

Automation of CBP Form 6051D for Detentions of Cargo Filed in ACE, including UFLPA Detentions

Last updated: February 28, 2024



On **January 27, 2024**, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will deploy the *Automation of CBP Form 6051D for Detentions of Cargo Filed in ACE, including Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA) Detentions* in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE). This enhancement includes electronic data interchange (EDI) impacts.

What will change for trade users?

• Changes in ACE Forms

- When a CBP review results in a cargo detention, CBP will file an electronic CBP Form 6051D in ACE, including attachments.
- Importers will receive the detention notice (CBP Form 6051D) through email if they have an ACE Secure Data Portal (ACE Portal) account and have selected “Portal” as one of the options for Mode of Communication. Otherwise, a Form 6051D will be mailed to them.
 - To set the Mode of Communication in the ACE Portal, visit [ACE Training and Reference Guides](#) and review “Modernized ACE Portal – CBP Forms.”
- Importers will be able to view, search, and respond to detention notices using the ACE Forms application.
 - Importers can upload documentation and submit a response via ACE Forms. All uploaded documentation will be stored in the ACE Document Image System (DIS).
 - Documentation submitted via DIS should be named to easily identify the document.
 - Documentation that exceeds the file size limitation of DIS (10MB) may be sent directly to the port of detention and/or the assigned CBP Center of Excellence and Expertise (CEE).
- CBP will review and process the response from trade users through ACE Forms.
- Forms 6051D will be included in the Forms report (ES013) within ACE Reports.
- This change will affect all 6051D notices issued against ACE entries.

• EDI Changes

- When a CBP review results in a cargo detention, the filer will receive the following EDI notifications:
 - An ACE Cargo Release Status Notification (“SO”) message. For more information, review the [ACE Cargo Release Status Notification implementation guide](#).
 - An ACE Entry Summary Status Notification (“UC”) message. Note that the “UC-D” and “UC-C” message types will be sent even if CBP has not received Automated Broker Interface (ABI) Entry Summary (“AE”) data. - In addition, new ACE Cargo Release Error Codes will take effect for entries in a detained status. For more information, review the [ACE Cargo Release Error Codes guide](#).



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Accessing ACE Forms

- The ACE Forms application is launched using the “Forms” button on the Importer account view within the modernized ACE Portal.
