The Education Center will house all the Foundation's programing of learning and fellowship.

Programing will focus on 2 areas: 1.elementary age community member field trips to the farm to engage in a production environment and witness farmers that look like them producing foods for the community. This program will be led by a former Food Prints teacher, who is also a social worker. All program materials have been developed by the Food Prints program with Fresh Farm. "FRESHFARM FoodPrints embeds comprehensive food education in public elementary schools with the goal of improving health and academic outcomes for children and families. We do this through an interdisciplinary, standards-based curriculum for learning in gardens and kitchens, food access, and partnership with the school meals program. Demonstrated outcomes include students with greater knowledge of, access to, and willingness to eat nutritious, climate-friendly foods, and greater engagement in schools."
