COMPLAINT AND DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

Plaintiff, Jose A. Ortega ("Ortega"), by the undersigned attorneys, makes the following averments:

This civil action is brought pursuant to the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994, 38 U.S.C. §§ 4301-4333 ("USERRA").

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 4323(b).
- Venue is proper in this district under 38 U.S.C. § 4323(c)(2) because Defendant Synapse Data and Telecom, Inc. ("Synapse") operated as a business in Ogden, Utah, within this judicial district, and Defendant Matthew Mossbarger ("Mossbarger") resides within this judicial

district. Additionally, venue is proper under 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b) because the events giving rise to this lawsuit occurred in this judicial district.

<u>PARTIES</u>

- 4. Ortega resides at 367 West 1225 North, Layton, Utah, within the jurisdiction of this Court.
- 5. Synapse was organized and incorporated in Utah. Synapse was voluntarily dissolved on or about January 12, 2009. The capacity to be sued for a corporation is determined by the law under which it was organized. Fed. R. Civ. P. 17(b). Under Utah law, a corporation may be sued after dissolution. Utah Code § 16-10a-1405(2)(e). Synapse operated within the jurisdiction of this Court and at all relevant times was an employer within the meaning of 38 U.S.C. § 4303(4).
- 6. Mossbarger, Synapse's former owner and operator, resides at 1378 Marilyn Drive, Ogden, Utah, within the jurisdiction of this Court, and is an employer within the meaning of 38 U.S.C. § 4303(4).

CLAIM FOR RELIEF: DISCRIMINATION

- 7. In or about August 2007, Ortega was hired by Mossbarger to work as a Network Administrator for Synapse in Ogden, Utah.
- 8. On or about April 1, 2008, Ortega enlisted in the Utah National Guard and was given orders to report for basic training in Kentucky on May 20, 2008.
- 9. On or about April 3, 2008, Ortega informed Mossbarger of his military enlistment and attempted to provide Mossbarger with a copy of his orders to report for basic training on

May 20, 2008. Mossbarger attempted to convince Ortega to rescind his military obligation, offering him benefits, a raise, and management opportunities.

- On or about April 4, 2008, Mossbarger terminated Ortega when Ortega declined to 10. withdraw from the Utah National Guard.
- On or about April 10, 2008, Ortega filed a complaint against Synapse under USERRA with the Veterans Employment and Training Service ("VETS") of the United States Department of Labor.
- Synapse and Mossbarger violated Section 4311 of USERRA by terminating 12. Ortega's employment because of his membership in and/or obligation to perform service in the uniformed services.
- 13. As a result of Synapse and Mossbarger's unlawful discrimination, Ortega has suffered a loss of earnings and other benefits of employment.
 - 14. All conditions precedent have occurred or have been performed.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Ortega prays that this Court enter judgment against Synapse and Mossbarger and all persons in active concert or participation with them, as follows:

- 15. Declare that Synapse and Mossbarger's discrimination against Ortega was unlawful and in violation of USERRA;
- 16. Order that Synapse and Mossbarger fully comply with the provisions of USERRA by paying Ortega for his loss of earnings and other benefits suffered by reason of Synapse and Mossbarger's failure or refusal to comply with provisions of USERRA;

- 17. Enjoin Synapse and Mossbarger from taking any action against Ortega that fails to comply with the provisions of USERRA;
- 18. Award Ortega prejudgment interest on the amount of lost compensation found due; and
 - 19. Grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

JURY TRIAL DEMAND

Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 38, Ortega demands a trial by jury.
