

## Election Notice for Uniformed Services and Overseas Voters Statewide Primary Election June 18, 2024

## Updated: May 1, 2024

The State of Oklahoma will hold a **Statewide Primary Election** on **June 18, 2024**, for candidates seeking the following offices:

U.S. Representative (5 offices)
Corporation Commissioner (1 office)
State Senator (24 offices) (odd-numbered districts)
State Representative (101 offices)
State Senator, District 48 (Special Election)
State Representative, District 39 (Special Election)

The following county offices will also appear on the ballot: County Commissioner (District 2), County Court Clerk, County Clerk, and County Sheriff.

Candidates who wish to appear on the ballot for the Primary Election in June will file Statements of Candidacy on Wednesday, April 3 through Friday, April 5, 2024, between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

A complete list of the candidates who file for the June Primary Election will be available in the Candidate Filing Portal on the State Election Board website at <a href="https://filings.okelections.us/">https://filings.okelections.us/</a> after the close of the filing period on Friday April 5, 2024. No State Questions are scheduled to appear on the June Primary Election ballot.

Eligible Uniformed Services and overseas voters who **are registered** to vote in Oklahoma and want to receive absentee ballots for the June Primary Election may submit an Absentee Ballot Application electronically through the Oklahoma Voter Portal at <a href="https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/">https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/</a>.

Eligible Uniformed Services and overseas voters who **are not registered** in Oklahoma may register to vote and request absentee ballots using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The FPCA and submission instructions can be found on the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) website at <a href="https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma">https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma</a>. Applicants may submit the FPCA by mail, e-mail, or fax to the County Election Board in their county of residence. Contact information for each County Election Board is available on the FVAP website at <a href="https://www.fvap.gov/search-offices?state=36">https://www.fvap.gov/search-offices?state=36</a>.

All Absentee Ballot Applications must be received by the appropriate County Election Board or the State Election Board no later than 5 p.m. (CST), Monday, June 3, 2024. The deadline to register to vote is Friday, May 24, 2024.

Those eligible for Uniformed Services and overseas absentee ballots are encouraged to have absentee ballots electronically delivered to allow enough time to receive, vote, and submit their ballot. Those who do not receive their absentee ballot, may opt to submit a Federal Write-In Ballot, which is available on the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) website at <a href="https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma">https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma</a>.

To use the Federal Write-In Ballot, voters will mark the ballot with their choice for each office, question, and/or proposition on the ballot using their sample ballot available in the OK Voter Portal at <a href="https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/">https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/</a>. An election list may also be obtained from the voter's County Election Board or the State Election Board. If the voter receives the requested absentee ballot after submitting a Federal Write-In Ballot, the voter should vote and submit the requested absentee ballot. Only one ballot will be counted.

Voters are reminded that Oklahoma is a closed primary state. In order to vote in a party's primary or runoff primary, you must be a member of that party. However, every two years, state law allows all recognized parties in Oklahoma to open their primaries to Independent voters. For the 2024-2025 election years, Democratic primaries and runoff primaries are open to Independents. Republican and Libertarian primaries and runoff primaries are closed to Independents.
