## ELECTION OF SPEAKER.

The Honorable Secretary then announced that the next business in order is the election of a Speaker.

Hon. T. D. Rowell of Marion county nominated Hon. W. C. McKamy of Dallas county.

Hon. W. B. Goodner of Erath county nominated Hon. Chester H. Terrell of Bexar county.

Hon. Dwight L. Lewelling of Dallas county seconded the nomination of Hon. W. C. McKamy.

Hon. J. M. Wagstaff of Taylor county seconded the nomination of Hon. Chester H. Terrell.

Hon. W. A. Tarver of Navarro county seconded the nomination of Hon. W. C. McKamy.

Hon. Louis J. Wortham of Tarrant county seconded the nomination of Hon. Chester H. Terrell.

Hon. A. D. Rogers of Wise county seconded the nomination of Hon. W. C. McKamy.

Hon. D. M. Reedy of Smith county seconded the nomination of Hon. Chester H. Terrell.

The Honorable Secretary then appointed the following tellers: Messrs. Allison, Lewelling, Henry of Bowie, Mills, Calvin; Mendell, Fuller and Lane.

The ballots, being counted by the tellers, resulted as follows:

Hon. Chester H. Terrell received 87 votes.

Hon. W. C. McKamy received 51 votes.

Hon. J. C. Hunt received 1 vote.

Hon. W. C. McKamy then moved that the election of Hon. Chester H. Terrell be made unanimous.

The motion prevailed.

The Honorable Secretary then declared Hon. Chester H. Terrell of Bexar county duly elected Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature.

The Honorable Secretary then appointed the following committee to escort the Speaker-elect to the Speaker's stand:

Messrs. Reedy, Bartley and Humphrey.

The committee having performed its duty, the Honorable Secretary of State then administered the oath of office to the Speaker-elect and presented him to the House as Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature.

Mr. Terrell then addressed the House, thanking the members for the honor conferred upon him.
