Request for Exemption from Social Security Number Requirement

Alaska Statutes 08.01.060(b) and 08.01.100(e) require an applicant for a professional license to provide a United States Social Security Number. A foreign citizen who is unable to obtain a United States Social Security Number may apply for exemption from the statutory requirement by completing this form and submitting it to the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing along with a copy of current proof of citizenship in a foreign nation, and if that proof is in a language other than English, a certified translation.
