Definitions

"MacID" refers to the services and functionality provided by MacID for iOS, MacID for OS X, the MacID website and may also refer to the creator or creators and affiliates of MacID.

"We", "us", or "our" refers to the creator or creators of MacID.

"You" refers to the user of the software, who is agreement of this document by the use of MacID.

"Data" refers to digital information stored on Mac or iOS devices.
