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## Instructions For Payee:

The amount listed in Box 1 is the amount of interest that qualifies for the partial exclusion of dividends and interest. You are allowed an exclusion of \$200 (\$400 in the case of a joint return) of the total of the amounts received during the tax year as qualifying domestic dividends or interest.

Report the total of boxes 1 and 2 on the Interest Income line of your income tax return. Use the amount in box 1, together with qualifying dividend income, to arrive at the proper amount of the exclusion for the year. See the instructions for your income tax return for more information on how to report the income and take the exclusion.

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
