5	SEC	CTION I. PURPOSE

7		This Michelle Chingwa Education Honorarium Act is hereby enacted to provide a gift to		
8	hon	or Tribal Citizens that are obtaining post-secondary educational opportunities and repeals and		
9	repl	aces the original and amended Michelle Chingwa Education Assistance Act including WOS		
10	200	7-005, WOS 2014-010 and WOS 2018-XX.

13	SEC	CTION II. GENERAL WELFARE EXCLUSION		
14				
15	As s	stated by the requirements of the United States Internal Revenue Section 139E, the Michelle		
16	Chi	ngwa Education Honorarium meets the criteria of the United States Public Law 113-168,		
17	Trib	oal General Welfare Exclusion Act of 2014 and WOS 2017-002 General Welfare Statute.		
18				
19	DE	FINITIONS		
20				
21	A.	"Accredited" shall apply to those post-secondary institutions of higher education, including		
22		vocational schools, that are accredited by an agency or organization recognized by either a		
23		domestic or foreign government or another accrediting agency that processes validations for		
24		colleges, universities, and other institutions of higher learning.		
25				
26	В.	"Citizen" shall mean an enrolled member of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa		
27	_,	Indians.

29	C.	"Department" shall mean the Niigandiwin Education Department that is overseen by the		
30	<b>C.</b>	Executive Branch.

32	D.	"Executive" shall means the Tribal Chairperson or his/her designee		
33				
34	E.	"Executive Directive" in accordance with the WOS 2015-19, means a directive issued by		
35		the Tribal Chairperson that establishes basic internal rules of procedure, or guidelines for the		
36		Executive Department and employees and does not impact Tribal Citizens or entities outside		

1		of the Executive Branch.		
2				
3	F.	"GPA" shall mean a student's Grade Point Average reported by an institution on a student's		
4		transcript for the academic term.		
5				
6	G.	"LTBB" shall mean The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians.		
7				
8	H.	"MCEH" shall mean the Michelle Chingwa Education Honorarium Program.		
9				
10	I.	"Release of the Information Form" shall mean a form completed by the student and		
11		provided by the LTBB Education Department that gives permission to the department for 3 <sup>rd</sup>		
12 13		party communication with the institution.		
14	J.	"Student Success Plan" shall mean a plan that is designed for the student by the Education		
15		Department that addresses financial and/or academic goals of the student ensure student		
16		success.		
17				
18	K.	"Student Success Planning Session" shall mean a meeting facilitated by the Higher		
19		Education Specialist, the Academic Services Coordinator, and/or the Education Director		
20		with the student which is intended to develop a plan which addresses financial and/or		
21		academic goals and connect them to the appropriate supports and resources that are		
22 23		available.		
24	L.	"Tribe" or "LTBB" shall mean the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians.		
25				
26	SE	CTION III. APPLICATION		
27				
28	A.	The program shall be administered by the Education Department.		
29				
30	В.	Honorariums shall be paid directly to the student.		
31				
32	C.	The program shall fund Honorariums to Tribal Citizens attending:		
33				
34		1. Accredited post-secondary institutions of higher education located within a Tribal		
35		Reservation, the United States or a foreign country;		
36				

1 2		2.	Tribally controlled colleges that are seeking accreditation;	
3		3.	Other colleges or programs approved by Tribal Resolution.	
5	D.	Hono	orariums shall be administered in the following manner:	
6				
7		1.	Deadlines are established as follows:	
8				
9			a. Fall, October 15 <sup>th</sup>	
10				
11			<b>b.</b> Winter/Spring, February 15th	
12				
13			c. Summer, June 15th	
14				
15			<b>d.</b> Deadlines for trimesters, quarters or non-standard terms shall be thirty (30)	
16			days after the beginning of the session. "Non-standard Term" shall mean a	
17			course term that is not considered to be a semester, trimester or quarter as	
18			defined by the United States Department of Education.	
19				
20			<b>e.</b> Deadlines for accelerated courses that fall within a standard term but begin	
21			after the term begins shall be thirty (30) days after the beginning of the	
22			session.	
23				
24		2.	The Honorariums shall be granted up to the deadline for each semester,	
25			trimester, quarter, non-standard term, or accelerated course.	
26				
27		3.	Honorarium applications submitted after the deadlines shall be classified as late.	
28			Late applications shall not be funded, but such late applications may be	
29			petitioned to the Education Department for further review.	
30				
31		4.	The Honorariums shall be calculated on a per credit hour basis with five (5)	
32			classifications: (Credits at foreign accredited post-secondary institutions of	
33			higher education, colleges and universities shall be calculated using the	
34			appropriate United States credit equivalency rate).	
35				
36			a. Classifications:	

1		
2	i.	Class one (1) are prior learning credit courses or courses that are
3		sponsored by Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians and
4		provided nearly free or minimal cost to the student.
5		
6	ii.	Class two (2) are Junior or community colleges classes.
7		
8	iii.	Class three (3) are Four-year colleges or four-year degree
9		programs classes.
10		
11	iv.	Class four (4) are Graduate level courses.
12		
13	v.	Class five (5) are free courses such as the free online courses.
14		
15	<b>b.</b> The 1	imit and level of each Honorarium classification shall be:
16		
17	i.	Set by the Executive Directive.
18		
19	ii.	Credit limits should not exceed eighteen (18) credits per semester
20		for undergraduate courses (class 1,2,3, 5) or twelve (12) credits per
21		semester for graduate courses (class 4).
22		
23	iii.	Honorarium levels for Class 1 shall assist with the cost pf program
24		expenses plus smaller amount to cover other student expenses (i.e.
25		\$25 per credit hour to cover travel, meals, etc.).
26		
27	iv.	Honorarium levels for Class 2, 3, 4 respectively shall follow a
28		general ratio of 2/3/4 (i.e. Class 2, \$150, Class 3, \$250, Class 4,
29		\$350) and should be raised or lowered to accommodate the budget
30		but an attempt should be made to keep the levels as consistent as
31		possible to help students plan from semester to semester.
32		
33	<b>v.</b>	Honorarium levels for Class 5 shall be limited to a small per credit
34		hour amount to cover miscellaneous expenses (i.e. \$15 per credit to
35		cover books, materials, etc.).
36		

1			vi.	Students enrolled in multiple level of classes, the Honorarium shall
2				be awarded at the appropriate level for each course or class.
3				
4	E.	To be	eligible for an	Honorarium the student must:
5				
6		1.	Be an enrolle	d Citizen of the Tribe;
7				
8 9		2.	Be enrolled in (C).	in an educational institution or program as delineated in Section III,
10				
11		3.	Maintain a 2.	0 GPA during the course of an academic term (subject to petition).

14	SECT	ION IV	. REST	TRICTIONS
15				
16	A.	If a stu	dent withdraw	s from a course, their next Honorarium shall be reduced by that
17	equiva	lent am	ount, unless ot	therwise petitioned.
18				
19	В.	Studen	nts will not be t	funded for a course more than twice unless the student can prove
20	they no	eed to ta	ake the class o	ver to complete a degree requirement but shall be limited to three (3)
21	times.

24	SECT	ION V.	REGI	ULATIONS REQUIRED
25				
26	A.	The D	epartment shal	l develop regulations for this statute for Tribal Council approval;
27	howev	er, the i	mplementation	n of the statute shall not be delayed by approval of regulations.
28				
29	В.	The re	gulations shall	define any petition process. Petitions authorized by this statute shall
30	be heard by the Education Department.

32	C.	The re	gulations shall	require the following minimum reports to Tribal Council, and upon
33	reques	t to othe	er Tribal sub-e	ntity:

35		1.	` ´	nmary reports for each semester's Honorariums in March, July, and
36		Octobe	er and a year-e	and summary each January for all the previous year's Honorariums.

2	2.	Each report shall contain at a minimum:

5		earned and most recent contact information.

7		<b>b.</b> Number of students in each class of Honorariums

9		c. Number of semester credits in each class of Honorariums

23	This E	ducation Honorarium Act shall be included in the Executive budget and funded	
24	annually with	a minimum budget of million (\$1,000,000.00) dollars per fiscal year.

27	SECTION V	II. SEVERABILITY

29	If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or portion of this Statute is, for		
30	any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion		
31	shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect		
32	the validity of	the remaining portions thereof.
