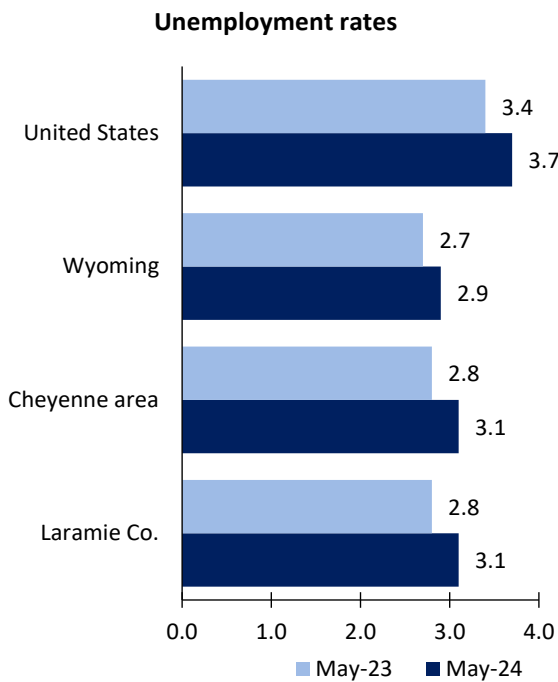


Cheyenne Area Economic Summary

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

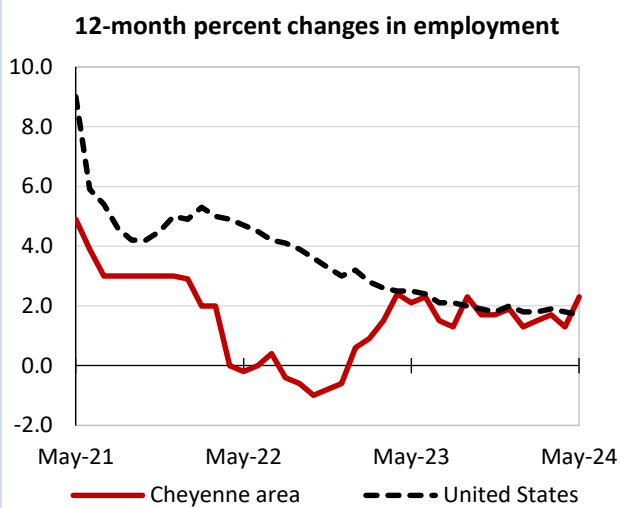
Cheyenne area, fourth quarter 2023

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



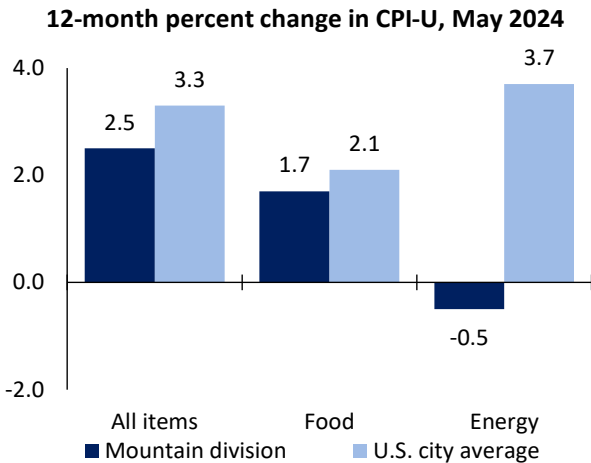

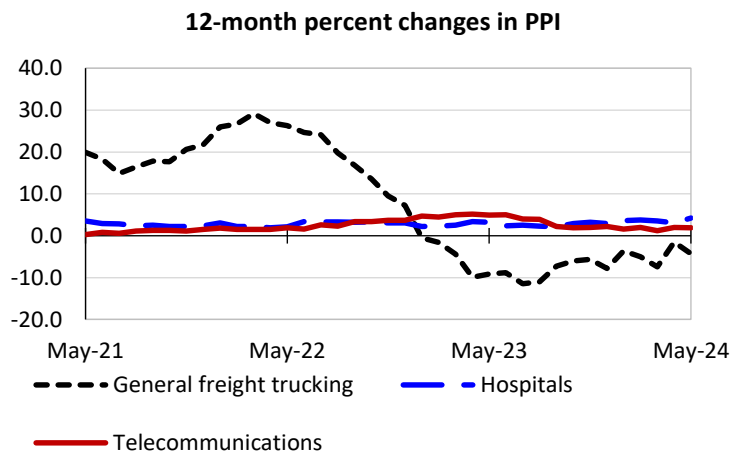


Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories



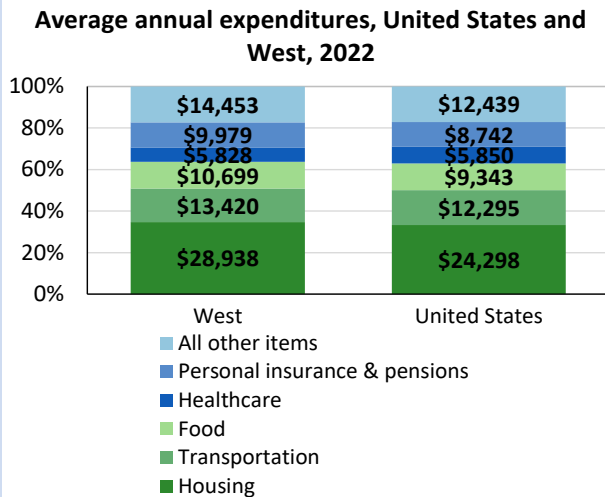

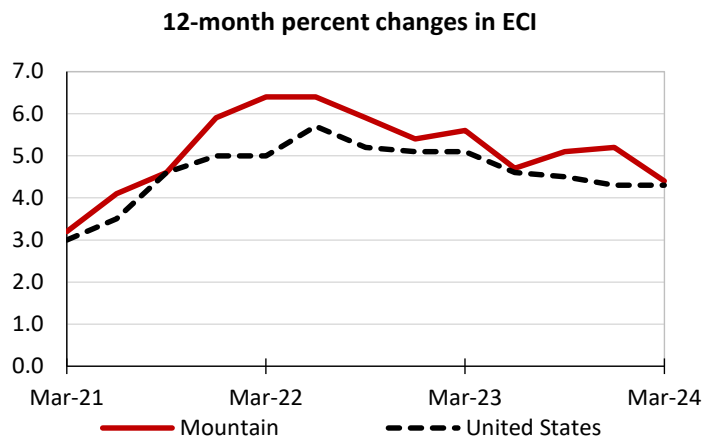
