- 2 (a) In this section, "solicit" means to command, authorize, urge, entice, request, 3 or advise a person by any means, including:
- 4 (1) in person;
- 5 (2) through an agent or agency;
- 6 (3) over the telephone;
- 7 (4) through any print medium;
- 8 (5) by mail;
- 9 (6) by computer or Internet; or
- 10 (7) by any other electronic means.
- 11 (b) (1) A person may not, with the intent to commit a violation of § 3–304 or § 12 3–307 of this subtitle or § 11–207, § 11–303, § 11–304, § 11–305, § 11–306, or § 11–307 of this article, knowingly solicit a minor, or a law enforcement officer posing as a minor, to engage in activities that would be unlawful for the person to engage in under § 3–304 or § 3–307 of this subtitle or § 11–207, § 11–303, § 11–304, § 11–305, § 11–306, or § 11–307 of

- 17 (2) A person may not, with the intent to commit a violation of § 3–304 or § 3–307 of this subtitle or § 11–207, § 11–303, § 11–304, § 11–305, § 11–306, or § 11–307 of this article, knowingly solicit the consent of a parent, guardian, or custodian of a minor, or a law enforcement officer posing as a parent, guardian, or custodian of a minor, to engage in activities with the minor that would be unlawful for the person to engage in under § 3–304 or § 3–307 of this subtitle or § 11–207, § 11–303, § 11–304, § 11–305, § 11–306, or § 11–307 of this article.
- 24 (c) A violation of this section is considered to be committed in the State for purposes of determining jurisdiction if the solicitation:

- 27 (2) is received in the State.
- 28 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is 29 subject to:
- 30 (1) for a first offense, imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not 31 exceeding \$25,000 or both; and

- 1 (2) for a second or subsequent offense, imprisonment not exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding \$50,000 or both.

- 5 (1) cause, induce, solicit, or knowingly allow a minor to engage as a subject 6 in the production of obscene matter or a visual representation or performance that depicts 7 a minor engaged as a subject in sadomasochistic abuse or sexual conduct;
- 8 (2) photograph or film a minor engaging in an obscene act, sadomasochistic 9 abuse, or sexual conduct;
- 10 (3) use a computer to depict or describe a minor engaging in an obscene act, sadomasochistic abuse, or sexual conduct;
- 12 (4) knowingly promote, advertise, solicit, distribute, or possess with the 13 intent to distribute any matter, visual representation, or performance:
- 14 (i) that depicts a minor engaged as a subject in sadomasochistic 15 abuse or sexual conduct; or
- 16 (ii) in a manner that reflects the belief, or that is intended to cause 17 another to believe, that the matter, visual representation, or performance depicts a minor 18 engaged as a subject of sadomasochistic abuse or sexual conduct; or
- 19 (5) use a computer to knowingly compile, enter, transmit, make, print, 20 publish, reproduce, cause, allow, buy, sell, receive, exchange, or disseminate any notice, 21 statement, advertisement, or minor's name, telephone number, place of residence, physical 22 characteristics, or other descriptive or identifying information for the purpose of engaging 23 in, facilitating, encouraging, offering, or soliciting unlawful sadomasochistic abuse or 24 sexual conduct of or with a minor.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
