

**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2013**

For information only/not an official document

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

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SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2013**

AFRICA

Central African Republic – SG update reports on situation and BINUCA

Resolution 2088 (2013) of 24 January 2013

Para.3: further requests the Secretary-General to provide an update report of the situation on the ground by 30 June 2013 and every six months thereafter.

Letter from the President of the Security Council dated 5 July 2013 (S/2010/398)

Penultimate para: the members of the Security Council have taken note that there are delays in the issuance of the aforementioned report and look forward to receive it as close to the due date as possible.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be submitted in early August 2013.

Guinea-Bissau – SG reporting on Resolution 2048

Resolution 2103 (2013) of 22 May 2013

Para.17: requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council regular reports, every 180 days, on the implementation of this resolution and to continue to provide concurrent report on the implementation of resolution 2048 (2012) every 90 days restarting with the adoption of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 22 August 2013.

Liberia – UNMIL

Resolution 2066 (2012) of 17 September 2012

Para. 1: decides that the mandate of UNMIL shall be extended until 30 September 2013.

The UNMIL mandate expires on 30 September 2013.

A meeting of the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries is expected to take place in August 2013

Para. 20: further requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed of the situation on the ground as UNMIL continues its reconfiguration, progress toward achieving the transitional benchmarks, and development of a transition plan with the Government of Liberia, inclusive of priority elements cited in paragraphs 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, and to provide to it a midterm report no later than 28 February 2013 and a final report no later than 15 August 2013 on the implementation of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 15 August 2013.

Sudan (Sudan/South Sudan)

Resolution 2046 (2012) of 2 May 2012

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to consult with the African Union on the implementation of this resolution and the decisions of the AU PSC, to work closely with the AUHIP in support of its facilitation efforts, and to inform the Security Council within 15 days and in two week intervals thereafter on the status of compliance by Sudan, South Sudan, and the SPLM-N with the decisions set forth in this resolution, and expresses its intention, in the event that any or all of the parties have not complied with the decisions set forth in this resolution, to take appropriate additional measures under Article 41 of the Charter as necessary.

S/PRST/2012/19 (2012) of 31 August 2012

Penultimate para.: recalls its Resolution 2046 and reiterates its request to the Secretary-General, in consultation with the AUHIP, the Chair of IGAD, and the Chairman of the AU Commission, to report to the Council by September 2 on the status of negotiations. The Security Council also looks forward to reviewing the AU's determinations as indicated in paragraph 18 of the AUPSC Communiqué of August 3 and requests in this regard the Secretary General to report to the Council thereafter on the status of negotiations, including detailed proposals on all outstanding issues.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council in August 2013.

Sudan – SG reports on UNISFA

Resolution 2104 (2013) of 29 May 2013

Para. 21: requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform the Council of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate in 60 day intervals, and continue to bring to the Council's immediate attention any serious violations of the above referenced agreements;

The report of the Secretary-General dated XX July 2013 (S/2013/xx) is before the Council.

Sudan – 1591 Sanctions Committee reports

Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para. 3: decides, in light of the failure of all parties to the conflict in Darfur to fulfil their commitments, (a) to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein "the Committee"), to undertake to following tasks: (iv). to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chairman of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Council in August 2013.

AMERICAS

Haiti – (MINUSTAH)

Resolution 2070 (2012) of 12 October 2012

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of MINUSTAH as contained in its resolutions 1542 (2004), 1608 (2005), 1702 (2006), 1743 (2007), 1780 (2007), 1840 (2008), 1892 (2009), 1908 (2010), 1927 (2010), 1944 (2010) and 2012 (2011) until 15 October 2013, with the intention of further renewal;

A meeting of the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries is expected to take place in August 2013

Para. 25: Requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed, and to report to the Council on the implementation of MINUSTAH's mandate, semi-annually and not later than forty-five days prior to its expiration;

Para. 26: requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports a comprehensive assessment of threats to security in Haiti, and to propose, as appropriate, options to reconfigure the size and composition of MINUSTAH and to further develop, evaluate, and submit as an annex to his next report, the consolidation plan presented in Section VI of the Report S/2012/678;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2013.

ASIA

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL) – UNIFIL mandate

Resolution 2064 (2012) of 30 August 2012

Para.1: decides to extend the present mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2013.

The mandate of UNIFIL will expire on 31 August 2013.

A meeting of the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries is expected to take place in mid-August 2013.

Para. 10: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006), every four months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2013.

EUROPE

Bosnia and Herzegovina – EUFOR/NATO reports to SC

Resolution 2074 (2012) of 14 November 2012

Para.18: requests the Member States acting through or in cooperation with the EU and the Member States acting through or in cooperation with NATO to report to the Council on the activity of EUFOR ALTHEA and NATO Headquarters presence respectively, through the appropriate channels and at least at three-monthly intervals.

**Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK
Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999**

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council at regular intervals on the implementation of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 July 2013 (S/2013/444) is before the Council.

OTHER

Non-proliferation/DPRK – 1718 Committee reports

Resolution 1718 (2006) of 14 October 2006

Para.12: decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks: (g) to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 above.

The Chairman of the 1718 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during August 2013.

Protection of civilians in armed conflict – Oral briefing

S/PRST/2002/41 of 20 December 2002

Last para. “The Security Council recognizes the importance of a comprehensive, coherent and action-oriented approach to the protection of civilians in armed conflict. It encourages further cooperation between Member States, OCHA, DPA, DPKO, UNHCR, UNRWA, OHCHR, UNDP and other relevant United Nations agencies and offices, bearing also in mind the contents of resolutions 1325 on women, peace and security and 1379 on children in armed conflict; welcomes the regional workshops and encourages Member States to give them their operational and financial support. The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to submit by June 2004 his next report on the protection of civilians in armed conflict, including information on the implementation of Security Council resolutions previously adopted on this subject and any other matter he wishes to bring to the attention of the Council. It also welcomes the oral briefings to be given to the Council every six months, including progress made to further develop the road map concept, as set out in the most recent report by the Secretary-General (S/2002/1300).

Security Council Annual Report

Note by the President of the Security Council of 26 July 2010 (S/2010/507)

Para. 71(a): The draft introduction to the Annual Report of the Security Council to the General Assembly should continue to be prepared under the leadership and responsibility of the President of the Council for the month of July of each calendar year.

The drafting of the introduction to the Annual Report is expected to continue during August 2013.

Small arms

S/PRST/2007/24 of 29 June 2007

Para. 5: underlines the need to address this issue and in this regard, requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council, on a biennial basis, a report on small arms containing his analysis, observations and recommendations as well as his observations on the implementation of the United Nations Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All its Aspects, to facilitate its further consideration of the matter.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2013.
