1 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: By the power vested
2 in me by the State of Illinois and the Illinois
3 Commerce Commission, I now call for a status
4 hearing -- in fact, I won't call this a status
5 hearing, it's just a hearing in Docket No. 74 RTV-R
6 Sub 15. This is Rendered Services, Inc., and this is
7 the rehearing on fitness to Hold a Commercial Vehicle
8 Relocator's License pursuant to 401 of the Illinois
9 Commercial Relocation of Trespassing Vehicles Law.

10 And at today's hearing, I am presented
11 with -- or actually, at the last status hearing, I
12 was presented with a settlement agreement and release
13 and a consent order and civil penalty agreement.
14 Both agreements have been executed by the parties,
15 Staff and Rendered Services.

16 The settlement agreement and release
17 requires my signature and approval, which I am
18 granting today, and the consent order and civil
19 penalty agreement has been executed by the parties
20 and does not require my signature.

21 The next step is to mark this record
22 heard and taken and present an order to the

1 Commission for their approval of these matters, these
2 agreements that have been presented to me. And my
3 goal will be to present that to the Commission on
4 December -- on their December 29th Bench Session.
5 That is the act- -- let me just double check the
6 date. No, it's not the 29th. It's the -- I know
7 there's another one. The last bench session in
8 December.

9 MR. ROTHCHILD: Right. There's two of them, I
10 believe.

11 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: There's December 4th
12 and then there's another one. It can't be the 29th.

13 MR. BURZAWA: I think it might be the 19th.

14 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: The 19th? Okay.

15 On the final bench session of the year
16 for the Commission, I'll present it to them to do
17 what they wish to do with the agreements. And I
18 believe that's it.

19 Is there anything anyone would like to
20 say?

21 MR. ROTHCHILD: Yes, your Honor. Donald
22 Rothchild for Rendered.

1 I would just make the observation that
2 in Rendered's view this is a settlement agreement
3 that has been negotiated between Rendered and the
4 staff of the Illinois Commerce Commission. According
5 to the documents that you have been presented with,
6 it does not become an order of the Commission until
7 the Commission agrees to it if it chooses to do so,
8 and therefore it still remains as a -- in the
9 negotiation stage. And once the Commission enters it
10 as its order, it becomes public record under Section
11 2.20 of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act.

12 The settlement agreement that
13 addresses the ad sites and related matters is also
14 contingent upon the Commission entering the consent
15 order and agreement.

16 So the whole matter is subject to
17 Commission approval. If the Commission approves the
18 matter, it goes forward. If the Commission declines
19 to approve it, the case is still pending. That's our
20 view of the world regarding the sensitive issue of
21 public information.

22 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Your thoughts,

1 Mr. Burzawa?

2 MR. BURZAWA: That's also Staff's position,
3 Judge.

4 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. So we won't
5 act on these dispositions until after the
6 Commission's vote on the consent order.

7 MR. ROTHCHILD: Correct.

8 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. And this date,
9 did you want to leave that for the Commission's
10 agenda, or on the -- there's a blank space on page 1
11 of the consent order.

12 MR. ROTHCHILD: There is. I'll defer to Martin
13 on that.

14 MR. BURZAWA: Yeah. I think it would be
15 appropriate to have that dated by the Commission
16 because they're -- the Commission is the one that
17 will be entering that consent order.

18 MR. ROTHCHILD: As its order, yes.

19 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. So -- all
20 right.

21 Is there anything else you'd like to
22 present?

1 MR. BURZAWA: No.

2 MR. ROTHCHILD: No. Thank you for bearing with
3 us on this, and hopefully the matter is concluded, or
4 the Commission will agree that the settlement is fair
5 to both sides and moves this off its docket.

6 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. We'll see.

7 All right. I think that's it. I'll
8 mark the record heard and taken, and we will take it
9 to the next level.
