**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2014**

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2014

AFRICA

Burundi – BNUB mandate

Resolution 2090 (2013) of 13 February 2013

Para.1: decides to extend until 15 February 2014 the mandate of the UN Office in Burundi (BNUB), requesting it, consistent with paragraphs 3 (a) to (d) of the resolution 1959 (2010) and 2 (a) and (b) of the resolution 2027 (2011), to focus on and support the Government of Burundi in the following areas.;

The mandate of BNUB will expire on 15 February 2014.

Central African Republic – MISCA report

Resolution 2127 (2013) of 5 December 2013

Para.32: requests the African Union, in close coordination with the Secretary-General and other international organizations and bilateral partners involved in the crisis, to report to the Security Council every 60 days on the deployment and activities of MISCA;

Central African Republic - Report regarding implementation of French forces mandate

Resolution 2127 (2013) of 5 December 2013

Para.50: authorizes the French forces in the CAR, within the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, and for a temporary period, to take all necessary measures to support MISCA in the discharge of its mandate as provided by paragraph 28 above; requests France to report to the Council on the implementation of this mandate in the CAR and to coordinate its reporting with the reporting by the African Union referred to in paragraph 32 above and decides to review this mandate within six months after its commencement and calls upon the Transitional Authorities to cooperate fully with the deployment and operations of French forces, in particular by ensuring its safety, security and freedom of movement with unhindered and immediate access throughout the territory of CAR and further calls upon neighbouring countries of CAR to take appropriate measures to support the action of French forces;

Central African Republic – Report of sanctions committee

Resolution 2127 (2013) of 5 December 2013

Para. 57: decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein “the Committee”), to undertake to following tasks: (d) To report within 60 days to the Security Council on its work and thereafter to report as deemed necessary by the Committee;

The Chair of the 2127 Committee is expected to report to the Council in February 2014.

Central African region – UNOCA mandate

Letter from PSC dated 21 August 2012 (S/2012/657)

“I have the honour to inform you that your letter dated 13 August 2012 concerning your proposal to extend the mandate of the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa (UNOCA) for an

additional 18 months, until 28 February 2014, has been brought to the attention of the members of the Security Council. They take note of the proposal contained in your letter.”

The mandate of UNOCA will expire on 28 February 2014.

Guinea-Bissau – SG report on implementation of resolution 2048

Resolution 2103 (2013) of 22 May 2013

Para.17: requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council regular reports, every 180 days, on the implementation of this resolution and to continue to provide concurrent report on the implementation of resolution 2048 (2012) every 90 days restarting with the adoption of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2014.

Liberia – SG mid-term report on UNMIL

Resolution 2116 (2013) of 18 September 2013

Para. 21: requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed of the situation on the ground as UNMIL continues its reconfiguration, progress towards achieving the transitional benchmarks, refinement of a transition plan with the Government of Liberia, inclusive of the priority elements in paragraphs 3, 7, 8, 9 above, and the inter-mission cooperation arrangements between UNMIL and UNOCI, and to provide to it a midterm report no later than 28 February 2014 and a final report no later than 15 August 2014 on the implementation of this resolution;

The mid-term report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 28 February 2014.

Libya – SG report on UNSMIL

Resolution 2095 (2013) of 14 March 2013

Para.18: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution, including all elements of UNSMIL’s mandate, every 90 days.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2014.

Libya – Panel of Experts final report

Resolution 2095 (2013) of 14 March 2013

Para.14: decides to extend the mandate of the Panel of Experts, established by paragraph 24 of resolution 1973 (2011) and modified by resolution 2040 (2012), for a period of thirteen months, expresses its intent to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding further extension no later than twelve months from the adoption of this resolution, and decides that the Panel shall carry out the following tasks: (d) provide to the Council an interim report on its work no later than 90 days after the Panel’s appointment, and a final report to the Council no later than 60 days prior to the termination of its mandate with its findings and recommendations.

The report of the Panel of Experts is expected to be submitted in February 2014.

Somalia – Somali Government report

Resolution 2111 (2013) of 24 July 2013

Para.9: reminds the Federal Government of Somalia of its obligation to report to the Security Council no later than 6 October 2013, following that by 6 February 2014, and every six months thereafter, on: (a) The structure of the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia; (b) The infrastructure in place to ensure the safe storage, registration, maintenance and distribution of military equipment by the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia; (c) The procedures and codes of conduct in place for the registration, distribution, use and storage of weapons by the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia, and on training needs in this regard.

The report is expected to be issued by 6 February 2014.

Sudan – SG to present options and recommendations on UNAMID

Resolution 2113 (2013) of 30 July 2013

Para. 3: requests the Secretary-General to conduct, in close consultation with the African Union, and seeking perspectives from all relevant parties, a detailed and forward-looking review of UNAMID's progress towards achieving its mandate, including in light of major changes and developments in the situation in Darfur since UNAMID's establishment, progress towards its benchmarks and consequences for UNAMID; and requests that he present options and recommendations on improving UNAMID's effectiveness to the Security Council by 28 February 2014.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council by 28 February 2014.

Sudan – 1591 Committee reporting

Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para.3: decides, in light of the failure of all parties to the conflict in Darfur to fulfil their commitments, (a) to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein "the Committee"), to undertake the following tasks: iv. to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chair of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Council in February 2014.

Sudan – Panel of Experts mandate

Resolution 2091 (2013) of 14 February 2013

Para.1: decides to extend until 17 February 2014 the mandate of the Panel of Experts, originally appointed pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) and previously extended by resolutions 1651 (2005), 1665 (2006), 1713 (2006), 1779 (2007), 1841 (2008), and 1891 (2009), 1945 (2010), 1982 (2011) and 2035 (2012) and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures, including basing arrangements, as expeditiously as possible.

The mandate of the Panel of Experts will expire on 17 February 2014.

Sudan – SG reporting on UNISFA

Resolution 2126 (2013) of 25 November 2013

Para. 24: requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform the Council of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate in 90-day intervals, and continue to bring to the Council's immediate attention any serious violations of the above referenced agreements;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2014.

Sudan (Sudan/South Sudan)

Resolution 2046 (2012) of 2 May 2012

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to consult with the African Union on the implementation of this resolution and the decisions of the AU PSC, to work closely with the AUHIP in support of its facilitation efforts, and to inform the Security Council within 15 days and in two week intervals thereafter on the status of compliance by Sudan, South Sudan, and the SPLM-N with the decisions set forth in this resolution, and expresses its intention, in the event that any or all of the parties have not complied with the decisions set forth in this resolution, to take appropriate additional measures under Article 41 of the Charter as necessary.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council in February 2014.

South Sudan – SG reporting on implementation of resolution 2132

Resolution 2132 (2013) of 24 December 2013

Para.4: decides, therefore, that given the urgent circumstances of the situation, UNMISS will consist of a military component of up to 12,500 troops of all ranks and of a police component, including appropriate Formed Police Units, of up to 1,323, requests that the Secretary-General keep the new levels of troops and police in UNMISS under continuous review, and requests that the Secretary-General report to the Council within 15 days on the steps taken to implement this resolution, and at least every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council in February 2014.

ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Middle East (Syria) – OPCW reporting, through the SG, on resolution 2118 (2013)

Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para. 12: decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report dated 27 January 2014 (S/2014/52) is before the Council.

EUROPE

Bosnia and Herzegovina – EUFOR ALTHEA / NATO reports

Resolution 2074 (2012) of 14 November 2012

Para. 18.: requests the Member States acting through or in cooperation with the EU and the Member States acting through or in cooperation with NATO to report to the Council on the activity of EUFOR ALTHEA and NATO Headquarters presence respectively, through the appropriate channels and at least at three-monthly intervals

The reports are expected to be issued during February 2014.

Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK report

Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council at regular intervals on the implementation of the resolution...

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 January 2014 (S/2014/68) is before the Council.

OTHER

Maintenance of international peace and security: Security Sector Reform (including efforts in Africa) – SG report

S/PRST/2011/19 of 12 October 2011

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General to submit, by early 2013, an assessment of the United Nations support for SSR, including those efforts in Africa, and make recommendations on how best to strengthen the United Nations comprehensive approach to SSR, taking into account the linkages between United Nations assistance and conflict prevention and peacebuilding, and also taking into consideration the views of relevant United Nations organs and actors.

Letter from the President of the Security Council of 19 April 2013 (S/2013/238)

Last para: the members of the Council have taken note of the fact that there are delays in the issuance of the aforementioned report and look forward to receiving it as close to the due date as possible.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 13 August 2013 (S/2013/480) is before the Council.

Measuring the effectiveness of the UN system's support to the promotion of the rule of law – SG report

S/PRST/2012/1 of 19 January 2012

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General to provide a follow-up report within 12 months to consider the effectiveness of the UN system's support to the promotion of the rule of law in conflict and post-conflict situations.

Letter from the President of the Security Council of 24 December 2012 (S/2012/959)

Last para.: The members of the Security Council have taken note that there will be delays in the issuance of the report. It is the wish of the Council that the report be submitted to it as close to the due date as possible.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 11 June 2013 (S/2013/341) is before the Council.

Non-proliferation/DPRK – 1718 Committee reporting

Resolution 1718 (2006) of 14 October 2006

Para. 12(g): decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 of this resolution.

The Chair of the 1718 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council in February 2014.

Protection of civilians in armed conflict – SG report

S/PRST/2013/2 of 12 February 2013

Last para: the Security Council notes the report of the Secretary-General on protection of civilians in armed conflict of 22 May 2012 S/2012/376 and the recommendations made therein, and requests the Secretary-General to submit his next report, to include an assessment of concrete measures taken by peacekeeping missions to implement their mandates to protect civilians and the impact of those measures, by 15 November 2013 and for reports to be submitted every 18 months thereafter.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 22 November 2013 (S/2013/689) is before the Council

Protection of civilians in armed conflict – Oral briefing

S/PRST/2002/41 of 20 December 2002

Last para. “The Security Council recognizes the importance of a comprehensive, coherent and action-oriented approach to the protection of civilians in armed conflict. It encourages further cooperation between Member States, OCHA, DPA, DPKO, UNHCR, UNRWA, OHCHR, UNDP and other relevant United Nations agencies and offices, bearing also in mind the contents of resolutions 1325 on women, peace and security and 1379 on children in armed conflict; welcomes the regional workshops and encourages Member States to give them their operational and financial support. The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to submit by June 2004 his next report on the protection of civilians in armed conflict, including information on the implementation of Security Council resolutions previously adopted on this subject and any other matter he wishes to bring to the attention of the Council. It also welcomes the oral briefings to be given to the Council every six months, including progress made to further develop the road map concept, as set out in the most recent report by the Secretary-General (S/2002/1300).

Work of the UN to help states, sub-regional and regional entities in Africa in fighting terrorism – SG report

S/PRST/2013/5 of 13 May 2013

Last para: invites the Secretary-General to submit, within 6 months, a concise report providing a comprehensive survey and assessment of the UN's relevant work to help States, sub-regional and regional entities in Africa in fighting terrorism, with the view to continue consideration of possible steps in this regard.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 9 January 2014 (S/2014/9) is before the Council
