Requested Action: Transfer of ownership

Statutory and Regulatory Authority: AS 04.06.090(b): “The board shall review all applications for licenses made under this title and may order the director to issue, renew, revoke, transfer, or suspend licenses and permits authorized under this title.”

- AS 04.11.400(d): “The board may approve
- (1) the issuance of a new beverage dispensary or restaurant or eating place license without regard to (a) of this section if it appears that the issuance will encourage the tourist trade by encouraging the construction or improvement of
 - (A) a hotel, motel, resort, or similar business relating to the tourist trade with a dining facility or having kitchen facilities in a majority of its rental rooms and at least a minimum number of rental rooms required according to the population of the incorporated city, unified municipality, or population area established under (a) of this section in which the facility will be located, as follows:
 - (i) 10 rental rooms if the population is less than 1,501;
 - (ii) 20 rental rooms if the population is 1,501 — 2,500;
 - (iii) 25 rental rooms if the population is 2,501 — 5,000;
 - (iv) 30 rental rooms if the population is 5,001 — 15,000;
 - (v) 35 rental rooms if the population is 15,001 — 25,000;
 - (vi) 40 rental rooms if the population is 25,001 — 50,000; and
 - (vii) 50 rental rooms if the population is greater than 50,000; or
 - (B) an airport terminal; and”
 - (2) the renewal or transfer of ownership of a beverage dispensary or restaurant or eating place license issued under (1) of this subsection if the
 - (A) holder of the license operates a hotel, motel, resort, or similar business relating to the tourist trade that
 - (i) has a dining facility on the licensed premises or kitchen facilities in a majority of its rental rooms; and

- (ii) maintains at least the minimum number of rental rooms that the hotel, motel, resort, or similar business had at the time of initial licensure or that were required at the time of initial licensure; or
- (B) licensed premises are located inside an airport terminal.

Staff Rec.: Evaluate the Tourism Statement for compliance with statutes and regulations.

Background: This is an application to transfer a Beverage Dispensary – Tourism Seasonal license to JL Denali Hotels LLC in the Denali Borough.

AS 04.11.400(d)(2)(A)(ii) requires that the facility must maintain at least the minimum number of rental rooms required at original licensure. Staff has determined that the license is compliant with the room number requirements.

The applicant offers 166 rental rooms without kitchen facilities. This establishment offers a dining facility on the resort premises.

- 1. Explain how the issuance of a liquor license at your establishment has/will encourage tourism.**

The Grande Denali Hotel is a 166 room, seasonally operated, full-service hotel. The hotel is located within a mile of the entry of Denali National Park, Alaska's premier tourism destination. Many visitors to Alaska, and certainly Denali, require both appropriate and desired hotel accommodations and amenities as part of their itineraries, to include food and beverage services, including the opportunity to purchase adult style beverages. The Grande Denali Hotel provides such services to approximately 35,000 guests per season.

- 2. Explain how the facility was/will be constructed or improved in accordance with this application.**

The Alpenglow Restaurant, at the Grande Denali Hotel, is a 180 fine dining restaurant facility that includes a 25-seat full-service lounge. As a very large percentage of our patrons at the Alpenglow are adults, on vacation, their ability to order adult style beverages to accompany their dining choices ensures a high level of service and satisfaction for their stay at the hotel.

- 3. Who operates the facility for which a liquor license is being applied?**

4. Jonathan Rubini, Leonard Hyde are affiliates of JL Denali Hotels, LLC and JL Denali Hotels, LLC operates the tourism facility in which the license is located. Leonard and Jonathan own other liquor licenses and businesses within Anchorage and other areas of Alaska including Fairbanks without any incidents. Leonard, Jonathan and staff are dedicated to serving alcohol in a responsible manner, while providing a fun and friendly environment to our out of state guests.

- 5. Do you offer room rentals to the traveling public? Yes.**

- 6. If so, how many of these rooms are available? Do any of the rental rooms have kitchen facilities (defined as: a separate sink for food preparation along with refrigeration and cooking appliance devices, including a microwave)? If yes,**

how many of the rental rooms have kitchen facilities that meet this definition? Do you stock alcoholic beverages in guest rooms?

The Grande Denali Hotel includes 166 overnight guest accommodations, 160 guest rooms, and 6 private cabins, none with kitchen facilities. The hotel does not stock alcoholic beverages in guest rooms or in the cabins. The hotel is not located within an airport terminal.

7. Does your establishment include a dining facility?

Yes, The Alpenglow Restaurant offers a full-service food menu in a comfortable setting.

8. Are additional amenities available to your guests through your establishment (eg: guided tours or trips, rental equipment for guests, other activities that attract tourists)?

Yes, The Grande Denali Hotel offers assistance to guests who are interested in participating in local tours, trips and activities that attract tourists. Such help extends to providing information, promotional materials, and booking options and other assistance, through our agreements with a large number of attraction/activity vendors in the Denali area.

In short, all of those things, which are routinely done by businesses in Alaska to encourage tourism, will continue to be done by the operators of the facility.

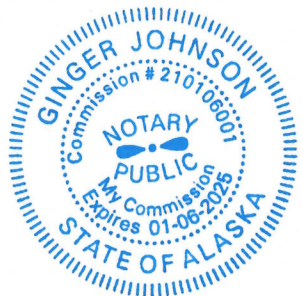

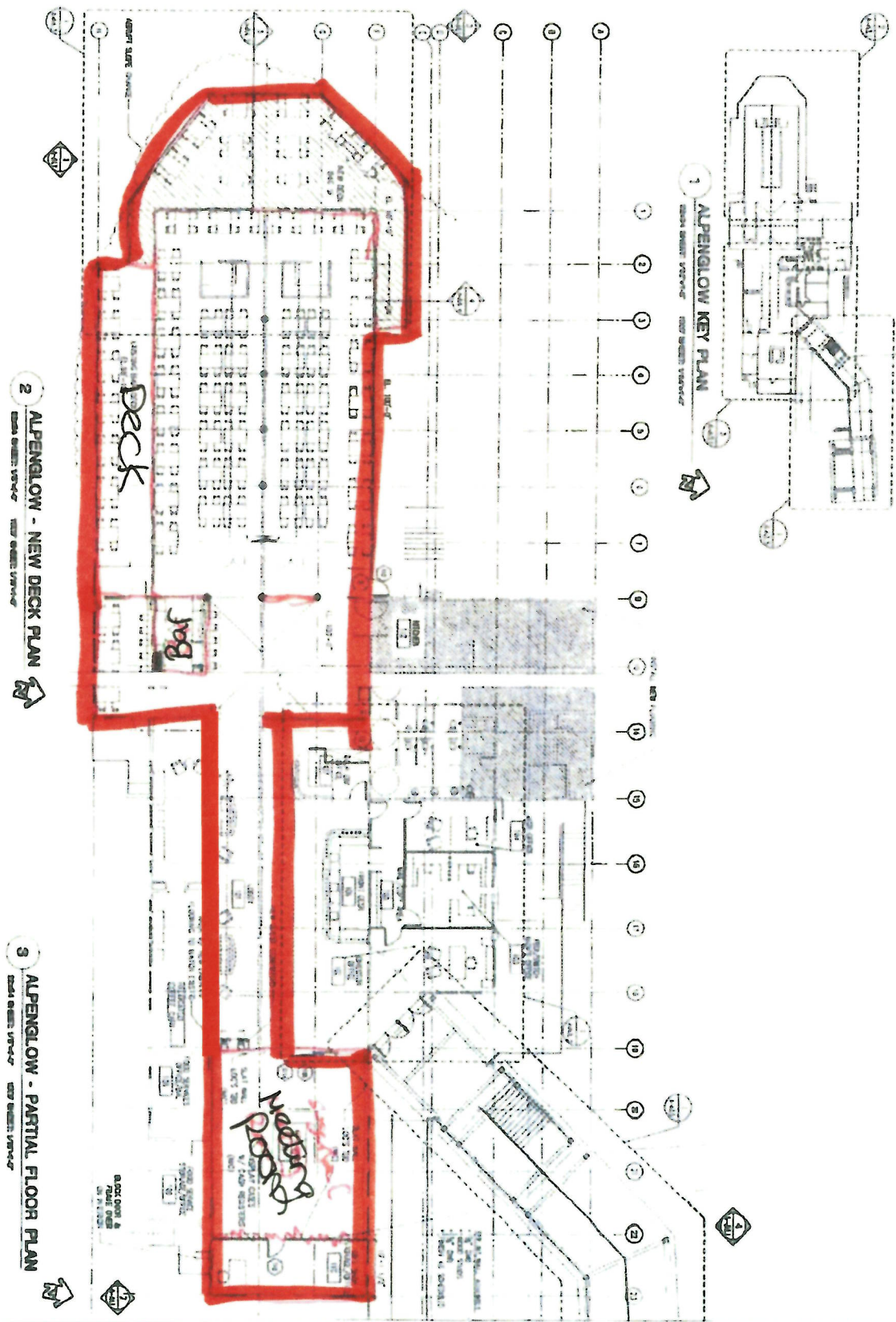

JL Denali Hotels, LLC d b a Grande Denali Hotel – Alpenglow Restaurant is located at Mile 238.4 Parks Hwy., Denali, Alaska 99755. The barriers around the deck are 60" tall around the outside of the area.

Alcohol will only be served in the designated areas to include the Alpenglow Restaurant as well as the Restaurant Bar deck. The Server (whom is TAPs trained) will be responsible to follow all State and Federal laws as well as the policies set forth in their TAPs training.

There will be a manager on site at all times, and when the outdoor serving area is open (weather and staffing dependent), there will be hotel event staff walking between the indoor area, and outdoor area to monitor alcohol consumption. When the indoor seating area is open and the outdoor seating area is closed, doors to the outdoor seating area will be closed and used only for emergency egress. Hotel event staff in the indoor seating area will monitor, to ensure patrons do not attempt to use the outside area when it is closed.

Access/Service: There will be no alcohol sales or delivery outside the building walls except on the deck area which is a closed off area. Dining guests must walk in and out the same door, which controls the transfer of alcohol. An owner or manager is always on site and monitors the consumption of alcohol.

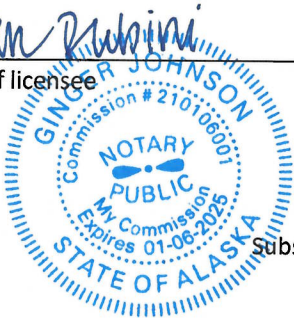
