1. This is a civil action brought pursuant to the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994, 38 U.S.C. §§ 4301 - 4333 ("USERRA").

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 2. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 4323(b).
- 3. Venue is proper in this district under 38 U.S.C. § 4323(c)(2) and 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b). Defendant, Milne Enterprises, d/b/a Milne, Nail, Power Tool & Repair ("Milne"), is a company that maintains a place of business in this judicial district. Additionally, a substantial part of the events giving rise to the claim occurred in this district.

CLAIM FOR RELIEF

- 4. In April 2002, Robinson was hired by Milne as a floor clerk at its Pasco, Washington store. Robinson was promoted several times and ultimately obtained the position of assistant manager, which he held until he left Milne's employment.
- 5. In November 2006, Robinson enlisted in the Army National Guard, and promptly notified Milne that he would be leaving employment with Milne in March 2007 for active duty training. Robinson received a raise from Milne a few weeks before he left for active duty.
- 6. Robinson was on active duty with the Army National Guard from March 27, 2007 until his honorable discharge on October 2, 2007.

7. Robinson timely requested reemployment with Milne by letter on October 10, 2007. Milne did not promptly re-employ Robinson. Instead, Milne attempted to avoid its reemployment obligation by pursuing criminal charges against Robinson for an alleged theft that had occurred six months earlier while Robinson

was on military leave. Robinson was not involved in the alleged theft, and charges were never brought against Robinson by any law enforcement agency.

- 8. On November 28, 2007, over six weeks after Robinson initially requested reemployment, Milne offered Robinson a position at its Milton-Freewater, Oregon store. Robinson would have had to commute over 100 miles each day in order to accept the position, and Milne knew that Robinson did not possess a car. On the same day Milne offered Robinson the position at its Oregon store, Milne informed Robinson that "felony charges" had been filed against him. Accordingly, this so-called offer was not made in good faith; and Robinson declined this offer.
- 9. On November 29, 2007, Robinson filed a complaint with the Department of Labor ("DOL") alleging that Milne had violated his rights under USERRA. The DOL's Veterans Employment and Training Service ("VETS") conducted an investigation, and determined that Robinson's claim had merit.
- 10. After exercising his USERRA rights, Milne retaliated against Robinson by (i) actively pursuing criminal charges against Robinson for an alleged theft that had occurred over six months earlier and while Robinson was on COMPLAINT FOR VIOLATION OF USERRA AND JURY TRIAL DEMAND Page 3

Military duty; (ii) threatening to report Robinson to the IRS for an alleged failure to pay taxes on what it claimed to be gifts given by Milne to Robinson one to two years prior; and (iii) demanding payment on old store accounts which had been closed for approximately one year, including back sales taxes not previously charged, and threatening additional monetary charges if payment was not promptly received.

- 11. Milne violated Sections 4312 and 4313 of USERRA by, among other ways, failing to promptly re-employ Robinson upon his return from military duty in either the position he would have held had his employment not been interrupted by his military service, or in a position of like seniority, status and pay.
- 12. Milne also violated Section 4311 of USERRA by retaliating against Robinson for exercising his rights under USERRA.
 - 13. Milne's actions were willful under 38 U.S.C. § 4323(d)(1)(C).
- 14. Because of Milne's conduct, Robinson has suffered monetary damages in an amount to be proven at trial.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Robinson prays that the Court enter judgment against Milne as follows:

- A. Declare that Milne's failure to promptly and properly re-employ

 Robinson following his military duty was unlawful and in violation of USERRA;
- B. Declare that Milne violated USERRA by retaliating against Robinson because of his exercise of his reemployment rights;

- C. Enjoin Milne from further retaliation against Robinson in violation of USERRA;
- D. Order Milne to fully comply with the provisions of USERRA, and pay Robinson for lost earnings, with interest, and benefits suffered by reason of Milne's failure or refusal to comply with USERRA;
 - E. Order Milne to pay Robinson liquidated damages;
- F. Order Milne to fully comply with the provisions of USERRA and offer to re-employ Robinson in Milne's Pasco, Washington store and place Robinson at the appropriate seniority, status and compensation that he would have attained had he remained employed continuously with Milne until the present, including during the time of his military duty;
- G. Enjoin Milne from failing to comply in the future with all provisions of USERRA; and
- H. Grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper together with the costs and disbursements of this lawsuit.

JURY DEMAND

Robert Brian Robinson hereby demands a trial by jury of all issues so triable.
