NOTICE OF VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL

Petitioner, CEC TIMBER TRACE, LLC ("CEC"), hereby files this Notice and in support thereof provides as follows:

- 1. On August 3, 2007, CEC filed with the Florida Housing Finance Corporation ("Florida Housing") its Petition for Waiver or Variance from Rules 67-21.006(2), 67-48.002(96), 67-48.004(1)(2)(9) and Universal Application Part III.A. ("Petition").
- 2. In essence, the Petition requested a waiver or variance from Florida

 Housing's interpretation of the 5-unit per building rule as more specifically described in the Petition.
- 3. Also on August 3, 2007, CEC filed a corresponding Petition for Review which challenged Florida Housing's decision to reject CEC's 2007 Universal Cycle application because of the alleged failure to comply with the same 5-unit per building rule.

- 4. On August 22, 2007, an informal hearing was conducted and on September 5, 2007, the assigned Hearing Officer entered a Recommended Order which found that CEC had indeed met the 5-unit per building rule and had accordingly met the threshold requirements of the Universal Application.
- 5. The Recommended Order will be considered by the Florida Housing Board of Directors on September 21, 2007, and to the extent that it is accepted by the Board, further consideration of the Petition requesting a variance or waiver will not be necessary.
- 6. To the extent that the Board accepts the findings of fact and conclusions of law in the Recommended Order, CEC will withdraw its Petition for Waiver. In the event that the Board does not accept the Recommended Order, CEC reserves the right to have the Petition for Variance considered by the Board.
