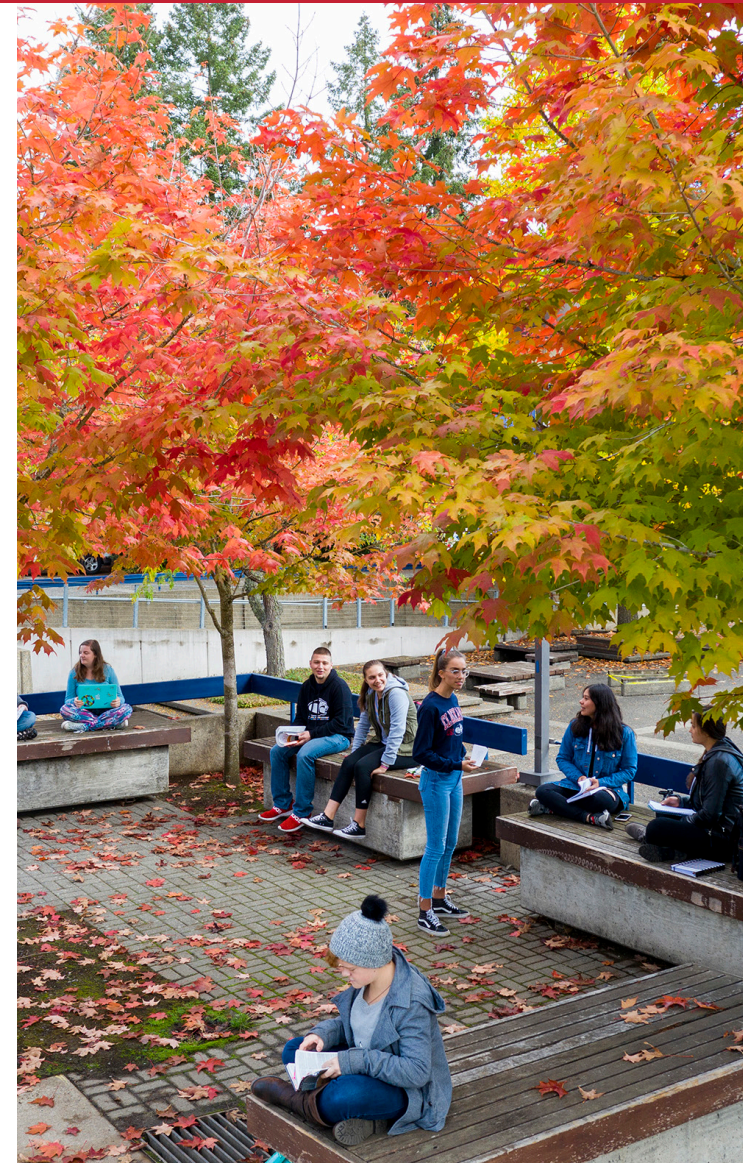

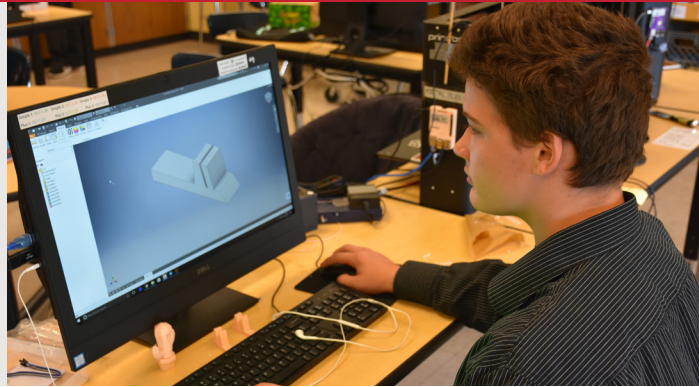

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Clackamas Community College (CCC) provides college credit programs specifically designed for high school students.



College credit that students register for in high school appears on students' CCC transcript.

High School Connections Programs

CCC offers four college credit programs for high school students.

Advanced College Credit (ACC)

ACC classes are college courses taken at the high school and taught by an approved high school instructor. High school instructors must meet qualifying college criteria. ACC classes are \$10 per credit, charged directly to the student.

Students receiving free/reduced lunch can have ACC fees waived and earn college credit for free. Students must ask their high school counselor to add them to the ACC fee waiver list that is submitted to CCC.



Career and Technical Education Pathways (CTEP)

CTE Pathways courses are exploratory courses held on the college campus and taught by college faculty. Students participate in hands-on courses paid for by the school district/high school.

Expanded Options

Expanded Options allows students to take classes at the college campus or online. Classes are paid for by the school district/high school.

High School Plus

High School Plus classes are college classes taught by college faculty at partner high schools or designated locations. Classes are paid for by the school district/high school.



Program Requirements:

- Students may only participate in the programs offered through their high school.
- Contracts with high schools and/or school districts are required.
- Expanded Options and CTE Pathways students must be referred by their school district/high school to participate.
