THE MASTER: Are we ready to proceed, 1 gentlemen? 2 MR. ODAM: Yes, Your Honor, we are ready. 5 MR. MITCHELL: Yes, Your Honor. In behalf of Judge Carrillo, we did subpoena several witnesses and they are present outside the courtroom. I have been asked to ask the Court in an informal manner 9 10 as to a time schedule as regards them. are Romero Carrillo, Eloy Carrillo and Jose 11 Saenz and I don't know whether the others 12 13 have come in. THE MASTER: There is a lady out there. 14 MR. MITCHELL: Also David Carrillo and 15 Oscar Carrillo and D. C. Chapa; Tomas and 16 Roberto Elizondo. 17 18 THE MASTER: Well, your inquiry, I take 19 it, is through me to the Examiner and it's to give an estimate of how much time he would 20 need with Mr. Couling and then if he has 21 22 other witnesses, is that the request? 23 MR. MITCHELL: Yes, Your Honor. MR. ODAM: I would say it would take 24 approximately thirty more minutes with 25

Mr. Couling and we do not anticipate at this time calling any other rebuttal witnesses after that.

MR. MITCHELL: Thank you, Mr. Odam.

We would then request that we defer the cross-examination of Mr. Couling and call these gentlemen and determine if they are going to invoke their Fifth Amendment rights and, as the Court knows, I don't represent them, that is, if the Examiner persists in inquiries in E-192-1 through 12.

THE MASTER: Well, let's defer that matter until Mr. Couling has been passed es a witness and would you get Mr. Couling?

MR. MITCHELL: May I just be permitted to leave the room and inform them and so they will be informed as to the Court's wishes in this regard?

THE MASTER: Just tell them it is estimated that Mr. Couling will be thirty more minutes.

MR. MITCHELL: May I be permitted to do so?

THE MASTER: Yes, but be prompt.
You may proceed, Mr. Odam.

MR. ODAM: Thank you, Your Honor. ì 2 3 4 5 6 RUDOLFO COULING, 7 recalled as a witness, having been previously sworn, 8 testified as follows, to-wit: 9 10 11 EXAMINATION 12 13 BY MR. ODAM: 14 Q Mr. Couling, you are aware of the fact that when 15 we recessed on Friday, December 19th, I believe 16 it was, that you were testifying at that time, 17 18 do you recall that? Yes, sir. 19 Α And at that time you were under oath to tell the 20 Q truth? 21 22 Α Yes, sir. And you understand that oath still applies 23 Q 24 today? A Yes, sir. 25

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I hand you what has been marked E-192 and ask you to turn to E-192-2, please, sir.

Do you recall, Mr. Couling, that the last time we were together on that Friday, December 19th, we had covered some of the checks written on the Benavides Implement and Hardware account which are summarized on E-192 series, do you recall that?

- A Yes, sir.
- Q I would like to direct your attention, please, sir, to the top of that chart on the right-hand side to the list of checks and payees.

I direct your attention first of all to a check made out there for one hundred and fifty dollars to R. Guajardo.

You had testified about this and we had marked that E-188-21 on the chart. Do you have that marked on your chart?

- A Yes, but that is Alamo Iron Works.
- Q All right, sir. Thank you.

Let me show you the original check 188-22 to R. Guajardo. On this check to R. Guajardo, could you identify who that is?

MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Your Honor, may I reiterate the continuing objections

I have had to all of this testimony as being beyond the scope of the original notice, beyond the scope of the amended notice, relates to matters of hearsay as to Judge Carrillo, irrelevant and immaterial as to matters before this court, and, of course, relating to matters of a nonjudicial nature beyond Judge Carrillo's course of conduct and, being, of course, prior to the term, this matter being in 1971.

THE MASTER: Yes. The objection is overruled.

- Q (By Mr. Odam) Can you identify who R. Guajardo is?
- A That is a nephew of Judge Carrillo.
- Q What does the R stand for?
- A Rogelio.
- O And could you explain to the court why you made out a check which has been marked there as E-188-22 to Rogelio Guajardo?

MR. MITCHELL: It would be renetitive and hearsay. It has been previously gone into.

MR. ODAM: I am sorry, I don't think we have gone into that check before.

THE MASTER: The objection is overruled.

- Q Go shead, why did you make out the check to Rogelio Gusiardo?
 - I believe he brought me a check from the water district for this amount or a little bit more, he told me in turn that he needed some money so I made him a check from my store for that amount.

MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Your Honor, did he say Mr. Guajardo brought him a check?

THE MASTER: Yes, sir.

MR. MITCHELL: We certainly move to strike that, it would be hearsay.

THE MASTER: The basis of the admission -- of course, it is not hearsay that a person brought him the check, that is firsthand knowledge.

MR. MITCHELL: Well, that's right.

THE MASTER: Now, what he said is admitted not to prove the truth of what was said, but to explain, if it does, the reason he wrote E-188-22.

MR. MITCHELL: But, Your Honor, that doesn't get us to the substance of this case, so what -- there has been no allegation of a conspiracy between Rogelio Guajardo,

and this man and Judge Carrillo.

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THE MASTER: No. this is -- all of this has been in rebuttal, as I understand it, to the examination you made.

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, sfr.

THE MASTER: Of this witness, suggesting that Benavides Implement and Hardware was a huge enterprise. That is a very shorthand way to out it, but that is my understanding of it.

MR. MITCHELL: Then we further object.
Your Honor.

THE MASTER: Is that still generally correct, Mr. Odam?

MR. ODAM: Yes, it is totally offered for the nursose of rebuttal of the inference that was left earlier as described by the Court.

MR. MITCHELL: Now, that inference, as I understand, was some category of inference that the Benavides Implement and Hardware was a sham or a fraud, then we agree and say that it is a sham or a fraud so, therefore, there is no allegation of that. There is still no relevant basis to hang your hat on

and we just reassert our objection.

THE MASTER: Overruled.

- Q (By Mr. Odam:) Now, Mr. Couling, on that check E-182- -- correction, E-188-2?, what is the amount that check is made out for?
- A Four hundred and ten dollars, sir.
- Q Now, on that check, I notice that there is a dashed line going across the chart, 8-9-71 to the left on the deposit.

My question with respect to this check is, did you rent from Rogelio Guajardo any equipment and that was a rental payment to Rogelio Guajardo?

MR. MITCHELL: I do want to continue to object but may I have a continuing objection to all of the testimony as to what Rogelio Guajardo did with this gentleman as it relates to Judge Carrillo. There has been no testimony that Judge Carrillo was involved in that transaction at all and I don't want to continually interrupt Judge Meyers, but I don't want to waive the record either.

THE MASTER: You may have that objection.

I'm not sure I fully -- that you fully stated

it, but you may have that objection as stated.

check, please, sir?

Five hundred dollars, sir.

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1 And to whom is that check made out? 2 D. H. Cerrillo. 3 I believe you earlier stated the last time you testified that D. H. Carrillo is who, David 5 Carrillo? 6 He is a son of Oscar Carrillo, O. P.'s brother. 7 And this check, if you have not done so already, 8 do you have a pencil that you can mark the chart? 9 No. sir. 10 Let me give you one and I would like for you to 11 mark on the chart there beside the indication of 12 the check to D. H. Carrillo, the identification on 13 that check which is E-188-23. 14 What is the description that is stated there 15 on the check? 16 It says labor, sir. 17 All right. 18 MR. MITCHELL: We will have the same 19 objection to the check and the testimony, 20 Your Honor, in order not to waive our posi-21 tion as to anything Mr. Couling has got to 22 say about Mr. D. H. Carrillo on the ground 23 that, one, it would be hearsay as to Judge

Carrillo and --

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that you stated to 188-22?

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, sir.

THE MASTER: Yes, sir, they are overruled.

MR. MITCHELL: Thank you, Judge Meyers.

- O Did Mr. D. H. Carrillo perform any labor for Benavides Implement and Hardware?
- A No. sir.
- O Well, could you explain to the Court why you made out a check for five hundred dollars to D. H. Carrillo, please, sir?
- Well, once again I was brought a check from the water district for the amount of seven hundred and fifty dollars which I had been instructed previously that I had to make a check to either Oscar Carrillo or D. H. Carrillo for five hundred dollars and the balance would be paid to R. Carrillo Brothers.
- O I direct your attention to 188-24 and if you would, please, sir, mark on your chart which is the check you referred to for two hundred and fifty dollars.

Now, my question with respect first of all to E-188-23, to D. H. Carrillo, were you making a payment to D. H. Carrillo for any equipment you

1 rented from him? 2 No. sir. 3 Were you making a payment to R. Carrillo and 4 Brothers for equipment? 5 No. sir. At any time, with respect to D. H. Carrillo and 6 7 R. Carrillo and Brothers listed on this page and all other pages ? through 12, did you at any time 8 9 make payment to R. Carrillo and Brothers for 10 equipment that R. Carrillo and Brothers had 11 rented to you or to Benavides Implement and Hard-12 WATE? 13 A No. sir. 14 Did you ever make checks payable to D. H. Carrillo 15 including this and all other instances where we 16 have checks, original checks that are in evidence, 17 payable to D. H. Carrillo where you rented equin-18 ment from him? 19 I never rented equipment from none of them, sir. 20 Would you please state to the Court from whom --21 well, let me rephrase that, did you at any time 22 rent equipment or vehicles from D. H. Carrillo? 23 No, sir, the store never did rent no equipment 24 from nobody, sir, 25 Directing your attention down to the -- toward

the hottom of the page to the check that is listed there October the 18th, 1971, can you find that check on the chart?

- A Yes, cir.
- Q And I would ask you to look in the stack of checks you have for E-188-32.
- A Yes, sir.
- Q This check for five hundred dollars, could you please explain to the court who Rosario Vaello --

MR. MITCHELL: We are going to object, of course, to any testimony offered about any transaction between this witness and Rosario Vaello, Your Honor, on the grounds it certainly would be hearsay as to this -- as to Judge Carrillo and irrelevant and immaterial to any -- in any way that I can see under the allegation contained in the original notice and the amended notice to any fact and certainly supports, rather than negates, the inference in the rebuttal that the Benavides Implement and Hardware were doing business with other parties.

We are going to object to the introduction, therefore, of any testimony and may we have a continuing bill, Judge Meyers?

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THE MASTER: Yes, you may, and depending on what the testimony is. I will overrule the objection at this time, but you have get to link it up. I don't see the relevancy right now myself.

MR. ODAM: No, sir, I was just getting ready to go into the relevancy of the check.


- O Could you explain first of all who Rosario
 Vaello is?
- A She is my oldest daughter.
- O How do you pronounce the last name?
- A Vaello.
- O Why did you write out a check for five hundred dollars to your daughter?
- A Well, it was close to Christmas, two or three months before Christmas and she needed some money and she had a little girl in the hospital and so I loaned her five hundred dollars.
- Q. This check that is listed immediately thereafter, if you would turn to the next check in the stack, E-188-33 and mark that on the chart, please, sir.

MR. MITCHELL: The same objection to the checks to Miller and Miller as previously stated, Your Honor, and may we have a

continuing objection?

THE MASTER: Yes, sir.

- Do you find the original check to Miller and Miller?
- Yes, sir.
- Two hundred and ten dollars. Why did Benavides Implement and Hardware may two hundred and ten dollars to Miller and Miller?
- This is one of the checks I believe that Ramiro had in his nocket that was just signed by me and I don't know what he nurchased from Miller and Miller.



1 Now, you identified your signature on the check? Q 2 Yes, sir. A 3 Where it says Miller and Miller, that is your 0 handwriting? 5 No. sir, that is my signature on the bottom. A 6 Can you identify whose handwriting it is? Q 7 No. sir, I cannot. Do you know what Miller and Miller is, what that 8 Q 9 entity is? 10 No, sir, I don't know. A 11 Were you renting equipment from this unknown Q 12 entity, Miller and Miller? 13 No. sir. A Anywhere the name Miller and Miller appears on Q this chart, is there a name like that shown? 15 16 A No, sir. 17 Q I would like to have you turn, please, sir, to E-192-3, the next page, and I direct your 18 19 attention to the check made out to Edwards Furniture for seven hundred thirty-five dollars. 20 21 Would you mark on your chart, please, sir, 22 E-188-35. 23 Do you find that original check? 24 Yes, sir. Α Can you identify your signature on that? 25 Q

1	A	Yes, sir.
2	Q	Did you fill in where it says Edwards
3		Furniture?
4	A	No, sir.
5	Q	Can you identify whose handwriting that is?
6	A	It looks like Judge Carrillo's handwriting, sim.
7		MR. MITCHELL: We move to strike as
8		being speculative and conjecture on the part
9		of this witness. The witness has no personal
10		knowledge of this and the same is wholly
11	,	irrelevant and immaterial as to the reasons
12		previously asserted as regards E-188-22.
13		THE MASTER: Overruled.
14	Q	(By Mr. Odam) The check to Edwards Furniture,
15		do you know what MDS is?
16	A	Merchandise.
17	Q	Why did Benavides Implement and Hardware write out
18		that check?
19	A	This is one of the blank checks that I gave to
20		Judge O. P. Carrillo with my signature on the
21		bottom.
22	Q	Where is Edwards Furniture located?
23	A	Alice, Texas.
24	Q	Was this furniture for your store?
25	A	No.

1	Q	As a result of writing this check, did you
2		personally receive any furniture or a television
3		or anything?
4	A	No, sir.
5	Q	Did your store receive any furniture for the
6		store?
7	A	No, sir.
8	Q	Throughout this chart, there are a number of
9		checks written to the Farm and Ranch Supply. We
10	,	referred to these earlier.
11		MR. MITCHELL: I am going to object to
12	í	the expression as to throughout the chart.
13		MR. ODAM: I will restate the question.
14		MR. MITCHELL: Thank you.
15	Q	(By Mr. Odam) You will notice the check No. 199,
16		where it is dated, November 12, 1971, for one
17		thousand two hundred twenty-eight dollars three
18		cents.
19	A	Yes, sir.
20	Q	There is another check to Farm and Ranch Supply,
21		November 15, 1971, six hundred twenty-six dollars
2 2		seventy-eight cents.
23	A	Yes, sir.
24	Q	At any time, did Benavides Implement and
2ť·		Hardware rent any equipment from Farm and Ranch
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Supply? 1 No. sir. never did. 2 A 3 At any time, did you have equipment from Farm and 0 Ranch Supply that you in turn rented to some other entity? 5 MR. MITCHELL: Did the witness produce 6 Check No. 199? 7 MR. ODAM: I did not refer to it specifically. 9 MR. MITCHELL: Does he have it? 10 If so, I would like to have it to look 11 at myself. My records do not indicate there 12 has been introduced into evidence a check 13 199 for that amount of money. 14 THE MASTER: This should be a portion 15 of the 188 series, is that your understanding? 16 17 MR. MITCHELL: Yes. THE MASTER: Do you have that check? 18 THE WITNESS: No. sir. 19 MR. MITCHELL: I would reassert the 20 same objection I made to the entire exhibit, 21 192, and this is an indication of what my 22 objection is. There is no original input as 23 to that check as is the case with many checks, 24 and if we have it. I would like to have it or 25

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a copy of it.

THE MASTER: What is the status of that?

MR. ODAM: Your Honor, I have not gone through with every check with this witness to interrelate all the checks. I would represent, and it is clearly my understanding, that the check I referred to for six hundred twenty-six dollars seventy-eight cents, I believe I referred to it, that happens to be a Check No. 179-1 series through -- the 179 series is a series of checks to Farm and Ranch Supply.

179-27 is a check in the amount of one thousand -- well, my purpose is to refer to the chart and not take every one of these checks and interrelate.

THE MASTER: Well, my question to you was, that you asked this witness about a Check No. 199.

Now, I don't know if that is the exhibit number or if that is a sub-part of another exhibit. I take it it is a sub-part.

MR. ODAM: No, Check 199, that is the number on the check.

THE MASTER: Oh.

1 MR. MITCHELL: It does not have an exhibit number. MR. ODAM: It does. MR. MITCHELL: Is that the one you just 5 identified? 6 THE MASTER: That is what I am asking 7 about. 8 Check No. 199 is what part of 179? 9 MR. ODAM: Dash 27. 10 THE MASTER: All right. 11 MR. MITCHELL: It would be R-179-27? 12 THE MASTER: Yes, sir. 13 MR. ODAM: And the other check that is 14 stated on the chart as 203, that is the 15 check number. 16 THE MASTER: Mr. Mitchell, you referred 17 to that exhibit as R-179-27 and it should 18 be E-179-27. 19 MR. MITCHELL: Yes, the previous 20 reference should be as the Court noted, is 21 that correct, Your Honor? 22 THE MASTER: That is correct. 23 MR. ODAM: E-179-1 is this one. 24 Farm and Ranch checks are generally in a 25 179 series. That is a Farm and Ranch check

series.

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We also have a series of checks which are the 186 series and there are a series of checks -- the 188 series, so we have, by those, at least those three, we have attempted to get copies of every check and for the purpose of refreshing my own memory and the record, the originals Mr. Couling has are the 188 series.

Mr. Carl Williams filled in the gaps on other checks.

This leaves me to the point of saying
I have not gone through and had not taken
the check for 179-27 and I intended to make a
specific reference, because they are interrelated.

I would not tend to have a check listed on the chart that I do not have in one of these series of checks. That is why it takes some time to go through it in this manner.

If I could, I would like to rephrase the question on the check.

THE MASTER: Yes, sir.

Q (By Mr. Odam) On 179-27, you do not have that right before you, Mr. Couling?

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1	A	No, sir.
2	Q	And as you can tell by the statement from counsel
3		that is in another series of checks?
4	A	Yes.
5	Q	The check for Farm and Ranch Supply, was that
6		check written for the purpose of payment of
7		rental on equipment you rented from Farm and
8		Ranch Supply?
9	A	No, sir.
10	Q	Did you rent any equipment from or to Farm and
11		Ranch Supply?
12	A	No, sir.
13	. Q	Are there checks in evidence which are made
14		payable to Farm and Ranch Supply for equipment
15		you rented to them?
16	A	No, sir, I never did rent equipment to Farm and
17		Ranch Supply or from Farm and Ranch Supply.
18	Q	Are the checks in evidence, the 188 series, made
19		payable to Oscar Carrillo for any equipment you
20		rented to him?
21	A	No, sir.
22	Q	Now, the check which is dated November 15th, you
23		do have it before you, and it is 188-38.
24		If you would mark your chart, please, sir,
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outside where it says No. 201, that is the check

1		number itself.
2	A	What is the number; what did you say?
3	Q	E-188-38.
4		MR. MITCHELL: We have the same
5		objection as we previously leveled to
6		E-188-22.
7		THE MASTER: Yes, sir, they are
8		overruled.
9	Q	(By Mr. Odam) Why did you make out a check to
10		Gulf Hardware for two thousand three hundred
11		dollars?
12	A	I believe it was I had gone over there and
13		purchased shells and scopes and rifles.
14	Q	Shells and scopes and rifles?
15	. A	Yes, for hunting.
16	Q	Were they for your personal use?
17	A	All of them, the shotgun shells and the articles
18		were delivered to Mr. D. C. Chapa by myself.
19	Q	You delivered them to Mr. D. C. Chapa yourself?
20	A	Yes, sir.
21	Q	How much did he pay you for those?
22	A	Not a penny, sir.
23	Q	Where is Gulf Hardware located?
24	A	Here in Corpus.
25	Q	Did you rent any equipment from Gulf Hardware

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1		that you paid two thousand three hundred dollars
2		for?
3	A.	No, sir.
4	Q	At any time did you ever rent any equipment or
5 .		vehicles from Gulf Hardware?
6	A	No, sir.
7	· Q	I direct your attention to E-188-42. That is not
8		on that page, although there is a reference to
9		Charlie's truck parts on that page. This part cular
10		check is on E-192-4 at the bottom of that page.
11		MR. MITCHELL: 3-22-72?
12	į Į	MR. ODAM: Yes, that is the date.
13		THE WITNESS: The number of this check
14		is what?
15	Q	(By Mr. Odam) 279. It is E-188-42.
16	A	Yes, sir.
17	Q	If you would, outside that check to Charles Auto
18		Parts, would you put E-188-42.
19	·	MR. MITCHELL: Same objection, if it
20		please the Court, as it regards to the
21		objections leveled on E-188-22 and we reasser
22		the same objections.
23		THE MASTER: All right. They are
24	<u> </u> -	overruled.
25	Q	(By Mr. Odam) Why did you make out a check to

1		Charlie's Auto Parts for four hundred dollars?
2	A	That was another check that I had signed and
3		delivered to Ramiro or O. P. Carrillo.
4	Q	The Charlie's truck parts business, where is that?
5	A	I believe San Antonio.
6	Q	Did you rent any trucks from Charlie's Auto Parts?
7	A	No, sir.
8	Q	Were you making payments for trucks that Benavides
9		Implement and Hardware had rented from them?
10	A	No, sir.
11	Q	At other points on the chart, and there are other
12		checks in evidence made out to Charlie's Auto
13		Parts, did you ever make out a check to Charlie's
14		Auto Parts for any trucks or equipment rented to
15		them?
16	A	No, sir, I did not.
17		MR. MITCHELL: May I get the original of
18		that check, in view of his testimony he did
19		not fill it out?
20		THE MASTER: Yes, sir.
21	Q	(By Mr. Odam) Can you identify whose handwriting
22		is on that check?
23	A	No, sir.
24	Q	But it is your signature?
25	A	Yes, sir.

1	Q	On 192-4, I direct your attention to the last
, 2		page, International Harvester Company.
3	A	Yes.
4	Q	Would you put E-188-43 there by that one.
5	A	133?
6	Q	No, 188-43.
7	A	Yes, sir.
8	Q	This is Check E-188-43, why did you write out a
9		check to International Harvester?
10		MR. MITCHELL: Same objection as
11		previously lodged to E-188-22.
12		May we have a continuing objection as
13		to all testimony between this man and
14		unknown persons as relate to this, Judge?
15		THE MASTER: Yes. You may have that
16		continuing objection, and depending again on
17		what the testimony is. I overrule it this
18		time, but it depends on what the testimony
19		is as to hearsay.
20		MR. MITCHELL: Yes, for example, the
21		testimony is that he gave his daughter a
22		Christmas present in October and this is
23		fine, but it is not relevant as to a
24		mahubbal. The shaws thouse do no shaw account

and I hope I don't waive my objections,

because I don't reassert my objections.

THE MASTER: No -- well, I do not regard the testimony with respect to a check to the daughter as particularly relevant myself. It may explain what the check was, since it is now in evidence, and the chart is now in evidence, but that is all it means to me.

MR. ODAM: No, sir, it doesn't mean anything more.

I introduced it because I anticipated

Mr. Mitchell might raise a question about

that particular check himself and it was not

my purpose and I don't -- well, that this was

a sham account, but simply this series of

questions, it is whether or not --

MR. MITCHELL: I think the Court stated my point of view as regards that check. I will stand on that.

MR. ODAM: Let me move on.

- Q (By Mr. Odam) I refer you to the six hundred dollar check to International Harvester.
- A I didn't write it, I signed it only.
- Q To whom did you give the check?
- A I gave it to Ramiro or O. P. Carrillo.

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1	Q	The main purpose of the question, did you write
2		out a check to International Harvester, did you
3		write out that check to pay them for equipment
4		you rented from them?
5	A	No, sir.
6	Q	For equipment you bought?
7	A	I don't know, sir; I don't know what equipment was
8		bought with that check.
9	Q	Let's be sure I have that clear. Was equipment
10		purchased for Benavides Implement and Hardware
11		for six hundred dollars?
12	A	No, sir. Benavides Implement and Hardware did not
13		benefit by this check at all.
14		MR. MITCHELL: We will, of course,
15		request the Court to note the difference of
16		the handwriting in E-188-43 and E-188-35 in
17		the face of the testimony that the witness
18		doesn't recall who he gave the check to. I
19		know the Court will look at those when
20		passing on the facts as to whether or not the
21		handwriting is that of my client.
22	Q	(By Mr. Odam) Mr. Couling, I would refer you
23		first of all to find Check 188-92.
	I	

MR. MITCHELL: Same objection as to any

testimony between this witness and Charlie's

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truck parts as previously leveled. We do 1 not intend that our silence waive those objections. THE MASTER: He said 92, but you may have the same objection as you had to the 5 others. 6 MR. MITCHELL: I thought he said -the check was made out to whom? 8 MR. ODAM: Juan Garcia. 9 (By Mr. Odam) It is at the bottom of Page 4. 10 Did you find that check? 11 A Yes, sir. 12 Check No. 278? 0 13 Α Yes, sir. 14 Did you find that entry on the chart? Q 15 A Yes, sir. 16 Could you mark out beside where it says No. 278 Q 17 on the chart, would you put that? 18 Yes, sir. 19 20 21 22 23 24 25

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1	Q	Okay, first of all, can you explain who Juan
2		Garcia is?
3	А	As far as I know, there is no person by that
4		name that I ever issued any check to, sir. It
5	٠.	was just a name that Ramiro used to get money
6		out of the store, sir.
7	Q	Well, did you can you identify the handwriting
8		where it says Juan Garcia?
9	A	In front, yes, sir, I wrote that check completely.
10	Q	You wrote the check?
11	A	Yes, sir.
12	Q	And that is your handwriting where it says Juan
13		Garcia?
14	A	Yes, sir.
15	Q	Why did you write Mr. Juan Garcia a check for
16		a hundred and thirty-four dollars and forty-three
17		cents?
18	A	It was just a check that Ramiro said he needed
19		money. I believe I got a check from the county
20		before that.
21	Q	There is no Juan Garcia?
22	A	No, sir.
23	Q	Once you made out the check to Juan Garcia, what
24		did you do with the check?
25		MP MITCHFIL. We are going to object

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to the witness' answer that, "I believe I got a check from the county before that," of course, is speculation and non-responsive and, of course, the question is leading and again, we reassert our objection on the grounds it is hearsay, Judge Meyers, as to this witness.

It is twice removed hearsay, it gets back to that, and we object, and we assert our objection.

THE MASTER: Well, I disagree that it is hearsay and that objection is overruled.

- Q What did you personally do with the check made out to Juan Garcia?
- A I made it out and then I gave it to Ramiro Carrillo, sir.
- Q Did you rent any equipment from Juan Garcia?
- A No. sir.
- Q There are some checks in here listed, I take one, for example, E-188-105, if you would refer to it, please, sir. If you could find the check, first of all.
- A 188 what?
- Q 105,
- A It is check 479.

1 Yes, and who is that check made out to? 0 Julian M. Trevino, who is a wholesale grocer 3 out of Laredo, Teyas. And this check is on the chart at page 7, if you 5 would refer to that chart, please, sir, on page 7. 6 It is about seven up from the bottom, do you 7 see that check number 479? 8 Yes, sir. 9 Would you mark out beside it E-188-105, please? 10 Yes, sir, 11 Why did you make out a check for thirty-six 0 12 dollars and twenty-two cents --13 MR. MITCHELL: The same objection, 14 pardon me, Mr. Odam, I didn't mean to step 15 on your question, but we would have the same 16 objection to this testimony and the question 17 out to this witness as regards to any rela-18 tionship between a Julian Trevino and Mr. 19 Rudolfo Couling as it relates to Judge 20 Carrillo, Judge Meyers. 21 THE MASTER: The objection is overruled. 22 Q Why did you make out a check to Julian Trevino for 23 thirty-six dollars and twenty-two cents? 24 I just -- I used it to buy cow feed nellets.

And the cow feed that you bought from Julian

2	A	No, sir, some of it was for my own ranch and some

14		Were all of these checks made out for hay or feed?
15	A	It was nellets, cow pellets.
16	Q	Cow pellets?
17	A	Yes, sir,
18	Q	You didn't rent any equipment from Mr. Trevino?
19	A	No, sir.
20	Q	Now, the cow nellets you received, the ones that
21		went to who did you say, D. C. Chana?
22	A	And Rogelio Guajardo, I took some, sir.
23	Q	And you took some?
24	A	Yes, sir.
25	Q	Now, the Mr. Chana, did he ever write a check

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	out to you in turn to pay you or Benavides Imple-
	ment and Hardware for those cow nellets?
A	No, sir, never did, sir,
Q	I would like for you to find in the stack of
	checks E-188-117.
A	Yes, sfr.
Q	This is a check could you identify who that
	is made out to and for what amount?
A	It was made out to A and R Carrillo for the
	amount of thirteen hundred dollars,
Q	And could you find that and make that on the
	chart, it is on page 8 as E-188-117?
	MR. MITCHELL: The same objection as
	regards to any questions out to this witness.
	Judge Meyers, as to an A and R Carrillo,
	previously leveled to E-188-22, 33, 42, 35,
	38 and those related items, Your Honor.
	THE MASTER: The same ruling.
Q	Who is A and R Carrillo?
A	That is Arnuldo and Ramiro Carrillo, which are
	the sons of Ramiro Carrillo, Senior, sir,
Q	A stands for Arnuldo?
A	Yes.
. Q	And R stands for what?
A	Ramiro.
	Q A Q A Q

1 0 Remiro? Α Yes, sir. 3 Those are the two sons of --4 Ramiro Carrillo. 5 And why did you write out a check to A and R 6 Carrillo for the amount of thirteen hundred dollars? 7 That was some money that Ramiro needed so he had 8 me make it out on his boys names, sir, 9 Do you recall of your own personal knowledge what 10 you did with the check to A and R Carrillo after 11 you made it out? 12 I in turn gave it to Ramiro, sir. 13 Were you renting any equipment from A and R 14 Carrillo? 15 No, sir. Α 16 Mr. Couling, this is not in reference to --17 specifically to the check, although we could --18 19. 20

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given time, we could pull it out, but the testimony in this case has been that Mr. Ramiro Carrillo or Judge O. P. Carrillo either through Farm and Ranch Supply or personally, had rented a water rig to Benavides Implement and Hardware, you might recall when you were on the stand back on crossevamination by Mr. Mitchell, Mr. Mitchell asked you about a water rig.

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24 25 My question to you, at any time did Benavides
Implement and Hardware ever rent a water rig from
O. P. Carrillo?

MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Counsel, I don't intend to confuse the question but there is a water rig that hauls water and then there is a drilling rig. Are we talking about the drilling rig?

THE MASTER: The question refers, I am certain, to the drilling rig.

MR. ODAM: Yes, sir.

THE MASTER: Water well rig.

MR. MITCHELL: A water well rig.

THE MASTER : The rig.

MR. ODAM: The rig to drill wells.

MR. MITCHELL: All right.

- Q At any time, did Benavides Implement and Hardware ever rent a drilling rig, water drilling rig from O. P. Carrillo?
- A No, sir, never did, sir.
- Q Did the store ever rent such an instrument or piece of equipment from Ramiro Carrillo?
- A No. sir.
- Q Did Benavides Implement and Hardware ever rent such a piece of equipment from Farm and Ranch

1 Supply? 2 No, sir. 3 THE MASTER: Do you know what -- what knowledge do you have of such a water drill-5 ing rig, if any? 6 There was -- there was a water rig purchased and 7 I don't know when it was, and my understanding was 8 it was purchased by the county and it was used 9 when the road was made between Freer and Hebbronville 10 for the landowners that the land was divided in 11 half, so they could continue getting water on the 12 land divided by the highway. 13 THE MASTER: Did you ever have it in 14 your possession? 15 No, sir, the only time I saw it real close is 16 when it was drilling the water well for the 17 school district, sir. 18 THE MASTER: Go ahead, Mr. Odam. 19 0 (By Mr. Odam:) And when was this road built 20 that you were referring to? 21 I don't know, if it was around somewhere between

> 67 or 68, somewhere around there. THE MASTER: Do you know where the rig is now? The last time I went and saw it, it was sold,

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1 somewhere in Beeville. 2 THE MASTER: It was stored? 3 It was sold. THE MASTER: It was sold? 5 Yes. 6 THE MASTER: Go ahead, Mr. Odam, 7 (By Mr. Odam:) Of your own personal knowledge, 8 do you know by whom it was sold? Was it sold by 9 the county? 10 No. sir. I believe it was sold by Archer Parr. 11 sir. We went to Alice and inquired and said 12 Archer had sold it and went up there to see it 13 and it was being torn apart. 14 By Mr. Archer Parr? 15 Yes, sir. 16 Do you know how it got into the possession of 17 Mr. Archer Parr? 18 I don't know, my understanding is that the county 19 had nurchased it. I am not sure, sir. 20 Now, speaking of Mr. Archer Parr, reminds me of 21 a Mr. George Parr. 22 Could you please clarify for the record, with 23 respect to some Caterpillar tractors that you 24 testified to back several weeks ago. Did you 25

ever have a conversation with Mr. -- the deceased

1 Mr. George Parr about those Caternillar tractors 2 and Benavides Implement and Hardware renting 3 them to Mr. George Parr? No. sir, I didn't even talk to Mr. George Parr Α 5 about any Caternillars. 6 Did you have any type of an arrangement with Mr. 7 George Parr whereby money would be taken from 8 the county to be paid for thee one or more Caterpillars to be used on George Parr's ranch? 10 A No. sir, never did, sir. 11 What enversations, if any, did you have with 12 Mr. George Parr about those Caternillars? 13 None whatsoever. 14 MR. MITCHELL: Now, of course, for the 15 technical and housekeeping effect on my 16 record, I just want to object, of course, 17 that it is irrelevant and immaterial and 18 would be hearsay. 19 THE MASTER: No, the objection is over-20 ruled. 21 MR. MITCHELL: Because I think the 22 testimony -- strike that. 23 MR. ODAM: You think the testimony is 24 what? 25 Well, Gene Powell reflects MR. MITCHELL:

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that the testimony is that the equipment was found on the Parr Ranch at the time of George Parr's death, Mr. Odam. I think that speaks louder than this witness who testified he did not have any knowledge.

THE MASTER: The question to this witness is simply did he have any conversation with Mr. George Parr about those bulldozers.

MR. MITCHELL: That's right.

THE MASTER: And he answered no.

MR. MITCHELL: That's right, and that is why I withdrew it. I know everyone is familiar with Mr. Powell's testimony, as to where the equipment is found and that is the reason I withdrew it.

MR. ODAM: It is not only Mr. Powell's testimony --

THE MASTER: Let's just go shead and question this witness.

MR. ODAM: Yes, sir.

(Discussion off the record.)

MR. ODAM: We pass the witness.

MR. MITCHELL: Judge Meyers, may I be permitted to bring in the witnesses,

Ramiro, D. H. Carrillo, Rogelio Guajardo and defer the cross-evamination of this witness, and obviously the course of my re-cross will carry one course if these gentlemen are going to invoke their privilege and another course if not.

THE MASTER: Well, it certainly does not matter to me. What does the Examiner say?

MR. ODAM: Well, as to whether or not they are called out of order, the witnesses are apparently, from Mr. Mitchell's statement, are present and out of courtesy to those witnesses, and their presence. I have no objection to Mr. Mitchell taking those witnesses on direct at this time and taking Mr. Couling back up at a later point.

That is not -- while to make that statement of courtesy to the witnesses, while they
are present, I do not intend to waive any
other objections that I have once they start
testifying, obviously.

THE MASTER: All right, Mr. Couling, why don't you step outside for a moment and I want to take this matter up a little bit

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more,

(Whereupon Mr. Couling left the court-room.)

THE MASTER: Mr. Mitchell, the trouble I have with it is simply that these witnesses are witnesses who presumably will say something contrary to what you think Mr. Couling may say on re-cross examination.

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, sir.

THE MASTER: Now -- and what your purpose, I take it, is that if Mr. Couling denies something, you want to put those witnesses on to dispute that denial roughly.

Now, until he has made that denial or testified contrary to what you think these witnesses will testify, if they do, it seems to me we really are anticipating, where perhaps we should not be.

MR. MITCHELL: Well, Your Honor, that is very good. That is correct, Judge. That is one aspect of my request.

The other aspect being that now I am being confronted with the immuendo and the implication left in this record that there

is some type of arrangement between, for evample, Guaiardo -- Rogelio Guaiardo that involves my client, Judge Carrillo. Now, I would like to know at this juncture whether or not Mr. Rogelio Guaiardo will take the stand and testify as to the facts and, of course, I will ask him whether or not Judge Carrillo has had any involvement whatsoever, for example, in his receipt of E-188-22.

Now, if he is going to take the Fifth Amendment, then I am going to request that he be ordered by the District Judge to testify and I want the facts in the record so as to establish affirmatively, Your Honor, and -- that Judge O. P. Camillo has nothing to do with E-188-22, for example, and there are a number of those checks.

I am nut in a position now of having to affirmatively try each and every one of those items which I would like to do.

MR. ODAM: Well, you --

MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Mr. Odam, but to do so, I need to know what these witnesses are going to testify. Now, Judge, I culd -- I didn't really intend to bounce them off the

ľ backboard, to bounce Mr. Couling off the 2 backboard of their testimony. Actually, I 3 really was trying to get my time frame worked out to find out what they are going 5 to do and make a request of this Master to request the netition of this Court to order them to testify really was what I was trying to do, not so much to pin Mr. Couling down and I think Mr. Couling -- I have got 10 enough without what these vitnesses testified, 11 I think, in the record, plus what I am --12 plus what I have already available to take 13 him on re-cross to take care of his credibility, 14 I think.

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I am just going to test them to see what they are going to do, is what I am trying to do, Judge Meyers.

THE MASTER: Well then, you don't -well, do you intend, if they do not take
the Fifth Amendment, to proceed with their
examination or do you intend to let them go
and bring Mr. Couling back and cross-examine
and then have them as witnesses?

MR. MITCHELL: That is the way I would like to do it, because of -- out of due order

of procedure, Judge Meyers, and the Court's suggestion that that would be the Court's desire, that would be. I think, an orderly way to do it, if they don't, and I would like to excuse them and out Mr. Quling on and bring them back and have them go down through these items.

If they do, I would like to bring Mr.

Couling back, file a netition in the interim
with the Court, requesting that they be
ordered to testify and bring them in here
and -- before a local District Judge and
have them ordered to testify and then
tomorrow, day after tomorrow, bring them and
nut them on the stand and let them testify
about these checks.

MR. ODAM: Might I make one comment, Your Honor?

THE MASTER: Yes, sir.

MR. ODAM: I think that it would be interesting, aside from the immunity of these witnesses, on all of this, if we consider what would take place; that if Mr. Rogelio Guajardo were to take the stand, and take the Fifth Amendment, and then Mr.

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Mitchell asked this Court to metition the District Court, and if Rogelio Guajardo were to go ahead and waive his -- or go mast his Fifth Amendment and testify nursuant to the Court's order, presumably take the Fifth Amendment, and thereby saying that what he says would tend to incriminate him, that if that Fifth Amendment privilege were out of the way then Mr. Rogelio Guajardo would then testify along the lines of something that would be incriminating, which would tend to support the testimony of Mr. Couling.

What I am saying is the incongruity aside from the immunity question of calling a witness and if he takes the Fifth Amendment, by his testimony, by taking the Fifth Amendment, it would tend to support by invoking the witness' --

MR. MITCHELL: Mr. Odam, you know the fact that the man takes the Fifth does not make any innuendo as to his guilt. I am willing to, by his testimony, one way or the other, I am -- I am not making a bargain, I want the truth, I don't care what he testifies

to, as long as it is the truth. I am simply not going to represent to this Court, if the man takes the Fifth Amendment, it does not carry with me, thank God, any innuendo whatever of his guilt and whatever his testimony is, I am going to live with it and I have got to live with it.

THE MASTER: Well, I don't mind proceeding with the -- do you want to call them all?

MR. MITCHELL: I would like to call those that are here, Judge. There are about four or five of them. We can ascertain, I submit, Judge, between now and the break time what --

THE MASTER: I think we could.

MR. MITCHELL: With the leave of Court, I like the way the Court outlines that if they intend to answer, that I would like to defer, perhaps, and give them a date to come back, like tomorrow morning and me continue with Mr. Couling. Would that be all right?

THE MASTER: Yes. Mr. Cutwright, would you get them. Who do you want first?

MR. MITCHELL: I want Rogelio Guajardo.

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(Discussion off the record.)

THE MASTER: Mr. Guajardo, you have not testified here before, have you?

MR. GUAJARDO: No, str.

THE MASTER: Would you raise your right hand, please, sir?

ROGELIO GUAJARDO, being called as a witness, was duly sworn and testified as follows:

EXAMINATION

MR. MITCHELL: May I proceed, Your Honor?

THE MASTER: Yes, sir.

- Q State your name for the record, please, sir.
- A Rogelio Guajardo, Junior.
- Q Mr. Guajardo, I represent you, I believe. in some matters that are unrelated to the present inquiry, am I correct?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q What was your answer to that?
- A Yes, str.
- Q All right, and I stated to you that in connection

with proceedings here, that you would be required to get other counsel, am I correct?

- A Yes, sir.
- Q Now, there has been some questions asked Mr.
 Rudolfo Couling concerning an account called
 Benavides Implement and Hardware account, Mr.
 Guajardo.

I will ask you this, and I will make this preliminary statement, there has been some questions asked regarding some questions that were written by Rudolfo Couling to you back in 1971 and 1972 that is R -- or Rogelio Guajardo.

Now, my question to you is, and I intend to question you concerning the checks from Mr. Rudolfo Couling to you.

MR. MITCHELL: They are specifically identified as Exhibits E-188-22, Your Honor, in that series.

- Q I would ask you if you will testify freely as to those transactions or would you claim your privilege?
- A I respectfully decline and refuse to answer any questions put to me on the grounds that the answer might tend to incriminate me.
- Q And that would be as to any check I might ask you

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from proceeds from Rudolfo Couling to you out of the Benavides Implement and Hardware account?

Yes, sir.

MR. MITCHELL: Specifically, Judge Meyers, I refer to E-192-1 and I refer to the items, and I would be glad to outline a few of them, Judge Meyers, so the Court will have them before him.

For example, those asked about this morning, E-188-22, appearing on E-192-2, and also, Your Honor, E-188-25, appearing on E-192-2, and that type of item.

The checks specifically -- my questions would be to this witness, what was the nature of those checks, what, if any, agreement did you have with Mr. Couling: did you have any kind of an agreement or understanding with Judge O. P. Carrillo about those checks and what -- and was there an agreement or understanding between you and Judge Carrillo and a combination of D. C. Chapa, Oscar Carrillo, Ramiro Carrillo, Eloy Carrillo, David Carrillo, Jose Saenz, Tomas Elizondo and Roberto Elizondo. Those would be my questions specifically of this witness,

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Judge Meyers.

Yes, sir,

Q And I understand you, Mr. Guajardo, you would plead the Fifth Amendment if asked about those?

MR. MITCHELL: If the Gurt cares for me to be more explicit, I can go down through some of the other items, Judge.

THE MASTER: No, if you're fire to pass the witness --

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, sir.

THE MASTER: -- with the understanding that he is not released?

MR. MITCHELL: Yes, Judge, and my petition to the Court, to the Master, would be to request immunity of this -- to compel this witness and to grant him immunity and my specific request would be to the specific checks and as to any agreement, that is the checks listed on Examiner's E-192-1 through and including 12, so that the Court is aware.

The request would be as to these specific items and any contract or agreement between Rudolfo Couling, the witness, Rogelio Guajardo and/or O. P. Carrillo, and/or D. C. Chapa,

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and/or Ramiro Carrillo, and/or David Carrillo, and/or Eloy Carrillo, Oscar Carrillo, Jose Saenz, Roberto Elizondo and Tomas Elizondo.

I pass this witness, Judge Meyers.

EXAMINATION

BY MR. ODAM:

- Q Mr. Guajardo, is that --
- A Guajardo.
- Q Pardon me for my Spanish. Have we ever met before today?
- A I don't think so.
- Q Do you know my name?
- A (Witness shakes head no.)
- Q My name is John Odam and I work for the Attorney General's office and I would like to ask you a couple of questions also, please, sir.

Mr. Mitchell said that he had represented you in some unrelated matters. Could you please explain for us what those unrelated matters are?

A I respectfully decline and refuse to answer the

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1		questions put to me on the grounds that the answer
2		I might give might tend to incriminate me.
3	Q	Mr. Mitchell said that he had represented you in
4		those unrelated matters before he advised you that
5		you should get other counsel for this particular
6	ļ	matter.
7		My question to you, who is your attorney
8		representing you in this particular matter?
9	A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer any
10		questions put to me.
11	Q	Who is is your attorney who represents you
12	ĺ	MR. ODAM: Strike that.
13	Q	Have you been advised by a counsel to invoke the
14		Fifth Amendment here?
15	A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer any
16.		questions put to me.
17	Q	Could you tell me the name of your attorney who
18	ļ	represents you here today?
19	A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer.
20	Q	Is your attorney who represents you in this
21		matter, is he present in the courtroom today?
22	A	I also respectfully refuse to answer any questions
23		put to me,
24	Q	Who is Paul Ramirez?
25	Å	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer any

ĺ		questions put to me on the grounds that the
2		answer I might give might tend to incriminate me.
3	Q	Did you ever rent any equipment to Benavides
4		Implement and Hardware?
5	A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer any
6		questions put to me.
7	Q	In 1971, what was your position with the water
8		district?
9	A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer the
10		questions put to me on the grounds that the answer
11		might tend to incriminate me.
12	Q	Do you know of any arrangement whereby checks
13		would come from the water district and in turn
14		checks would be issued to you in amounts identical
15		to those which Mr. Mitchell asked you about?
16	· A	I respectfully decline and refuse to answer the
17		questions put to me on the grounds that the
18		answer might tend to incriminate me.
19	Q	Did you ever have any discussion with Rudolfo
20		Couling about having checks made out to Mr. Paul
21		Ramirez?
22	A	I respectfully refuse and decline to answer the
23		questions out to me on the grounds that the
24		answer might tend to incriminate me.
25	Q	Were you ever employed by Benavides Implement and

Hardware?

I respectfully decline and refuse to answer the

questions put to me on the grounds that the answer might tend to incriminate me.

Q Could you please state whether or not you have 1 been indicted for testimony concerning any money 2 3 involved in these checks? I respectfully decline to answer on the grounds Α 5 the answer might tend to incriminate me. Do you know who Raul Ramirez is? Q 6 I respectfully decline to answer the question put 7

to incriminate me.

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MR. ODAM: I pass the witness.

to me on the grounds that the answer might tend

MR. MITCHELL: May we request that we include in our request for the order of the district court the questions put to this witness by counsel, if they are not included within the confines of the one I originally requested?

I wanted to be sure those are answered also.

Yes, you can put anything THE MASTER: in the petition you want. It seems to me that you asked this witness a question in substance that inquired if you represented him on some unrelated matters, but not in any matters connected with this proceeding and further that you had advised him he

needed to get other counsel for this proceeding and he answered those questions.

Now, I am not sure but what he has waived his Fifth Amendment privilege with respect to cross-examination as to what matters you do represent him on and whether or not you told him to get another lawyer and whether or not he has done so, however, that is really not a matter I think for me to decide, because if Mr. Odam should request me to direct him to answer those questions and I did and he refused, it would still be a petition to a district judge to compel him, but -- well, that is where we are.

MR. MITCHELL: Could I have counsel join me in such a petition where this witness is concerned?

THE MASTER: You can certainly make that request.

MR. ODAM: Out of fairness to the witness, and I don't mean this facetiously, I don't know if his attorney is present in the room, but perhaps he has been advised to take the Fifth Amendment to everything

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I asked. Maybe if I asked the questions again, he would at least, since Mr. Mitchell asked him those two questions, which he did testify to, perhaps if I asked him again, he would volunteer those answers.

For one thing, I think it is extraordinary for a witness to take a Fifth
Amendment privilege when his counsel is not
present. It is also extraordinary -- well,
that is all to say I would like to, with
leave of Court and opposing counsel, to
restate the questions.

THE MASTER: You may do so.

- Q (By Mr. Odam) Who represents you here today, who is your lawyer?
- A I respectfully decline to answer the question put to me on the grounds that the answer might tend to incriminate me.
- Q Did you get a lawyer?

Well, let me complete that question.

After Mr. Mitchell had talked to you and you answered the question a while ago, did you contact a lawyer to represent you today?

A I respectfully decline to answer the question put to me on the grounds that the answer may tend to

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incriminate me.

MR. ODAM: No further questions.

MR. MITCHELL: We have nothing further.

Do you recall my request to you when you were under oath on the Friday before our break?

- A No. sir, I haven't been able to get not even one for myself, sir.

A 10 You weren't told by anybody if you did not request 0 11 it there was no way that you could be forced to 12 deliver it? 13 No. str. 14 You at any rate do not have it, do you? 0 15 No. sir, I don't have it. 16 Q You indicated that you did talk to Mr. Lloyd, 17 your attorney, and Mr. Lloyd and you discussed 18 whether or not a letter had been sent. Would you 19 have any objection if we, in your behalf, request 20 a delivery of that 1971 tax return? 21 A I'll have to talk to Mr. Lloyd on that. 22 0 Well, you understand, Mr. Couling, the reason for my interest is that you have previously testified 34 on numerous occasions that you had a partnership 25 with Mr. Ramiro Camillo and Mr. O. P. Carrillo and that --

MR. ODAM: May I nose an objection to this matter. Your Honor?

THE MASTER: Certainly.

MR, ODAM: Your Honor, first of all with respect to the numerous comments with regard to the partnership. I harken back to earlier comments I have made and there has never been a major issue in this case, as a matter of fact it has been excluded from the evidence, the one statementhat this witness did make as to the silent partnership. I think it would be a misrepresentation that we have constantly said there has been a partnership.

Second of all, with respect to income tax returns, it would appear to me that the --where we are in the record right now is this witness on rebuttal, he has been taken on direct, on cross-evamination, which goes to the point of whether or not -- and he was put on rebuttal on direct, whether or not he has rented any equipment, that was the issue in the case. We have tried by way of the 192 and all of it's subparts, all of

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the checks in evidence, to make this record straight on that.

I would object to the relevancy or to lengthen these procedures as to a tay The best evidence, and I don't return. use that really in the legal sense of the word, the best evidence objection, but the best evidence of whether or not he rented equipment is whether or not the Exhibits which we have in evidence, and it would prolong it to simply take this man on continuing to try to get a tay return for a matter that does not relate and is not relevant to the issue that is before us on rebuttal.

THE MASTER: Well. I agree with some of what you say and, Mr. Mitchell, it seems to me that it is abundantly clear if this was the point you are going to make, that he never filed on behalf of any alleged partnership an information return.

MR. MITCHELL: That is right.

THE MASTER: And I don't think unless you have reason to develop that further it needs to be developed any further.

was to be the last, and I object on repetition and relevancy and I continue to urge that objection. I don't see where we go off on trying to attack this witness' credibility when he has testified why he filled it out as a sole proprietorship. He testified back and forth, explaining why, or that he had the conversation with respect to the silent partnership.

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I just don't see where we are going,

I don't see the relevancy of it even on the

credibility of this witness as to whether

or not he rented equipment, it is time
consuming and it is irrelevant and immaterial

and repetitious of the same point made

throughout this case.

MR. MITCHELL: Your Honor, of course,

I had the same objection a long time ago
with relevancy, but I real Roman VII, VIII,

IX, X and XI as being direct allegations of
theft of money by my client. The Examiner
says that is not true.

MR. ODAM: No, I don't say that is not true.

MR. MITCHELL: He said at the very outset.

we have got a conspiracy and then he said no, we have a partnership, and the Court struck his second amended notice with his allegation of conspiracy upon our plea of surprise and that left him, Judge Meyers, with only one leg to stand on and that is this partnership.

Now, I say that if his witness, Mr. Couling's credibility on that point, is weak, is destroyed, which I claim it is, then he fails in his Roman VII, VIII, IX and X because the checks themselves do not run to Judge O. P. Carrillo. It has got to have a connecting link or his case fails him.

Now, incidentally, Judge Meyers, it is also important because I am going to start asking about E-192-1 in light of that partnership. He has either got to fish or cut bait on it, Judge, is what I am driving at.

THE MASTER: Well, I do not know what you intend to ask with respect to E-192, relevant to the -- relative to the partnership, but I do think that at least I do not now see how there can be much more added to

1 this record about the alleged nartnership 2 and why it wasn't made nublic. 3 MR. MITCHELL: Perhans maybe I can satisfy the Judge on that, 5 THE MASTER: Why don't you go on to 6 192? 7 MR. MITCHELL: All right. 8 (By Mr. Mitchell:) Mr. Couling, you testified 0 9 when Mr. Odam nut the questions to you about 10 E-192-1 and how you folks had out it together, 11 you testified, and I am going to try to out the 12 deals together. First you had a deal on the 13 seven hundred and fifty dollar items, do you 14 remember that testimony? 15 Yes, sir. 16 You said every time a seven hundred and fifty 17 dollar item was cranked out of the district, that 18 five hundred dollars of it was to go to Oscar 19 Carrillo and two hundred and fifty dollars of it 20 was to go to Rogelio Guajardo? 21 No, two hundred and fifty dollars was to go to 22 Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers. 23 That is a senarate deal that you made with 24 Ramiro?

No, not on the water district.

 Q I am not arguing with you, I am trying to get your testimony. As I understood you, you took a great deal of time to show like, for example, on page 1 of E-192, a check for five hundred dollars to Oscar Carrillo and a check for two hundred and fifty dollars to Ramiro Carrillo and how you traced it out of the water district to the seven hundred and fifty dollar check and you tied it in to the R-193 and E-186 series of checks, and you are looking at page 1 there?

Yes, sir.

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- Counsel asked you how come did you do that and you said we had a deal, an agreement, and every time we got a check for seven hundred and fifty dollars from the water district, five hundred dollars of it would go to Oscar Carrillo and two hundred and fifty dollars would go to Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers?
- A That's correct.
- Q Who was your deal with?
- On this particular -- the way it was on the water district checks, the checks were brought to me by Rogelio Guajardo and D. C. told me that every time the check was issued for seven hundred and fifty dollars it was supposed to be divided, the

way it is divided here.

- That is my question, you had a partnership composed of Ramiro Carrillo, who was a silent partner, and O. P. Carrillo who was a silent partner and had a deal whereby if you got a check for seven hundred and fifty dollars from the water district, that was told by Rogelio Guajardo and D. C. Chapa that you were supposed to write a check for five hundred dollars to Oscar Carrillo and two hundred and fifty dollars to Ramiro Carrillo and Brothers, is that correct?
- A Yes, sir.
 - You had another deal, as I recall your testimony. It was a little vague, as I recall it, it regarded checks to D. C. Chana, and Rogelio Guajardo and Ramiro Carrillo and these checks were checks in the series or amounts of three hundred dollars to three hundred and fifty dollars. Do you remember those and Mr. Odam says how come did y u give those checks to -- to D. C. Chana or to Rogelio Guajardo and your testimony was. I believe, if you meall it correctly, it was that when we got checks for three hundred dollars to three hundred and fifty dollars, and you called off three of them, that these -- it was an automatic signal to

1	Q	Right. So I do recall correctly, you had a
2		separate deal, and that deal dealt with the
3	1	checks in the amount of three hundred dollars,
4		and that was to go to Ramiro Carrillo and
5		Brothers?
6	A	Right.
7	Q	And that was as to checks from the county?
8	A	Yes, sir.
9	Q	And you had an agreement with this three
10		hundred dollar amount checks coming from the
11		county and that deal was with Ramiro?
12	A	Yes.
13	Q	And the three fifty was D. C. Chapa and Ramiro
14		Carrillo?
15	A	Yes, sir.
16	Q	And you were a partner with D. C., Ramiro, and
17		you never did ever report it that way?
18	A	No, sir.
19	Q [*]	All right. Now, is the Benavides Implement and
20		Hardware account, as reflected by the account,
21		real or not real?
22	A	It is real.
23	Q	The deal that you had on the seven hundred fifty
24		dollar amounts and the three hundred or the three
25		fifty amounts, that was a deal, as I understand,

1		made by the parties beginning in 1971 and
2		continuing until the date shown on E-192-12?
3	A	I don't know what date, but it was to that date.
4	Q	Turn over to E-192-12.
5		Start with it.
6		MR. MITCHELL: Judge Meyers, that is the
7		E-188 it appears on E-192-12.
8	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) The checks on that date right
9		there, there is not a check to either D. C. Chapa
10		or Ramiro Carrillo or O. P. Carrillo, is there?
11	A	No, sir.
12	Q	Or Rogelio Guajardo?
13	A	No, sir.
14	Q	Ramiro or O. P. Carrillo?
15	A	No, sir.
16	Q	So if you had a deal with them, you violated it
17		on December, 1974, because you didn't give them
18		any money?
19		MR. ODAM: I object to that. The deal
20		speaks as to where the checks were issued
21		and there was no agreement as to when they
22		ware given out. I don't see the purpose of
23		this question as to whether or not the deal
24		was violated or not.

MR. MITCHELL: He just got through

testifying and Mr. Odam asked him who the 1 deal was with. I asked him how long the 2 3 deal was to continue and he reaffirmed it and he did the same thing under oath, he 5 said, this is how long it went. Let's look at the evidence and see if it is supported and I say it is not. 7 MR. ODAM: The witness stated it went 8 as far as the exhibit stated it went. 9 THE MASTER: The objection is overruled. 10 MR. MITCHELL: Sure they do. 11 (By Mr. Mitchell) I am going to ask you why the Q 12 checks were out in December, 1974, as to your 13 seven hundred fifty dollar county funds and the 14 15 three hundred and three fifty checks, you spent them on yourself, did you not? 16 17 A We didn't have any checks from the county that month. 18 19 So -- well, you are testifying there were two Q types of businesses in Benavides Implement and 20 Hardware, a business you yourself shared in and a 21 business these other folks shared in? 22 No, sir. 23

Look at those checks, three hundred dollars to

R. M. Couling.

1		It is on Page 12 of E-192, is that you?
2	A	Yes, sir.
3	Q	That is three hundred dollars in December, 1974,
4		am I correct?
5	A	Yes, sir.
6	Q	Step up to 12-17-74, that is to you, is it not?

8	Q	Right above that, 12-16-74, that is a hundred
9		dollars to you?
10	A	Yes, sir.
11	Q	And the one on 12-5-74, that check there?
12	A	Yes, sir.
13	Q	And the six hundred dollar check?

15	Q	And the twenty-five dollars, that is to you, is
16	ŀ	it not?
17	- A	Yes, sir.
18	Q	I want to know there is some testimony on
19		Rudy Couling and Rudolfo Couling and R. M. Couling.
20		Are all of those you?
21	A	Most of them were made out to me.
22	Q	You have a youngster named Rudolfo?
23	A	Yes.
24	Q	Oh, Lord.
25		Well, the Rudolfo, is that you or that

1		youngster?
2	A	That is me.
3	Q	How about R. M.?
4	A	That is me.
5	Q	On 11-11-74, let's look at that month. There is
6		not a check there, and I know the record speaks
7		for itself, there are none in 10-74 or 9-74 or
8		8-74 or in 7-74 to D. C. Chapa, Oscar Carrillo
9		or Ramiro Carrillo or O. P. Carrillo or Oscar
10		Carrillo?
11	A	No, sir.
12	Q	Even though you got checks look at July 22nd,
13		1974. There is a school district check, right
14		and a county check, right, and the school district
15		check?
16		Counsel seemed to, or you did, in your
17		answer, said that there was a difference as to
18		whether you got school money or not. You did get
19		it that month?
20	A	Yes.
21	Q	And there was no checks out to O. P. Carrillo or
22		Ramiro Carrillo or Rogelio Guajardo for that
23		month?
24	A	No.
25		MR. MITCHELL: Judge, I am not going to

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go through each and every one, but I wouli like to refer to E-192-10 and go right on back. The Court can look at those and do the same thing I have done.

- Q (By Mr. Mitchell) That is for payments furnished to him, am I right, there is no check to D. C. Chapa?
- I don't have any check made out directly to D. C. A Chapa.
- And I believe Rogelio Guajardo? Q
- I don't believe you will find any checks after May to any of those individuals.
- 0 Why is that?
- A Because that is when they stopped doing business with the county through me and the water district.
- Thank you. Q

So that your original testimony under oath that you had a partnership or agreement as regards monies coming out of these various agencies is not true?

- A Why not?
- Q It didn't go up to date, does it?
- I have stated until this date on the election in April, 1974. From them on, they did no business with Benavides Implement and Hardware or the

1		water district.
2	Q	E-192-10, prior to that April of 1974 date, I
3		should find a systematic income from the county
4		and water district and school district and a
5		systematic dispersal, is that right?
6	A	Some of them, yes.
7	Q	You find income from that month and no outgoes
8		to O. P., Ramiro or Rogelio Guajardo, is that
9		right?
10	A	There is no checks made out but cash was drawn
11		that I handed to Ramiro.
12	Q	You have a fantastic memory.
13		I noticed awhile ago you talked about in
14		detail, about items that were a transaction with
15		a fellow named Juan Garcia.
16	A	Yes.
17	Q	And R. Ramirez.
18	A	You asked me about Rogelio Guajardo.
19	Q	I asked you specifically whether or not you had
20		a store license and you could not remember that.
21	A	You asked me in 1971 and this is before I sold it
22	Q	I asked you what you sold your partnership for
23		and you could not tell me that.
24	A	There is no money involved and there is none to
25		date.

1 MR. MITCHELL: Your Honor, I am not 2 going to belabor the record, but if the 3 Court looks at E-192-9, it will speak to itself and this comes on back prior to the 5 date the witness has fixed for the termination of that relationship. 7 THE WITNESS: The same is true with 8 E-192-8. MR. ODAM: Your Honor, I have no 10 objection to calling attention to that and 11 letting it speak to itself. It speaks to 12 pay-outs. 13 MR. MITCHELL: And as taken with the 14 witness' sworn testimony, which to me is the critical matter, a witness testifying under 16 oath, which is not supported in my opinion 17 by E-192, that series -- well, Your Honor, 18 you may take notice of that. 19 0 (By Mr. Mitchell) Now, I am going to ask you some 20 other questions about some of your testimony, 21 Mr. Couling. I believe you do testify -- strike 22 that, please. 23 You did -- the Benavides Implement and

Hardware did purchase a truck, didn't it?

Yes, sir, but I don't know the date.

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1	Q	All right.
2		MR. MITCHELL: And, Your Honor, I
3		would like to refer the Court to 1616 in
4		the record, 1633.
5	Q	(By Mr. Mitchell) You denied owning any rental
6		equipment, didn't you?
7	A	Not for rental, no, sir.
8	Q	You did own a truck?
9	A	Not for rental.
10	Q	That truck was depreciated on your tax return?
11	A	Yes, but Ramiro Carrillo had the use of that
12		truck from the day I bought it.
13	Q	And I know your position and it shows your truck
14		is on your income tax return and you show a
15		depreciation on that personally.
16	A	Yes.
17	Q	So you now know you have to change that testimony
18		and that check was from Continental Oil Company,
19		E-188-1, that is the purchase of one of them?
20	A	Yes, sir.
21	Q	And that truck was carried on your personal tax
22		return and you took the depreciation of it?
23	A	Yes.
24	Q	And you are telling this Court
25	A	I never rented that truck to anyone.

- get the benefit of a personal deduction?
- A Yes, sir.

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- Q And the store counter, of course, you -- I believe you testified that didn't happen?
- No. sir. A
- Q And I want to ask you a question about that water

1	ĺ	well rig. How come were you out looking for 1:?
2	A	Ramiro was looking for it and he wanted to fix it
3	Q	Counsel asked you a question awhile ago and you
4	,	knew it was there, as recently as three months
5		ago, you went out looking for it, is that true?
6	A	No, sir, I don't know when it was.
7	Q	You went out at the request of Ramiro Carrillo
8		looking for it?
9	A	He said let's take a drive. He said he didn't
10		know where it was.
11	Q	But you knew that was his rig?
12	A	I didn't know it was his, sir.
13	Q	But you did know there was one in existence and
14		you knew it was used in condemnation and it was
15		turned over by the Carrillos and rented to the
16		county?
17	A	I didn't know the agreement on it.
18	Q	Was that last year you and Ramiro went out
19		looking for it?
20	A	I don't know.
21	· Q	And it was determined that Archer Parr took it
22		and sold it?
23	A	I don't know, sir.
24	Q	So when Mr. Odam asked you about the rig, what
25		was wrong with telling the truth, you knew about

1		the rig and you went out to try to get it and it
2		had been sold by Archer Parr and you knew that?
3	A	I didn't know who it belonged to. As far as I
4		know, the county owned it.
5	Q	Did Ramiro Carrillo tell you he owned it?
6.	A	No, sir, he never told me that.
7	Q	And he was out hunting for it and he didn't tell
8		you that he owned it?
9	A	I don't know, sir.
10	Q	You all didn't talk about that on the way to
11		Victoria as to whose it was?
12	A	No, sir.
13	Q	Now, of course, I suppose that all well, I
14		think it is clear and I think the record reflects
15		that notwithstanding all of the documents in
16		E-192-1 through Benavides Implement and Hardware,
17 -		that none of that existed?
18	A	No.
19	Q	That is not true with all of 192-1?
20	A	I never had any equipment to rent, sir.
21	Q	You are not telling us the accounts show in
22		E-192-1, you are not saying they are all
23		fictitious?
24	A	Some of them are legitimate checks, legitimate
25		small checks.

	telling us that didn't happen?

A 8 Q And, Rudolfo, that is a real transaction? 9 A Yes, sir. 10 Q Coming on down -- how about Texas Commission 11 for Public Education, that was a real 12 transaction? 13 A Yes, sir. 14 Q And a cash transaction of seventy-five dollars, 15 that was a real transaction? 16 Yes, sir. A 17 And without going through all of them, payments Q 18 to I.R.S. for employee withholding. 19 Correct. A 20 Q And I believe payments to the Texas Employment 21 Commission? 22 A Yes, sir. 23 Q And donations to the school? 24 Yes. 25 You are not telling us that was phony? Q

23		the ones we have discussed and the ones shown,

See if you 21 can find that one. 22 Is that the one? A 23 Q Yes, it is.

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All right.

1 (Whereupon, the above-mentioned 2 documents were handed to the Master by 3 Mr. Mitchell.) 5 MR. ODAM: Is that the check to 6 International Harvester? 7 MR. MITCHELL: No. 8 THE MASTER: This is E-188-143. MR. MITCHELL: And E-188- --10 THE MASTER: 35. 11 MR. MITCHELL: I might have misunderstood 12 the witness' testimony, but I believe he said 13 he gave it to Judge Carrillo. 14 THE WITNESS: No, sir, I said just that 15 one. 16 MR. MITCHELL: That is the reason I 17 did it, because obviously it is a different 18 handwriting. 19 THE MASTER: Yes. 20 MR. ODAM: May I, for my own 21 clarification, who is the check made out to, 22 the 188-143? 23 THE MASTER: S.M.T. It is endorsed 24 Southwestern Motor Transport. 25 THE WITNESS: We have not testified to

1 that one. 2 MR. ODAM: I don't recall testimony on 3 that one. THE MASTER: I did not -- on 143, there 5 was testimony on 43, but not 143. 6 MR. ODAM: Yes, about International 7 Harvester. 8 MR. MITCHELL: Well, we will try it 9 with those two, Judge. 10 Q (By Mr. Mitchell) They are in the same handwriting? 11 I never testified they were in the same handwriting. 12 MR. ODAM: That was to Ramiro Carrillo. 13 MR. MITCHELL: Mr. Odam --14 MR. ODAM: I am sorry. 15 0 (By Mr. Mitchell) Well, did you testify that 16 the reason you recall the Edwards Furniture 17 transaction was the handwriting appeared to be in 18 Judge Carrillo's handwriting? 19 It does look like it, sir. A 20 But you didn't see him sign it, of course? Q 21 A No. sir. 22 Q And, I believe, Mr. Couling, your testimony has 23 been, and this is a negative way to ask you,

but you had no deal as regards O. P. Carrillo, as

regards disbursements of any of these funds from

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1		the school or county or water district, that
2		your deal ran with D. C. Chapa, Ramiro or
3		Guajardo?
4	A	I don't remember, sir, as to testifying as to
5		O. P.
6	Q	You didn't have a deal with him on the seven
7		hundred fifty or the three hundred dollar amounts?
8	A	No, sir.
9	Q	And at least, will you go with me this far, to the
10		best of all you-all's work, as you testified, went
11		into here with this young man that was from the
12		D.P.S. and the attorneys, there were no other checks
13		other than those shown to O. P. Carrillo?
14	A	I don't know, sir. I don't know if we found them
15		all or not, sir.
16	Q	Well, if there had been some more, certainly you
17		would have put them on there?
18	A	If we found them, yes, sir.
19	Q	The disbursements made by you out of the
20		Benavides Implement and Hardware account to you
21		and by you to you, would some of those be placed
22		in your ranch or personal account or special
23		account?
24	A	Well, it was transferred out from the store to
25		those accounts and back and forth.

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1	Q	To the extent deposits were made out of the
2		Benavides Implement and Hardware account into
3		your various other accounts, E-192 does not
4		reflect the end account those monies would be
5		transferred to?
6	A	It says advice of charts, sir. It could have been
7	İ	back and forth.
8	Q	You are not testifying under oath or telling this
9		Court that D. C. Chapa or O. P. or Ramiro Carrillo
10		had any dealings into your special or personal or
.11		ranch account?
12	A	No, sir.
13	Q	So to the extent of those, you get the benefit
14	t	of those?
15	A	It was transfers from my account to the store, sir.
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Q Now, I noticed in E-192 --

> MR. MITCHELL: And this suestion is nut to the witness. Your Honor, to further support our objection, four Honor, to the chart and summary.

- That you testified that Mr. Don Lee, and you and Ms. Levatino and Mr. Flusche drew it up?
- A Yes, sir, we all worked together on it.
- 0 Yes, sir, I understand that was your testimony. My question is that I notice that anybody can. looking at it, that it is written in several different handwritings, and I wader if you could identify for the record whose handwriting, for example, is E-192-1 to and including 4, whose handwriting is that?
- Α I can't be sure, it looks like Ms. Levatino.
- You can't tellus?

No.

- Who is the handwriting of E-192-5 and 6 in?
- That looks like Don Lee, sir.
- It looks like it?

Yes, sir.

- But you can't testify under oath?
- No. it looks like his.
- And whose handwriting is E-192-7, 8 and 9 in?

1 Α Those three of them, they are Mr. Flusche. 2 0 Mr. Flusche? 3 Yes. 4 And E-192-10, 11 and 12, whose handwriting is that 5 fn? 6 It looks like -- it looks like Don Lee's, sir. 7 But you can't tell us positively? Q 8 Α He was working on it, sir. 9 0 All right. 10 But I can't tell for sure. 11 All right, which one did you write? 12 None of these, sir. 13 You didn't -- none of these in 192 is in your 14 handwriting? 15 A No. str. 16 What was your role in it? 17 A I was checking back and forth, sir. 18 As a matter of fact they had it all drawn up and 19 handed it to you and said look at it? 20 No. sir. Α 21 Isn't that right? 22 No. sir, we worked in their room, sir. 23 All right, and to the extent that we are looking -24 MR. MITCHELL: Further, Your Honor, 25 in connection with my objection to the chart.

1 And to the extent that we looked at the checks 2 from 1971, those earlier checks through and includ-3 ing -- really to 1973, that information you got off -- was gotten off of R-91, 92 and 93, am I 5 correct? 6 A Yes, str. 7 There is no original of any of that documentation 8 that is used to go into E-192, am I correct, that 9 you know of? 10 I don't know, sir, 11 Well, the deposit slips of 189 series, that would 12 be 1971 to 1974, that would be at least the 13 original of that -- the original information on 14 that would be available, am I correct? 15 the -- 189 series of evidence here is the deposit 16 slips from 1971 to 1974, am I correct? 17 I believe so, sir. 18 And so that the record is clear, Mr. Couling. 19 the deposit slips do not have on them where the 20 money came from? 21 No. sir. 22 Not at all? 0 23 No, sir, some of them and some don't. 24 And certainly E-190 checks, those began in late 25

72, if I recall, and the same way with 188 so that

1 those earlier entries in -- in E-192 really came 2 from R-91, I believe, 92 and 93, is that correct, 3 or do you know? 4 I don't know, sir. 5 Well, if there are not checks showing -- shown 0 6 in any of the evidence for 1971 and E-192, that 7 gnes back to 71 and R-92, that those 1971 checks, 8 it would be assumed beginning at 4-12-71, in 9 fact the same date that would be the local source 10 of that information R-92, am I correct? 11 I don't know, sir. A 12 Now, of course, Mr. Couling, you understand that 13 what you have testified to is that the Benavides 14 Implement and Hardware account, that is to the 15 extent of the seven hundred and fifty dollars and 16 three hundred dollar checks were fraudulent 17 appropriations of money for the water district, 18 the Duval County and the school district were con-19 cerned, you understand that, that is what in 20 effect you are telling us? 21 A 22

We just talked about the county and the water district, sir.

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And the school district, I am saying if what you are telling us is true that there was a fraudulent, criminal appropriation of the money from those

1 three entities, is that correct? 2 Yes, sir. 1 And that you took part of that money to your own benefit and to your own use as shown by that 5 Evhibit? . I took part of it, yes, sir, 7 And you understand that is also a crime? . A Yes, sir. And you freely participated in that criminal act 10 and freely appropriated the money and freely used 11 the money and that, of course, is part of the deal 12 you made for your testimony in this case, am I 13 correct, that we induired shout from you earlier? 14 Would you renhrase that? 15 I said --16 MR. MITCHELL: Perhaps that was a very --17 it was a very terrible question and I will 18 start over again. 19 I said to the extent that you marticipated in the 20 proceeds of these sums of money thus procured, 21

And you have been indicted for the commission of crimes? Yes, sir.

you understand you have committed a crime?

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A Yes, sir.

1 But the crimes for which you have been indicted 2 do not include these crimes? 3 Α I don't know, sir. 4 0 That's right, but you understand that the deal 5 you made, the contract you made with the State 6 of Texas, Mr. John Blanton, representing the 7 Attorney General, and Mr. Rudolfo Guerra, repre-8 senting the District Attorney, would include 9 immunity from prosecution on all crimes shown 10 by wrongful appropriations in E-192? 11 Yes, sir. 12 So you wouldn't have any qualms, one way or the 13 other, about how the ax would fall, you wouldn't 14 care one way or the other? 15 Α I just made a deal, sir. 16 And you, of course, are carrying out your end of 17 the deal and would expect that you would not be 18 prosecuted for example a check you got as recently 19 as December, 1974, you got one, two, three, four, 20 five, you got six, seven of them, am I correct? 21 A Yes, sir. 22 In December of 74? 0 23 Yes, sir. A

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You got seven of them?

Yes, sir.

1 And, of course, the record reflects that Mr. 2 Chana got none that month and Mr. O. P. Carrillo 3 got none and Mr. Rogelio Guajardo got none and 4 whereas a matter of fact none of the Carrillos 5 got any and it all went to you or Cleofus Gonzalez, 6 is that right? 7 In some stores that we pay accounts on, sir. 8 Q Yes, sir. 9 I believe I only had one, two, three, four --10 just four checks you were referring to. 11 At any rate, if those checks came to you oursuant 12 to what you have told this court that would be a 13 wrongful theft by you? 14 Α I didn't believe on those four in 1974. I believe 15 everything was sold legally to the individuals 16 it was billed to, sir. 17 We had gotten legal by then? 18 I don't see no county checks on here. 19 Well, look at the previous month, on that other 20 nage, we went through that a while ago, 21 showed two or three instances where you had county 22 checks and monies going all to you on E-192-11, 23 It doesn't go all to me, it went out to the 24 individuals that it was applied from, sir,

Well. I understand that but you are saying that

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it all legal?

- A Some of it, I can't testify to what was legal and what wasn't legal, Mr. Mitchell.
- O I know it is a strain on you to tell us which was legal and which was not legal.

MR. ODAM: Your Honor, this man is not a lawyer and he cannot testify as to what is legal and what is not legal.

THE MASTER: That is correct.

MR. ODAM: He shouldn't draw conclusions because he can't testify as to what is legal and what is illegal and Mr. Mitchell knows that.

MR. MITCHELL: I put it to the witness, the reason for characterizing it is because it is -- whether it is legal or illegal because. Mr. Couling, you testified here under oath Friday a week ago that the transactions were -- the transactions with the seven hundred and fifty dollars and the three hundred dollar transactions were illegal transactions and lo and behold upon examination of the records you find that transaction doesn't carry all the way through on E-192-11 and you have changed your story on that and

1 now your story is a legal and lawful trans-2 action at least to E-192-11. 3 As long as checks were issued from the water district or county for seven hundred and fifty 5 dollars or three hundred dollars the checks were 6 reissued back to the Carrillos. 7 That is not true on page E-192. 8 I said as long as it was true from the county or 9 water district. 10 And if these weren't in amounts of seven hundred 11 and fifty dollars and went to you they were legal? 12 No. sir, I didn't say that either. 13 Q Well, I have got to -- well, tell me, tell the 14 Court, E-192-10, there is a lot of them from the 15 school district, from the county, and look in the 16 middle there in March, not a dime to Ramiro and 17 not a dime to O. P., not a dime to Farm and Ranch, 18 not a dime to anybody but you. 19 There is some there for Charlie's Trucks that 20 went to Ramiro, 21 O That went from you to Charlie's Trucks and from 22 Charlie's Trucks to Ramiro? 23 I gave the checks to Ramiro and he in turn baid 24 it to Charlie's Trucks. 25

O For Charlie's Trucks?

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1	A	Wes, str.
2	Q	For a thousand dollars?
3	A	There is one to Farm and Ranch for thirteen
4		sivty.
5	Q	That is a part of the deal that you had on the
6		seven hundred and fifty dollars?
7	A	No. sir.
8	Q	Is that part of the deal where you got three
9		hundred dollars?
10	A	Not the Farm and Ranch, it might be included, s'r.
11	Q	As a matter of fact, it is probably a legitimate
12		sale to Farm and Ranch?
13	A	No, sir, I never didselt anything to Farm and
14		Ranch and I never bought anything from them.
15	Q	All right.
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17		(Discussion off the record.)
18		THE MASTER: Mr. Mitchell, are you
19		about to finish your thing?
20		MR. MITCHELL: I am moving to Judge.
21		I have a check list that I am going down.
22		THE MASTER: Let's take a break.
23		MR. MITCHELL: Okey.
24		THE MASTER: And you can check your list.
25		MR. MITCHELL: Okay, Judge.
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(Whereupon the hearing was in mecess from 11:45 a.m. until 12:00 noon.)

THE MASTER: You may proceed, Mr. Mitchell.

MR, MITCHELL: Thank you, Your Honor.

I don't believe I have any further questions
of this witness, Judge Meyers.

RE-EXAMINATION

BY MR. ODAM:

Q Mr. Couling, Mr. Mitchell has asked you a number of questions about checks that went to you or R. Carrillo and Brothers or R. Couling Special Account, checks like that.

Have you had occasion to examine E-192-1 through 12 and to determine the number of -- or the amount of money you received as identified or shown by those checks? Have you done that?

- Yes, I had worked on a scratch bad on it and I left it at home, sir.
- Q Did you also compute the amount of money that was

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1		written out to R. Carrillo and Brothers, the
2		total amount?
3	A	Yes, sir.
4	Q	And to O. P. Carrillo, Oscar Carrillo?
5	A	Yes, sir.
6	Q	So you figured out in the total amount that you
7		got and the total amount that Farm and Ranch
8		Supply got, is that correct?
9	A	Wes, sir.
10	Q	That is from the first page of the chart through-
11		out?
12	A	Yes, sir.
13	Q	I take it you do not have that there with you?
14	A	No. sir.
15	Q	And where is that?
16	A	That is at home.
17	Q	At home in Benavides?
18	A	Yes, sir.
19	Q	Mr. Mitchell asked you about some of these
20		checks in cash, and you caught my attention when
21		you said you hadn't been asked what you did with
22		that money in cash.
23		When there were checks made out here in
24		cash, all of let's refer, for example, to one,

there is a large one here on page 2 or on E-192-2.

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1 It is check number 165 in the amount of three 2 thousand three hundred dollars written on Sestem-3 her the 8th, 1971. This is on about a quarter of a way down on E-192-2. Do you see that 5 entry there? 6 Yes, sir. 7 Now, that three thousand three hundred dollars, 8 did you personally receive that full amount? 9 No, sir. A 10 What did you do with that three thousand three 11 hundred dollars after you received that amount? 12 I don't know the eract amount that I gave Ramiro, 13 but I gave Ramiro some of that cash money, sir. 14 And what would be your basis for giving Ramiro 15 Carrillo the money? 16 Just checks that were sometime -- he caused to be 17 billed to me, made to the county and then in 18 turn he told me that was money that he needed 19 for that particular month and I was supposed to 20 make him either a check or give him cash for it. 21 Now, when you would get or write some of these 22 checks out in cash, such as that, I take it at 23 times you would distribute the cash to other 24 people?

The only one I distributed, sir, was to Ramiro.

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1	Q	You did not distribute any money to O. P.
2		Carrillo?
3	A	No, sir.
4		MR. ODAM: I have no further questions.
5		MR. MITCHELL: If I might be permitted,
6		Your Honor. I probably should have previously
7		induired about it, if I might be permitted
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9	}	to ask this further question.
10		THE MASTER: You may proceed.
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14		RE-EXAMINATION
15	ВУ	MR. MITCHELL:
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17	Q	Mr. Couling, on page 1912 of the record of your
18		testimony you stated that the rent was increased
19		to fifteen hundred dollars to include the payment
20		of the to be made on the root plow as well as
21		on the tractor, do you recall that testimony?
22	A	I guess so, I don't remember exactly but I believe
23		it was.
24	Q	Well, the problem I'm having with that is, that

the tractor, now we know was bought on 12-12 of 72

and the root blow was bought almost immediately thereafter the first part of 7° and yet your testimony is that the rent was not increased until sometime in August or September of 1973.

A I can't remember exactly what date it was, Mr.

Mitchell.

MR. MITCHELL: For the purpose of reference, I'm referring to page 1912 and 1916 testimony taken on 11-21.

I have no further enestions to be put to this witness, Judge.

MR. ODAM: We have no questions, Your Honor.

THE MASTER: All right, now what instructions should I give Mr. Couling? Is he still to be available on standby because you have some other witnesses and will these other witnesses --

MR. MITCHELL: I think, Your Honor, we would be satisfied if Mr. Coulingwould remain on sort of a daily call basis. We do have -- we do have Mr. D. C. Chapa and we do have Mr. Oscar Carrillo coming in along with Roberto and Tomas Elizondo and Mr. D. H. Carrillo.

1 THE MASTER: All right, Mr. Couling, you 2 are excused to go back to your home. You may --3 THE WITNESS: Just give me notice about two or three hours, that is all. 5 THE MASTER: All right, that is fine. Thank you very much. 7 (Discussion off the record.) 8 9 MR. MITCHELL: It is back to you, John. 10 MR. ODAM: Is it back to me? 11 THE MASTER: It is back to you, Mr. 12 Odam. 13 MR. MITCHELL: Yes, it is back to you 14 now, Mr. Odem. 15 MR. ODAM: We have no further witnesses, 16 Your Honor. 17 THE MASTER: You rest? 18 MR. ODAM: Yes. Your Honor. 19 MR. MITCHELL: Your Honor, we were 20 able to locate the whereabouts of Mr. D. C. 21 Chapa, Judge Carrillo's father, and his 22 mother became ill and they are taking her 23 to the hospital here in Corpus Christi. 24 It is now 12:15 and I don't have any 25 hopes of him or Oscar Carrillo being here by

our break time. I do anticipate they will be here by 8:30 in the morning, am I right, Judge, and I would like to have the permission of the Courtett prepare a motion based on the testimony of Rogelio, Ramiro and Jose Saenz, which I can do this afternoon and have filed this afternoon, Judge Meyers.

Other than that --

THE MASTER: Let's --

MR. MITCHELL: Pardon me, Judge Meyrs, I didn't mean to --

THE MASTER: Don't you think we can excuse these gentlemen and have this of the record?

MR. MITCHELL: Yes.

THE MASTER: Thank you very much.

(Whereupon the hearing was in recess at 12:20 p.m. on December the 29th, 1975, until 8:30 a.m. on December 30th, 1975.)
