
### Seattle Area Economic Summary

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector






Over-the-year change in the <u>prices paid by urban</u> consumers for selected categories

### 12-month percent change in CPI-U, April 2024




Average annual spending and percent distribution


