AFRICA

Great Lakes Region: SG reports on implementation of the commitments under the PSC Framework

Resolution 2612 (2021) of 20 December 2021

Para. 56: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every six months, in coordination with the Secretary-General's Special Envoy for the Great Lakes Region and the SRSG for the DRC on the implementation of the commitments under the PSC Framework and its linkages with the broader security situation in the Great Lakes Region;

S/PRST/2021/19 of 20 October 2021

Penultimate para.: The Security Council further requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide updates on the progress of the implementation of the PSC Framework, in his periodic reporting on the Great Lakes Region.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 March 2022 ([S/2022/276](#)) is before the Security Council.

Libya: UNSMIL mandate

Resolution 2619 (2022) of 31 January 2022

Para. 1: Decides to extend until 30 April 2022 the mandate of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL), as an integrated special political mission to carry out its mandate, as set out in resolution [2542 \(2020\)](#) and paragraph 16 of resolution [2570 \(2021\)](#);

The mandate will expire on 30 April 2022.

Libya: ICC Prosecutor briefing

Resolution 1970 (2011) of 26 February 2011

Para. 7: Invites the Prosecutor to address the Security Council within two months of the adoption of this resolution and every six months thereafter on actions taken pursuant to this resolution.

The ICC Prosecutor is expected to report in April 2022.

Mali: SG reports on MINUSMA on the implementation of resolution [2584 \(2021\)](#)

Resolution 2584 (2021) of 29 June 2021

Para. 61: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every three months after the adoption of this resolution on the implementation of this resolution, focusing on: (i) progress in achieving the priority measures referenced in paragraphs 4 and 15, and whether and how the mission's activities have contributed toward achieving the mission's strategic priorities referenced in paragraph 21 and priority tasks referenced in paragraph 30, (ii) coordination, exchange of information and, when applicable, mutual operational and logistical support, between MINUSMA, the MDSF, the FC-G5S, the French Forces and the European partners, including Task Force Takuba, and the European Union missions in Mali, (iii) measures to improve external communication of the mission;

S/PRST/2020/10 of 15 October 2020

Last para.: The Security Council also requests MINUSMA, within its mandate and existing resources, to support the political transition in Mali, particularly by exercising good offices, confidence-building and facilitation at the national and local levels, and by supporting, together with the United Nations country team, the holding of inclusive, free, fair, transparent, and credible elections, conducted in a peaceful environment, including through the provision of technical assistance and security arrangements,

consistent with the provisions of the Agreement. It requests the Secretary General to include in its quarterly reports updates on how MINUSMA supports the political transition.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 March 2022 ([S/2022/278](#)) is before the Security Council.

South Sudan: Sanctions: SG to conduct an assessment of progress achieved on the key benchmarks established in paragraph 2 of UNSCR 2577

Resolution [2577 \(2021\)](#) of 28 May 2021

Para. 4: Requests in this regard the Secretary-General, in close consultation with UNMISS and the Panel of Experts, to conduct, no later than 15 April 2022, an assessment of progress achieved on the key benchmarks established in paragraph 2;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2022.

Sudan/South Sudan: SG to inform SC on status of compliance with resolution [2046 \(2012\)](#)

Resolution [2046 \(2012\)](#) of 2 May 2012

Para. 6: Requests the Secretary-General to consult with the African Union on the implementation of this resolution and the decisions of the AU PSC, to work closely with the AUHIP in support of its facilitation efforts, and to inform the Security Council within 15 days and in two week intervals thereafter on the status of compliance by Sudan, South Sudan, and the SPLM-N with the decisions set forth in this resolution, and expresses its intention, in the event that any or all of the parties have not complied with the decisions set forth in this resolution, to take appropriate additional measures under Article 41 of the Charter as necessary.

Note by the PSC of 2 December 2016 ([S/2016/1029](#))

Following consultations among the members of the Security Council, it has been agreed to amend the reporting period established in paragraph 6 of resolution [2046 \(2012\)](#), and subsequently amended in notes by the President of the Security Council ([S/2013/657](#) and [S/2014/613](#)), to six-month intervals, beginning with the first report under the new timeline due to the Council by 15 May 2017.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2022.

Sudan/South Sudan: SG to inform SC of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate

Resolution [2609 \(2021\)](#) of 15 December 2021

Para. 34: Requests the Secretary-General to provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council, using the data collected and analyzed through the Comprehensive Planning and Performance Assessment System (CPAS) and other strategic planning and performance measurement tools, taking into account performance of all uniformed and civilian personnel, to describe the mission's impact, to facilitate as necessary a re-evaluation of the mission composition and mandate based on realities on the ground, and further, to continue to inform it of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate, in one written report, no later than 15 April 2022 and include reporting on:[...]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2022.

Western Sahara: SG to brief the SC on the status and progress of negotiations, the implementation of resolution [2602 \(2021\)](#), challenges to MINURSO operations and steps taken to address them

Resolution [2602 \(2021\)](#) of 29 October 2021

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Security Council on a regular basis, and at any time he deems appropriate during the mandate period, to include within six months of this mandate's renewal and again prior to its expiration, on the status and progress of these negotiations under his auspices, on the implementation of this resolution, assessment of MINURSO's operations and steps taken to address challenges, expresses its intention to meet to receive and discuss his briefings and in

this regard, further requests the Secretary-General to provide a report on the situation in Western Sahara well before the end of the mandate period;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in [April 2022](#).

AMERICAS

Colombia: SG to report on Verification Mission

[Resolution 2366 \(2017\)](#) of 10 July 2017

Para. 8: Further requests the Secretary-General, based on the reporting of the Special Representative, to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the Verification Mission's mandate every 90 days after the start of its verification activities;

[Resolution 2545 \(2020\)](#) of 25 September 2020

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 25 September 2021, the mandate of the Verification Mission and reporting requirements in accordance with its resolutions [2366 \(2017\)](#), [2377 \(2017\)](#), [2435 \(2018\)](#), and [2487 \(2019\)](#), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations;

[Resolution 2574 \(2021\)](#) of 11 May 2021

Haiti: SG to convey the findings of an assessment of the BINUH mandate

Para.2: Requests the Secretary General conduct an assessment of the BINUH mandate, including whether and how the mandate could be adjusted to address the ongoing challenges faced by Haiti; to increase the effectiveness of the mission and its efforts to support engagement between Haitian national authorities, civil society and other stakeholders; to strengthen the rule of law; and to promote respect for human rights;

Para.3: Also requests the Secretary General to convey the findings of this assessment to the Security Council within six months following the adoption of this resolution;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in [April 2022](#).

Middle East (Lebanon): SG reports on resolution 1559 (2004)

Para. 7: Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council within thirty days on the implementation by the parties of this resolution and decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

[S/PRST/2004/36](#) of 19 October 2004

Last para.: The Security Council appreciates the Secretary-General's intention to keep the Council updated. It requests that he continue to report on the implementation of the resolution to the Council every six months.

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013;

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Council monthly and to provide a report on a regular basis, at least every 60 days, on the implementation of resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014), 2191 (2014), 2258 (2015), 2332 (2016), 2393 (2017), 2401 (2018), 2449 (2018), 2504 (2020), 2533 (2020) and this resolution and on compliance by all relevant parties in Syria and further requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports overall trends in United Nations cross-line operations, in particular on the implementation of the above mentioned activities on improving all modalities of humanitarian deliveries inside Syria and early recovery projects, and detailed information on the humanitarian assistance delivered through United Nations humanitarian cross-border operations, including the distribution mechanism, the number of beneficiaries, operating partners, locations of aid deliveries at district-level and the volume and nature of items delivered;

Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution 2268 (2016)

Resolution 2268 (2016) of 26 February 2016

Para.10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution 2254 (2015), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2022.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2586 (2021) and resolution 2451 (2018)

Resolution 2586 (2021) of 14 July 2021

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party; and on resolution 2451 (2018), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2022.

EUROPE

UNMIK: SG briefings and concurrent reports to SC

Resolution [1244 \(1999\)](#) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council at regular intervals on the implementation of this resolution, including reports from the leaderships of the international civil and security presences, the first reports to be submitted within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution;

Note by the PSC of 7 February 2019 ([S/2019/120](#))

The members of the Security Council have agreed upon a schedule of meetings on UNMIK, with concurrent Secretary-General reports to the Council. In 2019, the Council intends to hold briefings on 7 February, in June, and in October. As of 2020, the Council intends to hold briefings twice a year (in April and October) on the issue. The Council will continue to review this issue, taking into account the situation on the ground.
