appear in R-99 and other examples or other units of which that is an example in the space that shows the welfare authorizing person, I believe, Elvira DeLeon's name is printed on there and usually your name would be written above that as authorizing the welfare recipients to receive whatever was indicated on that slip, is that correct?

- 25 A To my knowledge.

- 3728 Q Pardon? 1 A To my knowledge. 2 Q To your knowledge, right. But you did not 3 identify or didn't see in your review of those forty-four units any other person writing on those 5 books other than those three people and yourself, 6 in the welfare recipients --7 Α I will be perfectly honest with you, I didn't check all of them. 9 Well, when you are counting these books during the Q 10 break, would you also check to see whether or not 11 there are any other signatures? 12 A Now, that is going to be quite a chore and it's 13 going to take more than a break. Court's indulgence, I am going to ask him to do this on all four of these particular claim lackets.

THE MASTER: Yes, the ones where Mr.

Mitchell indicated they didn't match up and
the ones Judge Carrillo may be done by him
in the 60's.

MS. LEVATINO: Yes, that is right.

That is what I am asking Judge Carrillo to do, if I could.

THE MASTER: Well, Judge Carrillo is going to be busy.

THE WITNESS: Yes, I know I am.

I think I could explain something. I believe, if you will notice the names you find in these four, and all four of them were just about the same people coming in month after month for orders. I think if you compare these with the others, you will find the same ones are there.

MR. MITCHELL: That is the question I had in mind, that is my question that I was wondering about.

Mr. Mitchell indicated that, for example,

in H-1-(2), I believe there are twenty-nine different names and only fifteen of these slips.

What I am asking you to do is match up the names on the chits with these particular welfare claim forms. Obviously they have been stabled again and again and so forth, but to what welfare forms, if any, do these fifteen chits in your hand apply in that particular claim jacket?

I am going to ask you to do that in each of these four jackets.

A That is fine.

THE MASTER: I am not sure, you all both understand what he is supposed to do, but I am not sure if I do.

MR. MITCHELL: I don't either, Juke,

THE MASTER: You are asking that he take the chits and do what with them?

MS, LEVATINO: Each chit has a name and dollar amount on them.

On the Duval County welfare form, there are names and dollar amounts. I am asking him to take these and match them, because we have testimony in the tecord from Mr. Cleofus Gonzalez that he received these and made up this form of these chits.

1 THE MASTER: Would it be possible, 2 because of the fact that the names repeat 3 themselves that the names might appear on 4 several of the forms? 5 MS. LEVATINO: I suggest that is not 6 possible because of the way this worked. 7 There will be fifteen names on these forms 8 and two names here and they will not appear 9 on any other forms in that claim jacket. 10 In a subsequent claim jacket, there will 11 be some of those same names repeated, but 12 there is a chit for that name represented on . 13 that form. 14 THE MASTER: Well, we are almost to 15 break time and let's take a slightly longer 16 break so Judge Carrillo can do that, 17 Do you want him to do the four separate 18 claim jackets? 19 MS. And for the nurnose of the record, that is 13 reproduced on page 355? 14 Yes. 15 THE MASTER: Of E-55? 16 MS. LEVATINO: Yes. 17 All right. Did you find for the welfare depart-18 ment form dated 7-15-70 a series of eight chits 19 with those corresponding names, the names corres-20 ponding to those on the welfare county form? 21 Reneat that. 22 Did you find chits within that claim jacket with 23 names and amounts appearing on 7-15-70? 24 I found two that were not listed on there, The A 25 rest were listed on there.





THE MASTER: There is no question they are clearer than they are in E-55.

I don't know the problem of taking up the originals, what is the problem?

MS. LEVATINO: When I checked out the originals from the Senate, I assured them I would have the originals back to them by January 5th when they start the proceedings. I have no objection to having the originals submitted to the Commission, but I do think some further arrangements would have to be made with the Senate as to these particular four originals, should they not be available to the Senate on January 5th.

MR. MITCHELL: I have reference to the

fact that the yellow chits have holes in them. We challenge the authenticity of them.

THE MASTER: You mean the obvious staple marks?

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, and there is no way to reproduce those holes. I think anyone in the law business -- I can count, for example, on one of them, one, two, three, four, five, six sets, Judge Meyers, and I didn't intend to commandeer them from the Senate, but --

THE MASTER: Well, let me ask you this.

Do you agree any time the Senate wants them back they could be withdrawn?

MR. MITCHELL: Absolutely.

THE MASTER: With that understanding, is there any problem?

MS. LEVATINO: No, I don't see any.

THE MASTER: If it comes to a guestion of whether the Senate or the Judicial Qualifications Commission has them, certainly, we can xerox them individually as life-sized and probably they will reproduce at that those stable marks.

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, that is true.

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THE MASTER: Although I agree that is not as well as the original.

MR. MITCHELL: As the Court knows, we use a motion to request that a given Exhibit be sent up in it's original form because of the contention of looking at the original as compared with the copies.

THE MASTER: Yes, but these are Exhibits withdrawn from the Senate of the State of Texas and they have a prior claim to these Exhibits and we will reach an agreement if they want them back, they get them back.

MR. MITCHELL: Thank you, Judge Meyers.

Mr. Kirkland stated that those two were not on the income tax return.

- Yes, but can I explain that?

11 After Mr. Kirkland testified for the first time, 12 since the filing of that tax return, do I realize 13 that perhaps it was not reported like I say. 14 practice is, and perhaps even a bad one, is that 15 all -- all checks that are paid to me, for whatever purpose, are deposited. Then, those 16 deposits are returned to me with a statement at 18 the end of the month.

> Now, I never open the statements. The statements are kept in the file until the end of the year when it comes time to work up the income tax returns, then, we work on them and send everything to Mr. Kirkland.

- It's supposed to be taken up by the accountant and A

as far as I know, to the best of my knowledge and 1 belief, everything that is paid to me through a 2 3 check would have been reported because my position is that I have reported everything. If through error the accountant failed to pick it up or 5 something at the time that I made the statement, 7 insofar as I was concerned, everything has been reported. And I still think it has. You think that the thousand eighteen has been Q 10 reported? 11 A If it was missed, it was missed through an error 12 which should have been caught by the accountant 13 and the amendment, I guess, ought to be made as far as that is concerned. But my intention has always been, you will notice that it goes throughout 15 all of that, that those checks are deposited ani 16 17 taken up by the accountant. Q 18 Well, you would agree, however, in light of Mr. Kirkland's testimony, that those particular 19

Mr. Kirkland's testimony, that those particular ones, for whatever reason, whether or not Mr. Kirkland made an error and they were not reported to him, that not all the checks which are in evidence were reported; wouldn't you agree that in light of Mr. Kirkland's testimony is the status of the record?

25		handled or what is the what is the trust? What

is the --

A Well, the trust involves approximately twelve or thirteen thousand acres, farmland, approximately a thousand head of cattle, oil royalties, oil leases, nunting leases, and I don't know what else. I know that part is included in there, equipment that is owned, horses.

- Q Is there equipment that is owned --
- A Trucks, cattle -- I mean trailers, tractors, because it's farmland and grazing land.
- Q These trucks and trailers and tractors, well, tractors, for example, your trust -- or the one -- and I use the term your very broadly. The trust, and by that I am referring to the benefit of the record in questions to you, Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers; the trust would rent a truck, for example, to Mr. Couling.
- A I don't have anything to do with that at all, with the operation of that trust.
- Q Well, assuming that, for example, here the rents on tractor, if it were rented and if it were rented by Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers, that ultimately Mr. Kirkland -- if this were all reported back, Mr. Kirkland would pick that up as a portion of that -- well, for example, here, the three hundred

and seven dollars and five cents, that maybe that 1 2 you would get one-sixth of that income would be 3 reported on your income tax return? A Yes, sir. 5 Q Well, I probably covered it in my earlier question Specifically, do you know anything about 6 7 your trust renting a particular tractor to Mr. Couling? 8 Α No, sir, I do not. 9 Q Now, the second entry there. It says, "Rent on 10 O. P.'s two D-8 dozers." 11 Yes. 12 A 13 Q Could you explain what the particular entry means? A No, sir, I cannot explain it because I didn't write 14 it or furnish the information on it. 15 Q So, you don't know whether or not that means that 16 two dozers were rented to the county or that that 17 particular check went to make payments on the two 18 dozers, is that correct? 19 I don't know. I have no idea. Like I say, the --A 20 perhaps Mr. Couling was the one that furnished 21 that information or somebody else; I don't know. 22 Q Well, let's go down to the next one that you 23 covered the other day, "Second payment on --" what 24 is that word? 25

- 1 A "Payment on barbed wire, Farm and Ranch." 2 Q Barbed wire. Would this be -- well, and -- Farm 3 and Ranch. Is this the Farm and Ranch Store that you and your brother own half interest in? 5 A Yes, sir. 6 Q Now, what do you think that entry means? 7 Α I can't think what it means. I do know that 8 Farm and Ranch is sort of a distributorship. 9 see, you get franchises from different companies. 10 Once you get a franchise in an area, that company 11 cannot do business with other stores like, for 12 example, I will use the Air Motor Windmill Company. 13 We have the franchise for Air Motors for the area. 14 So, I know that stores from as far as Hebbronville 15 who have a customer who is insisting on an air 16 motor would have to buy it through us. They would 17 have to come and buy the windmill from Farm and 18 Ranch so they can resell it to their customers 19 because Air Motor will not sell to them. 20 Motors will only sell to us in the area and if --21 Q On this --22 A On barbed wire, also, it might be coming from 23 another company whose franchise we would have and

There is foreign barbed wire and

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1 American barbed wire. If you have the franchise --2 I mean one company is going to sell to you when 3 somebody is looking for the American barbed wire. which we do have, and Mr. Couling made the 5 statement that he had sold. I think, twelve thousand dollars worth of barbed wire to the county at one 6 7 particular sale. He might have been paying on it -I can't speculate. I thought I would explain that 9 because we are -- our store is not -- it's sort of 10 a wholesale store that sells like auto parts. We 11 sell to the different mechanic shops in town and things like that. 12 13 Q Well, on the second payment on barbed wire, again, 14 the testimony was, and up until this point, of course, we have to rely on what you stated the 15 analysis to be. Would you agree that probably 16 Farm and Ranch did not rent barbed wire to the 17 county, but if it did, it sold barbed wire? 18 No, you ion't rent barbed wire. When it's gone, 19 K 20 it's gone. () All right. And that was my point, that perhaps 21 this list reflects things other than simply rent 22 income. Would you agree with that? 23 Oh, I am sure of that because I don't think A 24

anybody cented Felipe Valerio and he is listed

there.

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Q That was my next question. That's the way you identified it here.

"Now, the reason I pointed that up, and that was on Page R-91, this is a detailed analysis containing R-91 of the rent income, am I correct, Judge Carrillo," and your answer was yes. sir.

Isn't it true that this is not a detailed analysis of rent income; that there are things on here that we don't even know what they are for? They might be for rent income and they might not be for rent income.

MR. MITCHELL: Excuse me. The question is argumentative. I asked the question and maybe I can state that what items were obviously rental income, that it purports to be, and as far as the Examiner furnished it through the Attorney General's office, a detailed analysis, but, of course, not to the contrary; that it was exclusively rental income.

THE MASTER: That is a point counsel is making and he is entitled to make it. Your objection is overruled.

THE WITNESS: Go ahead.

1 We spent a great deal of time on this page and 0 2 on this next mage and the next. 3 Yes, sir. And at that time a serious question arose as to 5 whether or not there was a great deal of rental to the county. We reched this and the record 7 says -- would you agree with me some of it may be rent, and we are not to this point of whether 9 things were rented to the county, but would you 10 agree, unless it specifically says rental, we 11 could exclude those as not being rent, unless you 12 could shed some light on it, 13 I can't shed light on this instrument. About 14 everything on here, excent the barbed wire, seems 15 to be some sort of rental. 16 Let's look at the one on 3-12-73, Ramiro Carrillo 17 and Brothers. There are a number of them? 18 Yes. 19 This is claim D-776, and that was a check for 20 three hundred thirty-two dollars. 21 What do you think that means where it says 22 Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers? 23 MR. MITCHELL: That calls for specula-24 tion. 25 If the witness has a personal THE MASTER:

1 knowledge, he may answer the question. 2 THE WITNESS: I have no personal knowl-3 edge. 0 I don't want you to speculate. 5 You stated, however, you had income from Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers? 7 Yes, I told you caliche and also I think they call it fire rock. It is a topping for highways, 9 is not found everywhere and we happen to have one 10 of those pits, which is quite -- it brings in more 11 money than oil. 12 Okay. Let's start -- back up, I skipped over some. 13 The second payment on barbed wire that --14 skip the rent on the two dozers. 15 Felipe Valero, who is he? 16 He was married to my sister, 17 So he is your brother-in-law. 18 Yes. 19 And, again, do you have any personal knowledge 20 as to that notation? 21 No. I do not. 22 Where it says countywide, Ramiro Carrillo and 23 Brothers, what is that for? Is that a sale or 24 rental? 25 On all of these items here, I would have to

8		of that is, that you own a half interest in?
9	A	I own a half interest in the store, but I don't
10		run it at all or don't know what is going on.
11	Q	And again, I might come on something we could
12		shed light on, so where it says Cateroillar D~8,
13		do you know anything about that?
14	A	No.
15	Q	Were you aware a Cateroillar was bought at Plains
16		Machinery by the county through Benavides Imple-
17		ment and Hardware?
18	A	No, that is the first time I ever heard of that
19		in my life.
20	o	All right.
21		THE MASTER: Is this a proper time for
22		a break?
23		MR. ODAM: If I could just ask one
24		further question, Your Honor.
25		THE MASTER: Yes, that is fine. Go shead

1		I thought nerhaps you were looking for
2		something else to do into.
3	Q	Now, I show you, and this is not in evidence, and
4		it is to refresh your recollection, but it is a
5		yellow card for notes receivable?
6	A	Yes.
7	0	And the name is for Precinct 3?
8	A	Yes.
9	Q	And does that refresh your memory as to a
10		Caterofliar that belonged to the county, purchased
11		from Plains Machinery?
12	A	I have not the slightest idea what this is.
13		MR. ODAM: I correct what I said a
14		while ago, it was simply a notes receivable
15		card, as the card indicates, and we don't
16		offer it in evidence. It doesn't say any-

19	Q	It doesn't say anything about Benavides Implement

1 MR. MITCHELL: Is this a purchase of a 2 machine by Mr. Couling from Plains for Duval 3 County and if so, I must pursue it. THE MASTER: You may ask Counsel, as a 5 matter of courtesy, but I prefer that you do that on your own time. 7 MR. MITCHELL: All right, Judge. 8 THE MASTER: You can obviously ask Mr. Couling about it. 10 MR. THE MASTER: On the record.

Mr. Odam, the question Mr. Mitchell addressed to me outside, that I thought ought not to be in your absence, was about the subpoena to Mrs. Gibson, who is the custodian of the income tax returns in Austin: the desire being to get a 71 return of Mr. Couling.

Mr. Mitchell was suggesting to me that I request the officer to drive to Austin and personally serve Mrs. Gibson so she could prepare and certify to Mr. Couling's 1971 return, not that she would have to be here personally, because with her certificate it would be admissible. I am reluctant to make that request of the officer and I guess my question to you is, do you have any suggestion, preferences or what?

Now, you would not agree to the taking of her deposition, and that is immaterial to me, and I think probably unnecessary. No such agreement is necessary, perhaps, but

I think the way this hearing has gone, Counsel is entitled to that return, because Mr.

Couling has testified to a number of things and it is certainly possible the 71 income tax return will be inconsistent with that testimony.

I suspect we will be here as late as Wednesday.

Mr. Mitchell, what is wrong with putting it on a bus or having Mr. Pipkin or the '). P.S. man up there to serve it. I don't know, you have been using the bus, tell me.

MR. MITCHELL: Judge Meyers, there is nothing wrong with it, except the lady is not going to honor an informal reduest. She needs to be served.

THE MASTER: I say have Mr. Maurice Pinkin or the D.P.S. deliver it to her.

MR. MITCHELL: Well, Your Honor, I know when they want to get these originals, they get on the airplane and get them and I am not fussing about that, I am glad to see that the Attorney General has all the help he can get.

MR. ODAM: Ms. Levatino did not go up

1 there and get that for the benefit of 2 clarification. It came down on the Conti-3 nental bus, Ibelieve, or commercial airline. THE MASTER: Your suggestion is. Mr. 5 Mitchell, that the officer could go up there and wait on her to produce it? 7 MR. MITCHELL: He could, by the relay system, do that, Your Honor. 9 THE MASTER: He didn't seem to know 10 what we were talking about when we were talk-11 ing about a relay system, at least as I 12 understand it. He said he could go there 13 himself. We can get him in and ask him, I 14 suppose. 15 When do you want it, except right now, 16 I suppose. 17 MR. MITCHELL: Well, when Mr. Couling 18 gets here. 19 THE MASTER: Yes, you would have to have 20 it for your examination of Mr. Couling. 21 MR. MITCHELL: Yes, Judge. 22 THE MASTER: I can see that, but that 23 won't start until sometime tomorrow, as I 24 see it. 25

That is correct, Judge.

MR. MITCHELL:

THE MASTER: Have you talked to this lady?

MR. MITCHELL: No, I have not, Mr. Cutwright has, Mr. Cutwright has talked to Mrs. Gibson.

MR. CUTWRIGHT: She said she would have to get those from the files in Ft. Worth and she said she could have it in the Austin office by tomorrow. She said before she did anything, she would need a subpoens in hand.

THE MASTER: Who besides me can issue subpoenses? Can Mr. Pinkin sign a subpoens?

1 MR. MITCHELL: I seree with you, John, I think the executive secretary does it. THE MASTER: Is there any member of the Commission living in Austin? 5 MR. ODAM: Yes, sir, Mr. Robert McGinnis. MR. MITCHELL: Is Bob a secretary or a 7 member? R MR. ODAM: Member. 

11	A	I don't know anything about any of that or what it

13	Q	And the next page, Felipe Valerio.
14	A	Valerio.
15	Q	His name appears again. Ramiro Carrillo and
16		Brothers name appears numerous times. Farm and
17		Ranch appears. What about this one down here,
18		5-20-74, "Steel plates for Ramiro to build a
19		trailer."
20	A	I don't know.
21	Q	How about this last one, 8-14-74, where it just
22		says, "Ramiro Carrillo." That is for nine hundred
23		and forty-two dollars and fifty-five cents.
24	A	I don't know anything about it.
25	Q	Well, will you agree with me that contrary to the

1 statement the other day, that this was an analysis 2 of R-91, that it was not clear exactly what all 3 these notations mean? They might be for rent. where it says rent, and they might not be for 5 rents; that it does not speak for itself nor does 6 it explain what it's for? 7 Only the individual who prepared this instrument Α R can explain this instrument to you. I cannot. 9 Q Well, let me rephrase Mr. Mitchell's question to 10 you or restate. The reason I point that up. 11 is on Page 91. 13	Q	It was that page from R-91. I believe it's the

15	A	It seems to me that Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers

17	Q	But you don't know that of your own personal
18		knowledge if it was or not?
19	A	No, sir, I don't.
20	Q	Do you think it seems from this where Ramiro
21		Carrillo's name on here that his individual
22		property is being rented?
23	A	I don't know.
24	Q	Are there any indications on R-91, on this sixth
25		page and the one thereafter, that Ramiro Carrillo

rented any individual property as Mr. Mitchell suggests by that question other than the one I pointed out to you where we have some notations, which, I guess, is really the only one, the last one?

A Well, there again, it says Ramiro Carrillo and just like Mr. Valerio, I don't think we rented Ramiro Carrillo out, either. I don't know what they are talking about.

Q All right. And the question at 3644, the question at Line 7. "Was rent on Farm and Ranch property, see if there are some entries on there." And the answer: Was the second payment on barbed wire, Farm and Ranch.

Would you agree with me that what is reflected there on R-91, that may be for rent. It may be for sales. It's not clear from that if it were rentals. Some of it just says Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers. We don't know what it's for?

- A I am afraid that the only one that can answer that,
  Mr. Odam, is the person that prepared this
  instrument.
- Q Well, I don't dispute that, but as you can see, from the nature of the testimony last week, that is not the impression that was left. There are

1 very specific statements that you were making in 2 here that appeared to me, at least, that you were 3 saying that you did know what it was for. Α Well, as you can see, from that one question, I 5 was reading, and I can read and it says, for example, here is one on Page 75 for three hundred 7 and fifteen dollars and it says, "Rental equipment," 8 Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers." Another entry for 9 two thousand five hundred and twenty-three 10 dollars and sixty-four cents, "Machinery rental, 11 materials, Caterpillar at Freer, second payment on 12 barbed wire." 13 Now, all I can do is read. 14 0 Yes, sir. Well, what personal property would 15 Ramiro Carrillo have individually to rent, if he 16 did have any to rent; do you know? 17 A He has quite a bit of personal property to rent 18 and equipment to rent, but I cannot tell you what 19 he has. As a matter of fact, I almost can't tell 20 you what all I have. It's so much. 21 Q Well, could you read on Page 3648 the question 22 Mr. Mitchell asked you at Line 13 as to the



THE MASTER: I thought I stated on Friday that I stated into the record what I understand to be the relevancy of your examination of Judge Carrillo with respect to 90, 91, 97 and 93.

MR. MITCHELL: Right.

THE MASTER: And you agreed that was the thrust and part of the thrust of it was just what you said, that while it might not all be equipment rental, there was a great deal of money that represented equipment rental and, of course, you can look on those Exhibits, and there are many entries saying rent.

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, sir.

THE MASTER: I do encourage both sides to try not to just routinely read Exhibits that I and the Commission and the Supreme Court can read as well, into the record.

If Counselbelieves there has been an inference left that he needs to correct, I amgoing to let him correct it, so the objection is overruled.

MR. MITCHELL: I would like to request that I have a copy of the daily copy of Mr. Coulings' testimony on the point where I had him on cross-examination. When I do call him back, now, it is a different ball-game and the record indicates there is rental equipment.

THE MASTER: You identify today what

you want and if I have it I will make it available to you and if Counsel has it, he w'll make it available to you. I don't have any of last week, because I went to Austin th's weekend and delivered it to my office, the originals, so my secretary could deliver that to the Judicial Qualifications Commission.

Mr. Odam has indicated he will make copies of daily copy available to me as well.

MR, MITCHELL: Yes, the record should reflect that I have not had it and I have not been, up to this point, discommoded, but I am now, because if I put Couling back on the stand, he is going to have to answer those questions.

THE MASTER: We are going to meet here this afternoon, or Mr. Odam's motel room or mine or yours so that we may jointly call Bob McGinnis. If at that time you can put your finger on the day that you want, then I will get you either through Mr. Odam or through my own copies whatever you want, just tell me.

MR. MITCHELL: It would be that testimony

and I will pinpoint it. I will request it later pursuant to the instructions of the Court.

MR. ODAM: If I might, Your Honor, without being repetitious, as I say the state of the record is that the inference was left that all of this income was rental income.

THE MASTER: And you are now showing there was some that was not and you are entitled to do that.

MR. MITCHELL: We have not taken the position in this case as to whether it was or was not. Couling's testimony was that there was no equipment to rent, so we have no position one way or the other.

THE MASTER: Well, it is an Exhibit that may be created by someone employed by the Attorney General's office. It means it is your Exhibit.

MR. MITCHELL: But the record reflects it was delivered pursuant to a subpoena.

THE MASTER: Correct.

MR. ODAM: Well, can we then stipulate, Counsel, that in light of Judge Carrillo's

1 testimony, that R-91, 92 and 93, as well as 2 R-100, does not necessarily reflect totally 3 and only income pertaining to rentals? MR. MITCHELL: I would stipulate it 5 does not reflect all of his income, because there is a discrepancy --7 THE MASTER: That was not the request. The stipulation was, do you agree that 9 R-91, 92 and 93 as well as R-100 reflect 10 income, or rather gross receipts, as opposed 11 to income, taxable income, reflects receipts 12 of revenues that include rental on equipment, 13 but do not reflect just exclusively rental 14 income. 15 MR. MITCHELL: I am not in a position 16 to stimulate that, because I don't know the 17 reflection of it. 18 THE MASTER: That is fine, 19 You may proceed, Mr. Odam. 20 It is because of that that MR. ODAM: 21 I feel it is necessary to develop the record, 22 since the stipulation cannot be done. 23 Let me develop one other point in light 24 of that.

We will start back with the first one. 9 Do you want me to count them? 10 Well, let me, if I might, on April 14th, 1971, 11 we have one. Is that for equipment rental? THE MASTER: Well, it may be that it could be done that way, however, he is only asking him to count.

MR. ODAM: Yes, sir, that is right.

Q Let's count and see how many there are for seven hundred fifty dollars.

THE MASTE R: No, let's do that at the recess.

MR. ODAM: That is my statement, not count now.

Judge Carrillo, on my request, number one would be for the seven hundred and fifty dollar items and number two, of those items, how many of them are stated to be equipment rentals. That is my

A All right.

MR. MITCHELL: May we extract R-93 so we can do that?

THE MASTER: You don't have a copy of it?

MR. MITCHELL: I will not agree to a jury view under those circumstances, Judge.

Am I charged with something wrong there?

MR. ODAM: No, the Farm and Ranch Store
and Benavides Implement and Hardware only.

MR. MITCHELL: I don't see anything about the Farm and Ranch or Benavides Implement

and Hardware.

MR. ODAM: Testimony has developed about his partnership interest.

THE MASTER: I think a view by a Master, as opnosed to a view by a jury, may be something I should consider. I am only going to consider it. I will probably want to look at some law, but I think jury views are within a discretion of the Judge in the trial of a case, but there is greater dis-

cretion where there is no jury. I don't

know that it is necessary, but I will consider

it.

MR. ODAM: That is all.

MR. MITCHELL: For the record. I would not agree to it unless the Commission as a body would be there and there is a statemen: of relevancy of what Farm and Ranch has to do with the Articles or Specifications and certainly what they have to do on the relevant years, 71, 72, 73 and 74.

THE MASTER: Judge Carrillo, you have been asked to do several things this afternoon.

One is to count, on that Exhibit, how many seven hundred fifty dollar items there are and note which items are for rental, is that right?

LEVATINO: Yes, when they began and 8 ended. 9 THE WITNESS: All right, sir. I will do 10 my best. 11 THE MASTER: Well, that is all you can 12 do. 13 Might I suggest something?
