

Important Upcoming Dates


- April 1, 2020. Census Day 2020
- December 31, 2020. Congressional reapportionment announced
- January, 2021. New legislature convenes. Lawsuit challenging existing districts likely.
- Mid-Late March, 2021. All census data arrives. Map drawing begins.
- February 15, 2022. Deadline for enactment of new district plans
- August 9, 2022. State Primary Election

Policy Choices in Redistricting

- What principles should apply to districts?
 - Federal: population equality; must not intentionally or inadvertently discriminate on the basis of race
 - State: single member districts; convenient contiguous territory; nesting; numbered in regular series
 - Others?
- What will the legislative process look like?
 - Commission?
 - Bipartisanship requirements?
 - Additional public engagement?




