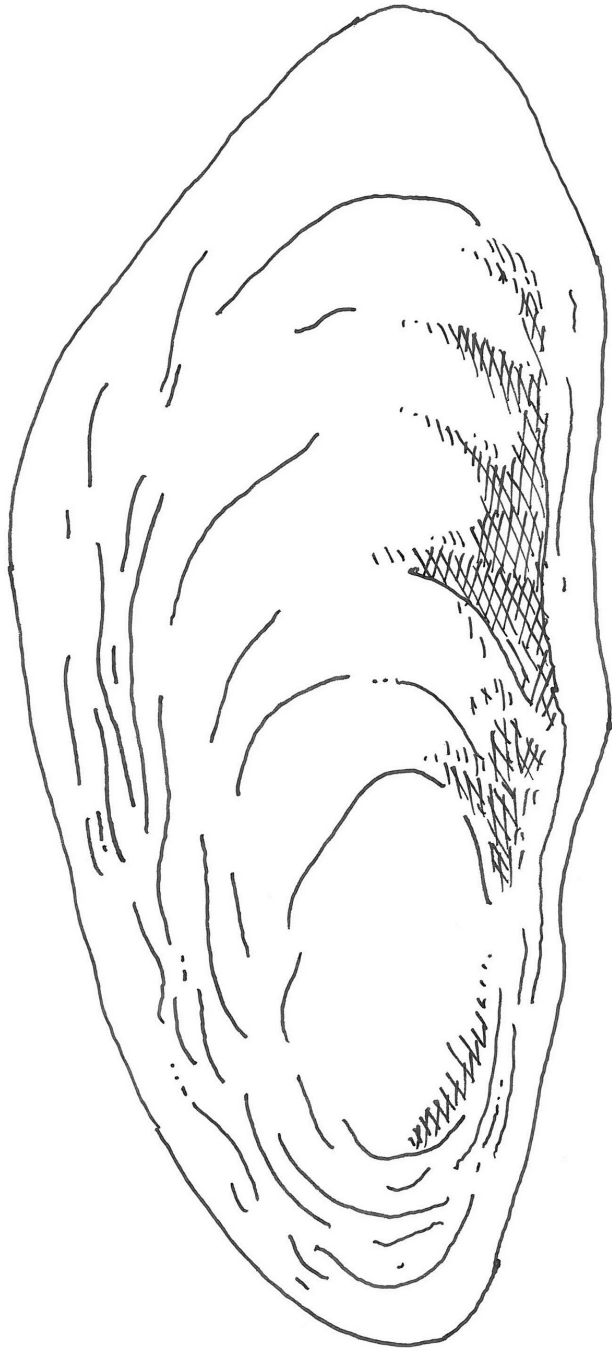
What images can you find?





Compass: In order for sailors to know where they were going, they had to understand direction. This compass has letters for north, south, east, and west, but some would only have a symbol to show north. Sailors spoke many different languages, and symbols could be understood no matter the language or literacy. Once a sailor knew where north was, they could easily figure out the rest.

OYSTERS



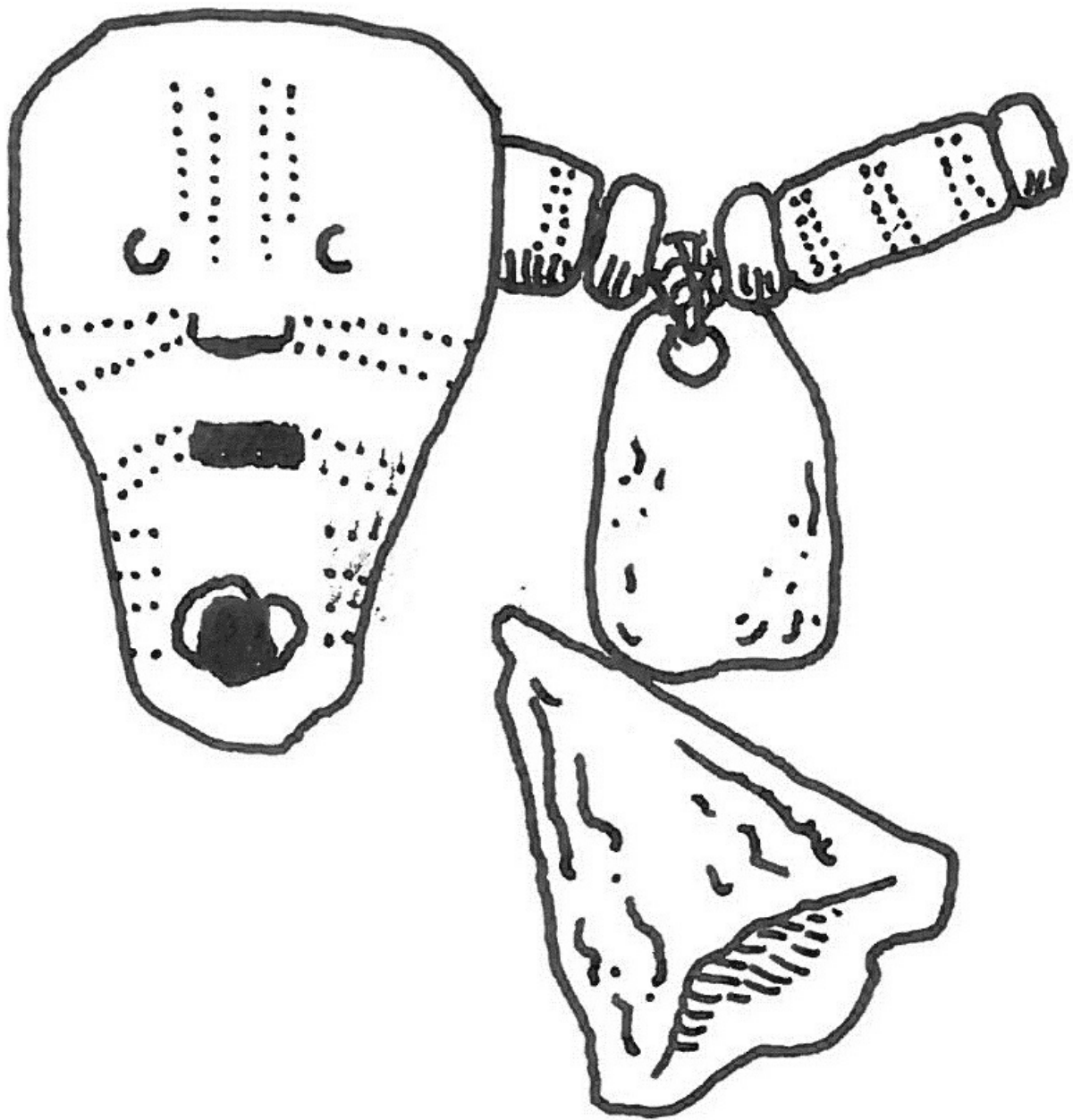

What would you think if you were looking at this land for the first time?

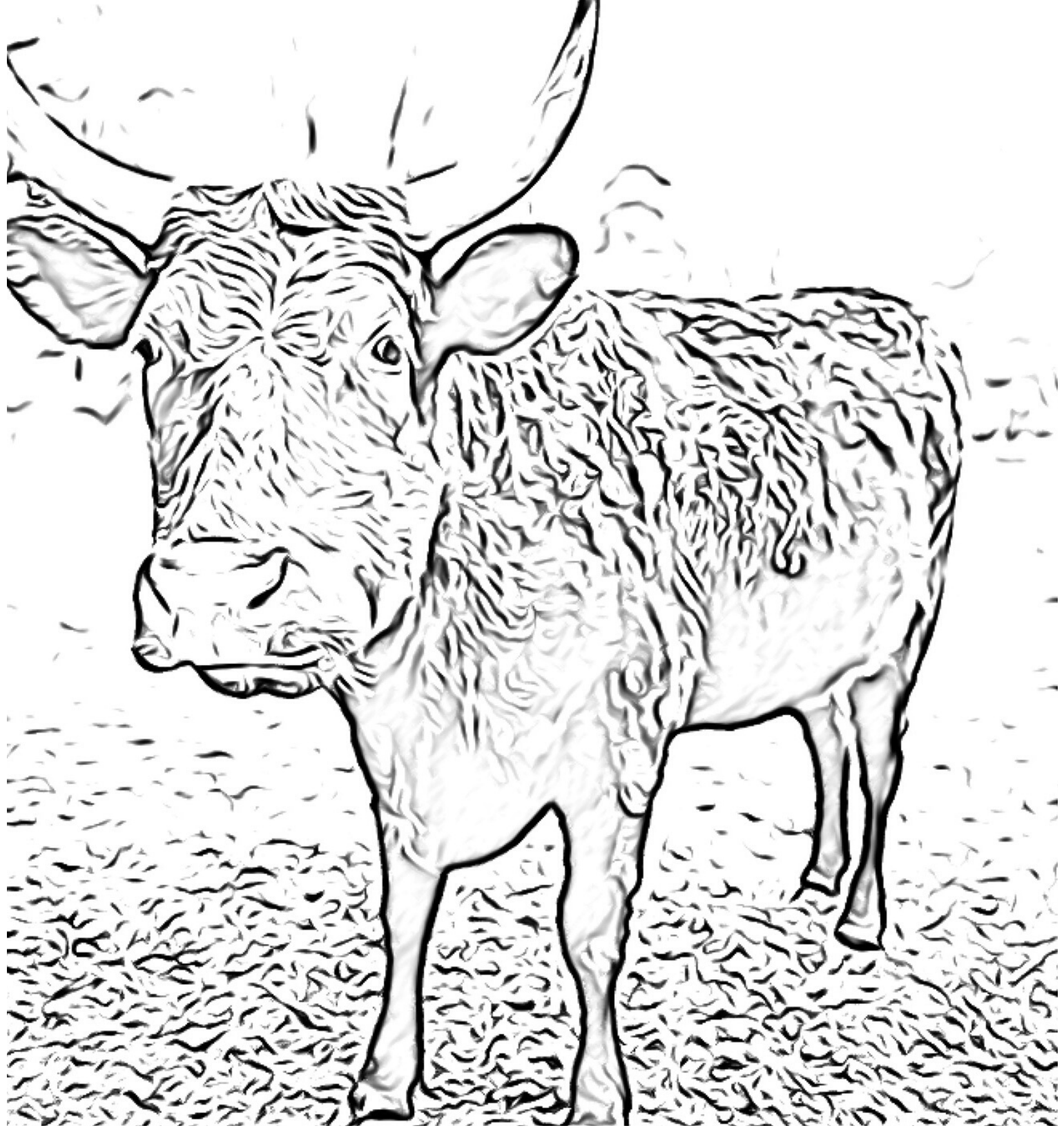
What would be the first thing that you would do or look for?
