
SUBJECT: Class Deviation, Additional Contractor Requirements and Responsibilities
Relating to Alleged Crimes By or Against Contractor Personnel in Iraq and
Afghanistan

Effective immediately, this class deviation provides a new clause (Attachment) to
implement section 854 of the Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for
Fiscal Year 2009.

As required by section 854, the clause addresses—

- Mechanisms for ensuring that contractors are required to report offenses under the
Uniform Code of Military Justice (chapter 47 of title 10, United States Code) or the
Military Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Act (chapter 212 of title 18, United States Code).
- Responsibility for providing victim and witness protection and assistance to
contractor personnel in connection with alleged offenses described above,
- A requirement that a contractor provides to all contractor personnel who will perform
work on a contract in Iraq or Afghanistan, before beginning such work, information
on the following:
 - How and where to report an alleged crime describe above.
 - Where to seek the assistance required.

This class deviation remains in effect until it is incorporated in the DFARS or is

252.225-7997 Additional Requirements and Responsibilities relating to Alleged Crimes by or against Contractor Personnel in Iraq and Afghanistan (DEVIATION).

Use the following clause in all new solicitations and resultant contracts in Iraq or Afghanistan, as well as modifying existing solicitations and contracts to the extent practicable, in accordance with FAR 1.108(d). "Contract in Iraq or Afghanistan" means a contract with the Department of Defense, a subcontract at any tier issued under such a contract, or a task order or delivery order at any tier issued under such a contract (including a contract, subcontract, or task order or delivery order issued by another Government agency for the Department of Defense, if the contract, subcontract, or task order or delivery order involves work performed in Iraq or Afghanistan for a period longer than 14 days.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES RELATING TO ALLEGED CRIMES BY OR AGAINST CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL IN IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN (DEVIATION) (DEC 2009)

- (a) The Contractor shall report to the appropriate investigative authorities any alleged offenses under--
- (1) The Uniform Code of Military Justice (chapter 47 of title 10, United States Code) (applicable to contractors serving with or accompanying an armed force in the field during a declared war or a contingency operation); or
 - (2) The Military Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Act (chapter 212 of title 18, United States Code).
- (b) The Contractor shall provide to all contractor personnel who will perform work on a contract in Iraq or Afghanistan, before beginning such work, information on the following:
- (1) How and where to report an alleged crime described in paragraph (a) of this clause.
 - (2) Where to seek victim and witness protection and assistance available to contractor personnel in connection with an alleged offense described in paragraph (a) of this clause.

(End of clause.)
