2023 - Windsor 44, Thetford 40

Trailing 36-31 early 4th quarter, Windsor got back-to-back 3-pointers to jump start 9-1 run over minute-and-half for 30-point advantage, then held Thetford to 1 point final 3:30 minutes ... **Sydney Perry** 16 points and 20 rebounds to lead Windsor, while **Audrey Rupp** (7 reb) and **Brianna Barton** had 8 points each ... **Addie Cadwell** 21 points for Thetford

2022 - Windsor 37, Lake Region 30

Reese Perry had 16 points and 14 rebounds, while **Peyton Richardson** added 8 points including a pair of 3-point FGs late 4th quarter that gave Windsor a 33-26 advantage ... Thetford won its 2nd title in 3 years as they held on to beat #8 seed Oxbow ... Thetford led 8-2 after 1st quarter 18-9 at halftime and 33-23 after 3 periods before Oxbow cut deficit to 34-29 in the 4th ... Thetford hit 7-of-12 free throws and took 40-32 lead with 2:00 left ... **Casey MacVeagh** had 13 points for Thetford and **Emma Parkin** 8 points for Oxbow.

2018 - Windsor 51, Thetford 34

Olivia Rockwood scored a game-high 29 points as Windsor used a 23-6 edge in the 2nd quarter to open up a 34-16 lead at halftime ... After Windsor took a 20-point lead, Thetford cut the deficit to 40-30 after 3 quarters, but could not get closer as Windsor had 11-4 edge in 4th ... **Grace Davis** had 9 points and **Danielle Robinson** added 7 to lead Thetford.

Richford won its 1st state title since 1992 as Rockets used a 13-3 run to end 1st half with a 23-13 lead and an 11-0 run early in 4th quarter for a 51-25 lead ... **Gabby Coons** and **Hannah Gleason** 15 points apiece for Richford, while **Alex Benoit** and **Sally Fuller** 12 points for Richford ... **Michaela Pomeroy** 13 points and **Kayley Gray** 10 points for Thetford

2014 - Thetford 90, Williamstown 84

Thetford rallied from a 63-55 deficit in the 3rd quarter as the Panthers used 20-11 run to take 1-point lead with 5:17 left in the game, then added 7 straight points for an 82-74 lead ... **Michaela Pomeroy** had 25 points, **Shyann Josler** 16 and **Jill Clark** 12 for Thetford ... **Dani Jesmonth** a game-high 28 points and **Kimmy Gilbert** added 15 for Williamstown.

2013 - Winooski 52, Williamstown 48

The Spartans won their 1st-ever state title after rallying from 46-41 deficit with 3:29 remaining as **Briana Robare** scored 19 points, including go-ahead basket with 34 seconds left ... **Amanda Nattress** added 15 points and **Christina Dang** 8 of her 11 points in the 4th for Winooski ... **Carissa Carrier** led Williamstown with 14 points and **Mariah Lamell** 9 points.

2012 - Oxbow 43, Enosburg 40

The Olympians rallied from a 10-point deficit with 14-0 run for 30-26 lead, then snapped a 40-40 tie on a **Meghan Hart** free throw with 23.3 seconds left ... Alexa Johnson scored 13 of her 16 points in the 2nd half and grabbed 15 rebounds as Enosburg went 4-of-4 from foul line in final 17 seconds after Lake Region had cut deficit to 46-44 ... **Lindsey Larivee** added 11 points and 7 rebounds for Enosburg, while **Maria Gleason** had 10 points ... **Donna Lawson** led Lake Region with 21 points and 9 rebounds.

Arlington had taken a 38-31 lead early in 4th before 8-3 Thetford run ... **Jade Csizmesia** had 18 points and **Erin Mears** 17 points to lead Arlington, while **Chelsea Williams** had team-high 16 points for Thetford.

2004 - Arlington 58, Oxbow 47

Erin Mears scored 18 points and hit 3-pointer with 2:32 left to give Arlington 55-45 lead ... Eagles built 15-point lead in 1st quarter before Oxbow cut deficit to 1 point in 2nd quarter ... Arlington led 34-26 at half and 46-37 after 3 quarters ... **Kelsey Cefalo** and **Jade Csizmesia** had 12 points apiece for Arlington, while **Corinna Martino** 15 points for Oxbow.

2003 - Arlington 50, Rivendell 31

MSJ led 18-11 at half and 30-18 after 3 periods ... **Candice Holiday** hit 7-of-22 shots and scored 17 points for Windsor, while rest of team was 1-of-9 from field and scored 4 points.

2001 - Arlington 42, MSJ 30

The Eagles used a 12-2 run in the 2nd period to take a 21-13 halftime lead as Arlington won 2nd straight title ... 1997 - Oxbow 55, Enosburg 48

1986 - Oxbow 68, Peoples 40
