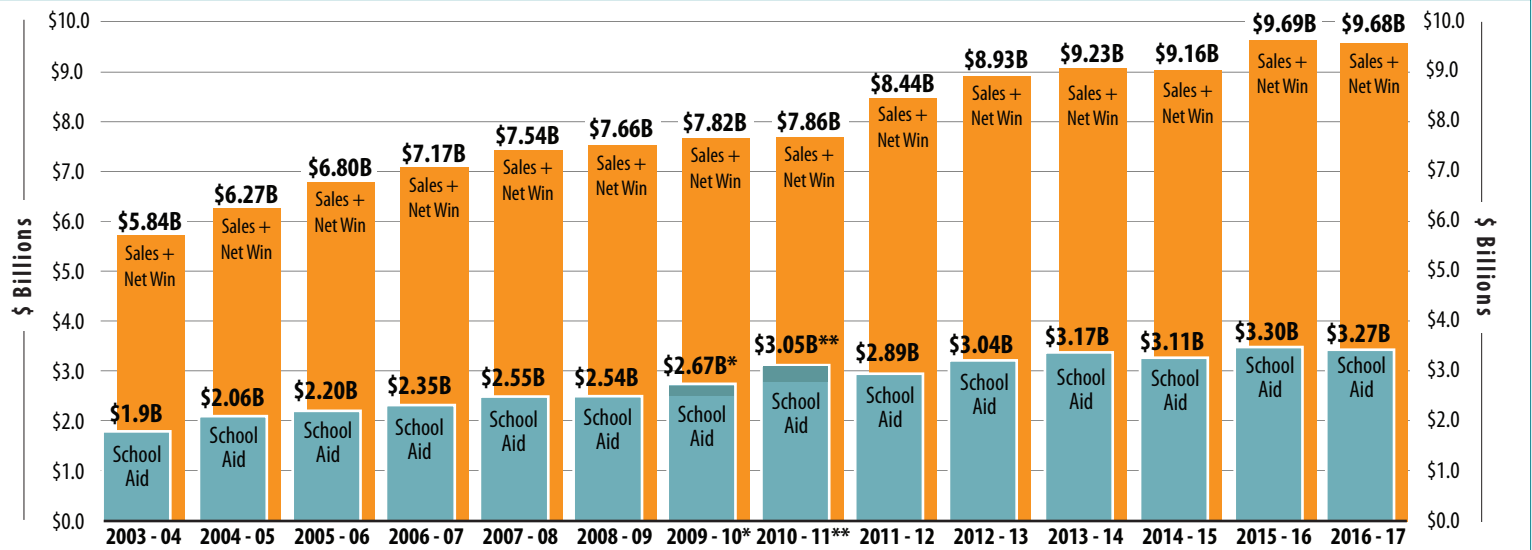

Now celebrating its 50th year of service in support of New York's K-12 public schools, the New York State Gaming Commission's Lottery Division is proud to provide this year-end overview of its Traditional and Video Lottery business operations.

New York's Lottery once-again has set an industry gold-standard for its contributions to education, which for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2017, totaled \$3.27 Billion. Combined sales and net win for the same time period totaled \$9.68 Billion.

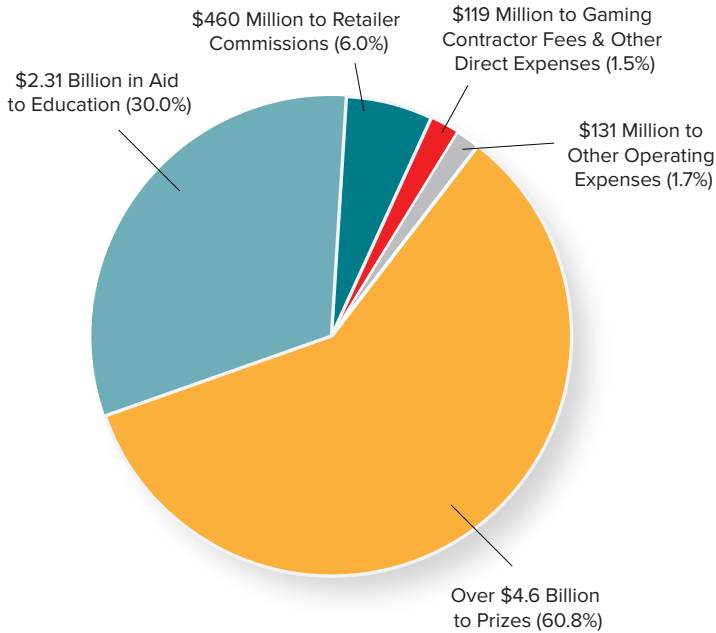

Traditional Lottery (FY 2016-2017)

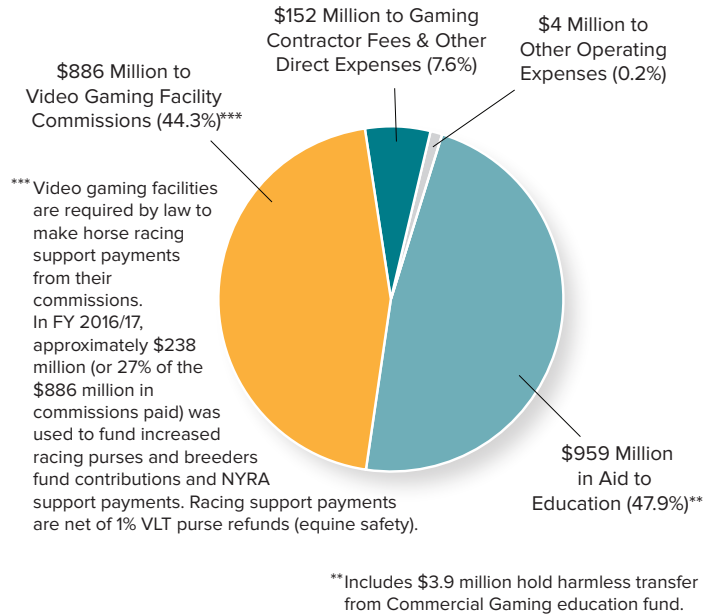

Video Gaming (FY 2016-2017)

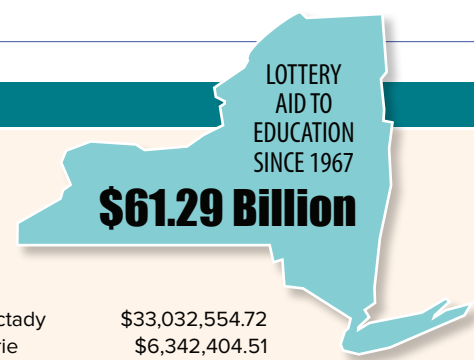

The above amounts are based on the New York State Education Department's Division of Aid to Localities for Education from the State Lottery Fund as required by law. For a complete listing visit nylottery.ny.gov.

Lottery revenue is distributed to local school districts by the same statutory formula used to distribute other state aid to education. It takes into account both a school district's size and its income level; larger, lower-income school districts receive proportionately larger shares of Lottery school funding.
