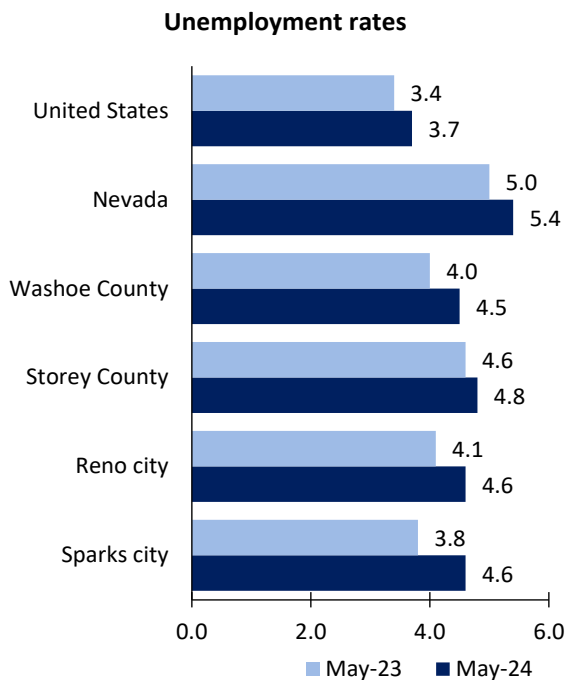


Reno Area Economic Summary

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

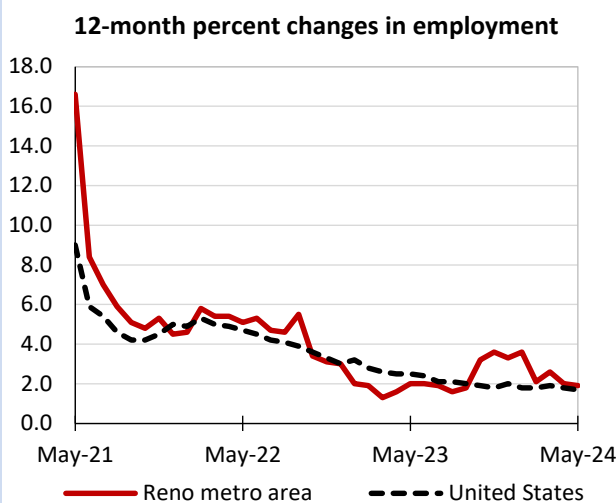
Reno metro area, fourth quarter 2023

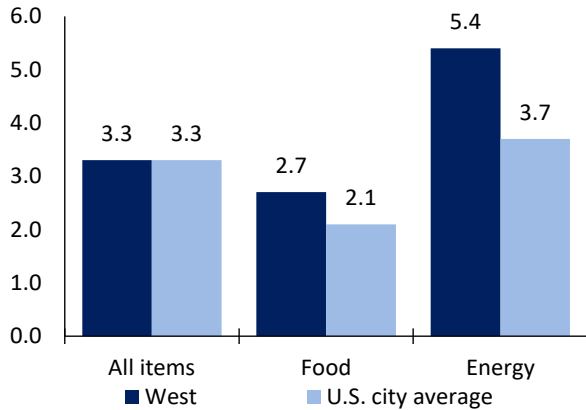

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

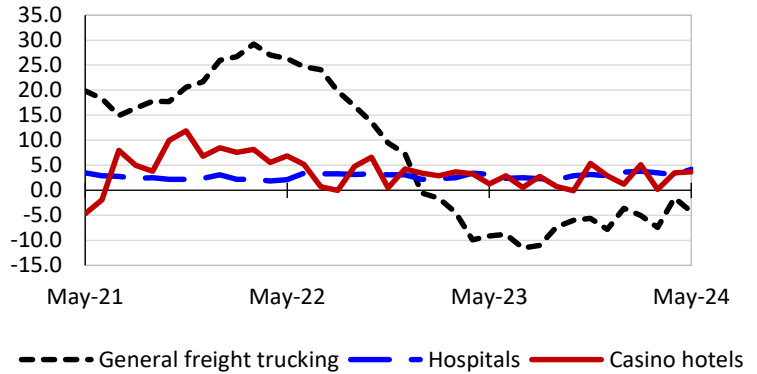
12-month percent change in CPI-U, May 2024

Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide

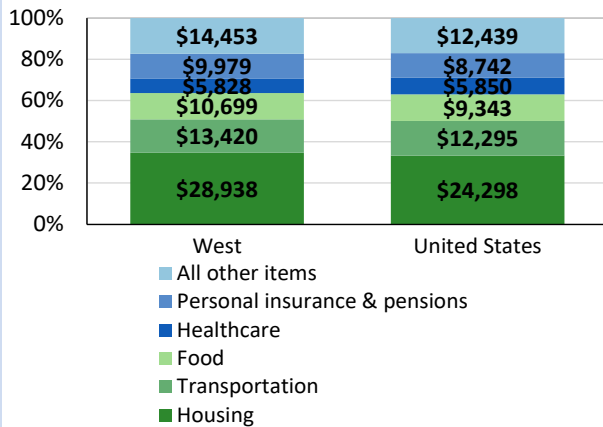
12-month percent changes in PPI

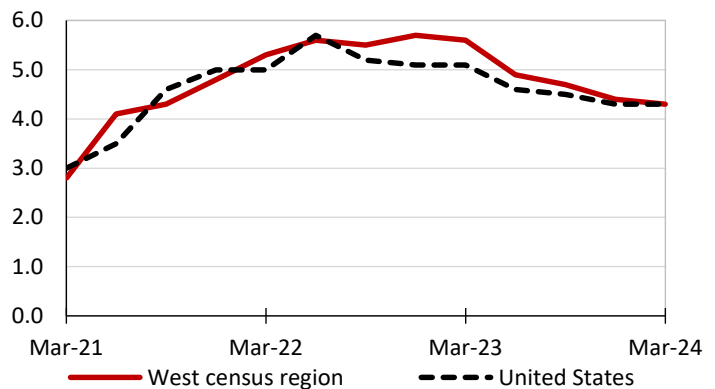
