John F. McNamara III Moles President for 2024-25

ohn F. McNamara, Vice President of A.A. Will Corporation, has been elected to serve as President of the Moles for the year 2024-2025. The "official" passing of the gavel occurred at the May 2, 2024, Members Dinner and Annual Business Meeting held at the New York Marriott Marquis. Additional 2024 Moles executive officers are: First Vice President, Michael A. D'Annunzio, D'Annunzio Group, Inc.; Second Vice President, John H. O'Keefe, Underpinning and Foundation Skanska; Secretary, Michael Ryan, Yonkers Contracting Company; Treasurer, Thomas J. Groark, and Sergeant-At-Arms, Vincent A. Sambrato, Parsons. Trustees newly elected this year are Francis Arland, Mueser Rutledge Consulting Engineers and Anthony Del Vescovo, Walsh Construction.

John F. McNamara III was born in Boston, MA, in 1958, and moved with his family to western Massachusetts in 1968. He attended Agawam High School, graduating in 1976, and went on to study Civil Engineering at Northeastern University. He was attracted to Northeastern by the Co-Operative education program; while taking five years to graduate, the required four (6) month internships provided students with invaluable work experience in their field of study with the added bonus of earning enough to pay for a large portion of educational expenses. John's first co-op assignment was in the estimating department with Pre-Designed Structures in Bloomfield, Ct., where his passion for the field and infrastructure work became apparent. His most impressionable co-op assignment was with The Barletta Company as an assistant field engineer on a road and bridge project rehabilitating the interchange of I-290 and I-495 in Marlborough, MA and extending a connector road to Rt 85 in Hudson; ironically, about 5 miles away from the site of The Moles New England Student Day project for both 2023 & 2024, hosted by Barletta at the MassDot's I-495/I-90 Interchange Improvements Project. John recalled that his coop with Barletta was an invaluable exposure to all aspects of highway and bridge building and was instrumental in propelling John's career after graduating Northeastern University with his BSCE in 1981.

John joined Modern Continental Construction Company in August of 1982, as a project superintendent, where he progressed thru the ranks serving as project manager, Vice President and ultimately promoted to Senior Vice President in 1998, remaining there until joining A.A Will in 2007. He has overseen over 200 Public and Private Infrastructure

Projects throughout the northeast including reconstruction of Massachusetts Avenue over the Charles River in Boston & Cambridge; numerous contracts on Boston's Central Artery Tunnel Project including the \$320M Bird Island Flats tunnel section of I-90 thru Logan Airport; the \$420M Fort point Channel I-90 crossing, which was the first concrete Immersed Tube Tunnel Project built in North America, and the first Segmental Viaduct in MA constructing I-93 over I-90. Other notable projects included reconstruction of Nantucket Island Historic District, the Reconstruction of the Long Island Expressway from the Midtown Tunnel to the

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Grand Central Parkway in Queens and the capping of the Fountain Avenue Landfill in Brooklyn.

John's dedication to the construction industry extends to his involvement in groups that support heavy construction. He has been an active member of The Moles since induction in 1995, where he has served as a trustee, secretary, and member of the Executive Committee. He also serves as a board member of the Moles Charitable Fund and is its liaison to Northeastern University, where he also serves on the Northeastern University Industrial Advisory Board. He is the past Chairman and Board Member of the Construction Industries of Massachusetts (CIM), a past Board Member of the American

Road and Transportation Builders Association (ATRBA) as well as past Executive Committee member of the General Contractors Association of New York. He is also a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), Boston Society of Civil Engineers (BSCE), and the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME).

John and his wife Cathy celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary this May, reside in Scituate, MA, where they enjoy spending time with their four children and three grandchildren. John is a passionate saltwater angler and enjoys fishing and boating with his family and friends on Cape Cod in the summer and wintering in Marathon in the Florida Keys.

May They Rest in Peace

Gerard J. "Gerry" Carty, former Executive Director of The Moles, passed away on April 9, 2024, at 91 years of age. Throughout his tenure, Gerry was a respected representative of the heavy construction industry, serving as leader, mentor and friend to 800+ Moles members.

Gerry's successful career in the industry began at Johnson, Drake & Piper for fifteen years before moving to Walsh Construction Company (a Division of Guy F. Atkinson), from which he retired in 1992 as Chief Engineer and Senior VP. Gerry became a Mole in 1971 and served on the Education and Publicity Committees, was a Trustee and held a number of Executive Officer positions including Moles President in 1988. Gerry was the 1991 Recipient of The Moles' Member Award for Outstanding Achievement in Construction and two years later became its Executive Director. During his tenure at the helm of The Moles, Gerry continued to serve the industry as a consultant and as a mediator for the American Arbitration Association. The Moles recognized Gerry's twenty-two years-long stewardship at the time of his retirement in 2015, bestowing him with the title of Executive Director Emeritus, which he retained until 2020. He was a fellow in the American Society of Civil Engineers and ENR selected Gerry as its New York Legacy Award winner in 2018.

Known for his staunch protection of the organization's traditions and By-Laws, Gerry's legacy will be his successful efforts to expand The Moles' Scholarship Program. Recognizing the importance of The Moles' mission to promote careers in the industry, Gerry spearheaded a scholarship fund drive in 1996 that laid the strong financial investment

foundation for what is now a very robust scholarship program that distributes over \$400,000 annually.

The Moles Charitable Fund has started to receive donations in Gerry's name in honor Gerry's contribution to The Moles organization and heavy construction industry.

oles stalwart, **John L. Kolaya**, 76, passed away on April 24, 2024. John received his BSCE from Bucknell in 1970, followed by an MS in Geotechnical Engineering from Rutgers, earned while working full time for Thomas Crimmins Contracting. In 1987, Yonkers Contracting bought TCC and John proceeded to rise through the ranks to Executive VP. John's geotechnical expertise in deep foundations can be found in many iconic NYC projects, including Trump Tower; 60 Wall Street; the I-495 Queens Midtown Viaduct, for which he received ENR's *Medal of Excellence*; the pile foundation for the original 7 WTC, to which he returned to help in the recovery and cleanup up efforts at Ground Zero and the executive oversight of the WTC PATH Restoration project; reconstruction of the Manhattan Bridge; work at the Williamsburg, Brooklyn and Triboro Bridge Bridges, Penn Station and Grand Central Station.

Since his induction in 1983, John was passionately involved in The Moles, whether as an active volunteer at Students Day; influential in the multiple executive leadership roles he held; as an MCF liaison to his alma mater and a generous donor to the Moles Charitable Fund. John's years of service included his 2004 Presidency and planning The Moles 75th Anniversary Ball and Book in 2012. In 2014, John was recognized for his contributions to the heavy construction industry as the Recipient of The Moles' *Member Award*. John leaves an indelible mark on the heavy construction industry and on the friends and colleagues he amassed throughout the years.

Once diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, John directed his energy to becoming an advocate for improving the lives of those similarly afflicted, working with the Parkinson's Foundation to find a cure.

John "Jack" F. Daly, 90, passed away on January 26, 2024. Jack was the CEO of Koch Skanska. He built a reputation and legacy during his 50 year career that involved building and renovating major bridges and iconic structures, including the World Trade Center. Jack had a passion for boats and antique cars that he pursued in retirement. Prede-



ceased by his wife of 60 sixty years, Jack leaves behind his seven children and their families.

William F. Loftus, 90, a Mole for 38 years, passed away on March 20, 2024. Born and raised in Brooklyn, Bill received his BSCE from Manhattan College and founded his engineering firm

of the same name in 1968. His firm consulted on many Army Corp of Engineers projects nationwide. In 1976, Bill co-founded Deep Foundations Institute (DFI) as a vehicle for engineers and industry-related players to share their expertise. DFI became a global organization with Bill at the helm for several years. In 2000, Bill won DFI's *Distinguished Service Award*.

Charles H. Thornton, 83, passed away on December 12, 2023. A Manhattan College alumnus ('61), Charles was a co-founder of Thornton Tomasetti, a small NY engineering firm that grew into an internationally recognized organization with a reputation for its innovative approach to challenging projects including the Petronas Towers in Malaysia and Tapei 101in Taiwan. Charlie's impact will continue for generations due to his creation of the ACE Mentor Program in 1994, which introduced high school students to architecture, construction, and engineering careers. Charlie was subsequently recognized for this work by President Obama in 2011. Charlie's quote, "Engineering, at its core, is about shaping the future" will continue to resonate.



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Student Outreach Expands: Moles Go Beyond Students Days

Cofounded by Mole John Roma, the competition tasked students to design, construct, price, and schedule a new MBTA Blue Line Station at Government Center, Boston, as envisioned by Prof Jim Lambrechts of Wentworth Institute. A total of \$34,000 in prize money was distributed to the five participating schools with Tufts winning first prize; UConn in 2nd place; Norwich Univ taking 3rd and Honorable Mention going to UMass-Lowell and Springfield Technical Community College (STCC). Two of the four judges were Moles members: Aaron Lewis, SGH and Andy Brengola, Underpinning & Foundation Skanska. New Mole Tom Day, while at Barletta, was given the same project parameters to conduct a professional analysis that was then presented to



the students at the conclusion of their presentations. Students gained a sense of the collaborative nature of design/build projects.

All five schools also attended the last New England Moles Students Day ("NE MSD"); this year, twenty-seven schools have been invited to NE MSD on September 27th in Westborough, MA. The Education Committee is actively working to expand on this opportunity at all three Students Days.

John Roma and Dave Puza (STCC '72) attended STCC's Student Recognition Ceremony on May 17th, where the Civil Engineering Technology program students, mentored by Bill Murphy of J.F.White (*seen above*), were recognized for their accomplishment. Department Chair Cynthia DeSeiller has been instrumental in developing the CET program and expanding STCC students' exposure to careers in heavy civil construction, including attending NE MSD in October 2023 and getting students involved in the CIM competitions. Her efforts have paid off; STCC students may now transfer to either Western New England College or Old Dominion in VA to pursue Engineering and Construction Management BS degrees.

Executive Director Dave Puza would like to build on CIM's concept, using its competition-style framework to offer similar competitions as a way to expand Moles' outreach to vocational/community college students and promote careers in the industry to meet the growing need for tradesmen and industry-related degrees. It is widely recognized that reaching students at the precollege stage is effective in encouraging STEM-related careers and will benefit the heavy construction industry.
