

Guidance for Completing the State Fiscal Recovery Funds Evidence-based Activities Reporting Tool

What is an evidence-based practice?

Evidence-based practices have been found to be effective by at least one high-quality, rigorous scientific study. We call these types of studies "impact evaluations" because they measure the impacts that were directly caused by a program/service/intervention. They typically involve a randomized controlled trial or regression analysis that creates statistical comparison groups. Additional information on how to identify evidence-based practices is available at the Minnesota Results First website.

How do I find evidence-based practices?

The <u>Minnesota Inventory</u> shows the evidence-basis for more than 700 programs happening in Minnesota. About half have been determined to be evidence-based (these are labeled "Proven Effective" or "Promising" on the Inventory). The Inventory can be searched by a specific name, or you can search by outcome and see which programs have achieved the stated goals. *Information on other sources of evidence-based practices is available in Appendix A below.*

Does my project or grant program use evidence-based practices?

It might! We have found more than 330 evidence-based activities occurring throughout state government-funded activities. There are many industry-standard practices that are evidence-based. In addition, some COVID-19 response strategies (such as vaccines, vaccine incentives, and N95 masks) have been proven to work.

How do I access the State Fiscal Recovery Funds Evidence-based Activities Reporting Tool? The reporting tool is available here.

Who can submit information through the tool?

Administering agencies can enter the information directly in the tool or share the link with grantees for them to submit information. If subrecipients are completing the form, Agencies will need to provide Project Name/Appropriation ID as well as the SWIFT Supplier ID (if these numbers have not already been shared with the grantee).

What do I need to report?

The scope of reporting includes all funds expended to-date and all activities that have occurred. Reporting in this tool should be at the sub-recipient/grantee level. A report should be submitted through this tool for each unique project/grant and sub-recipient/grantee combination. If a grantee is receiving funds from two grant programs, two forms should be completed. If a grant program has three grantees, three forms should be submitted. If a grantee has two sub-sub-recipients, only one form (for the grantee) should be submitted that reflects all activities for the sub-recipients. Agencies should submit a form for all administrative activities. A list of all questions asked in the tool are in Appendix B. We recommend reviewing the questions before starting the submission process.

How do I calculate expenditures-to-date for evidence-based practice(s)?

General principles of estimating expenditures:

- This is an estimate. It not intended to be an hour-by-hour allocation, nor should it be a "best guess."
- Estimates should be based on actual grant activity, not RFP responses or grant awards.
- Estimates should be based on expenditures to-date, not planned or budgeted activities.
- Dollars should be assigned to either one EBP or to non-evidence-based practices. (This means that expenditures are not double counted)

To estimate the funds expended on EBP(s), start by estimating the percentage of total funds expended that have gone to EBP(s) and non-evidence-based activities. Then multiply these values by total funds expended on EBP(s) and non-evidence-based activities. In the example below, we estimate that 25% of funds have gone to EBP 1, 33% to EBP 2, and 42% to non-evidence-based activities. See blue-shaded cells. To calculate the amount that has gone to EBP 1, take the total expended to date on EBP(s) and non-evidence-based activities (in the example, this is \$200,000) and multiply by 25% to get \$50,000. For EBP 2, multiple \$200,000 by 33% to get \$66,000. See green-shaded cells. These two values will be reported in the data collection tool.

If you do not have enough information to estimate the percentages in the blue cells above, you can do a similar calculation for individual budget categories and use them to develop an estimate for each EBP. An example is provided in the table below. We estimated the percent of each budget category going to EBPs and non-evidence-based activities in the purple-shaded cells. The percentages in each row should add to 100%. We then multiply each of these percentages by budget category expenditure which are then summed together for each EBP. See green-shaded cells. These two values will be reported in the data collection tool.
