



***2015 Treaty Event:
Seventy years of multilateral treaty making at the United Nations
Daily Report***

Tuesday, 29 September 2015

Today nine (9) **treaty actions** were effected with the Secretary-General by seven (7) States, represented at the **ministerial level**.

There were a total of two (2) acceptances, two (2) accessions, four (4) ratifications and one (1) signature. A breakdown of the treaty actions is provided below:
